In Sunday's Gospel, Jesus' disciples ask him to increase their faith. Jesus uses the example of a mustard seed to tell them that even a little bit of faith is powerful. Faith in Jesus gives the power to perform miracles and to recognize the miracles that we witness. In Jesus' time, masters were masters and slaves were slaves. Masters didn't sit down to eat with slaves or reward them for doing their jobs. Jesus used this reality to make a point. His parable is critical of disciples who want to become masters of their fate or to lord it over others. Service is the ordinary duty of all of Jesus' followers.

40 HOURS WITH THE LORD Forty Hours Devotion is a special period of continuous prayer made before the Blessed Sacrament in solemn exposition. Forty Hours Devotion begins with a Solemn Mass of Exposition, and concludes with the exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. The Blessed Sacrament remains on the altar in a monstrance. During the next 40 hours, the faithful gather for personal or public prayer in adoration of our Lord. The Blessed Sacrament is reposed in the tabernacle for daily Mass, and then returned for exposition after Mass. At the end of the devotions, the Mass of Reposition is offered,. Forty Hours Devotion provides a wonderful opportunity for the spiritual growth of each person and the parish as a whole. In a world where temptation and evil abound, where devotion to the Mass and our Lord in the Holy Eucharist have declined, where the practice of penance and confession have been forgotten, we need the Forty Hours Devotion more than ever.
