

#### STEWARDSHIP DISCIPLESHIP

"And a voice came from the heavens, 'You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased.'" - -Mark 1:11

Through our baptism, **Stewards** are daughters and sons of God. We are disciples of Jesus. As true disciples we are called to actively participate in our Catholic faith, not just be mere bystanders. This means working in collaboration with Holy Spirit and discerning how we are being asked to use our gifts. Using our gifts for the benefit of others and not just for our own interests and comfort.



#### **Holiness**

A central theme to the Second Vatican Council was the universal call to holiness. In the document, The Dogmatic Constitution on the Church, in Latin, Lumen Gentium, we read this about the Universal Call to Holiness: "...all the faithful of Christ of whatever rank or status, are called to the fullness of the Christian life and to the perfection of charity; ...They must follow in His footsteps and conform themselves to His image seeking the will of the Father in all things. They must devote themselves with all their being to the glory of God and the service of their neighbor."

But the call to holiness, individual and personal holiness, isn't something new; it has been called for throughout the history of the Church. Many of the most profound spiritual writers of the church, such as St. Teresa of Avila, St. John of the Cross, and St. Teresa of Lisieux, have taught that the spiritual life associated with prayer and holiness is something that we are all called to—adults, children, and teen-agers alike—and not something reserved only for cloistered monks and nuns. Reflecting on this the Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "All Christians in any state or walk of life are called to the fullness of Christian life and to the perfection of charity . . . All are called to holiness . . . ." (No. 2013).

The root of all this is the mandate of Jesus that comes at the end of the Sermon on the Mount, the Lord's principal guide to holiness that he gives to us. Jesus says: "So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect." (Matthew 5:48). We are to imitate the Father's perfection and holiness.

Only God is holy and we are holy only to the extent God lives in our souls. God is holy, because in himself he possesses the fullness of perfection of love. God enjoys the perfection of love by his very nature; we possess it only by sanctifying grace, which is the life of God within us, received at Baptism. Holiness is living the life of grace that God has given us. The grace, God's actual divine life within us, is what enables us to authentically love firstly God, then others.

It is through one's personal and individual holiness, sometimes call sanctity, that we attain the gift of eternal life. In fact, it is the only way. But holiness isn't automatic. We need to want it and to work at it. God's life within us needs to be activated and used, we are not spectators in our salvation; we are participants. Living the life of grace through prayer, practicing our faith, and following the commandments is how we keep the flame of faith and holiness alive in our hearts. It is through mortal or serious sin that we turn from God and extinguish his life within us. God can and will always restore us to life if we come before him humbly with a sincere desire to repent and do better.

The beautiful thing about holiness is that there really isn't any ceiling. We can always become holier. God is able to enlarge our souls to allow us to share in a greater way in his divine life. It is really for this reason we have been created; to live eternally with God sharing his divine life. We can and do begin that life here on earth. The holier we are in this life the closer we are to heaven. So let us choose holiness, let us want more of God's life in us, let us live the life that Jesus calls us to live.... "Be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect" so that we can enjoy the eternal life for which God has created us.

#### JANUARY 10 — BAPTISM OF THE LORD

#### Reading I: Isaiah 55:1-11

Thus says the LORD: All you who are thirsty, come to the water! You who have no money, come, receive grain and eat; come, without paying and without cost, drink wine and milk! Why spend your money for what is not bread, your wages for what fails to satisfy? Heed me, and you shall eat well, you shall delight in rich fare. Come to me heedfully, listen, that you may have life. I will renew with you the everlasting covenant, the benefits assured to David. As I made him a witness to the peoples, a leader and commander of nations, so shall you summon a nation you knew not, and nations that knew you not shall run to you, because of the LORD, your God, the Holy One of Israel, who has glorified you. Seek the LORD while he may be found, call him while he is near. Let the scoundrel forsake his way, and the wicked man his thoughts; let him turn to the LORD for mercy; to our God, who is generous in forgiving. For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the LORD. As high as the heavens are above the earth so high are my ways above your ways and my thoughts above your thoughts. For just as from the heavens the rain and snow come down and do not return there till they have watered the earth, making it fertile and fruitful, giving seed to the one who sows and bread to the one who eats, so shall my word be that goes forth from my mouth; my word shall not return to me void, but shall do my will, achieving the end for which I sent it.

#### Reading II: I John 5: 1-9

Beloved: Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ is begotten by God, and everyone who loves the Father loves also the one begotten by him. In this way we know that we love the children of God when we love God and obey his commandments. For the love of God is this, that we keep his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome, for whoever is begotten by God conquers the world. And the victory that conquers the world is our faith. Who indeed is the victor over the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God? This is the one who came through water and blood, Jesus Christ, not by water alone, but by water and blood. The Spirit is the one who testifies, and the Spirit is truth. So there are three that testify, the Spirit, the water, and the blood, and the three are of one accord. If we accept human testimony, the testimony of God is surely greater. Now the testimony of God is this, that he has testified on behalf of his Son.

#### The Gospel: Mark 1:7-11

This is what John the Baptist proclaimed: "One mightier than I is coming after me. I am not worthy to stoop and loosen the thongs of his sandals. I have baptized you with water; he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." It happened in those days that Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized in the Jordan by John. On coming up out of the water he saw the heavens being torn open and the Spirit, like a dove, descending upon him. And a voice came from the heavens, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."

#### READINGS FOR THE WEEK

#### Reading I: Isaiah 55: 1-11

God speaks as He would to a heavenly court, and promises that He will give His Spirit to the coming Messiah. We also learn about the power of God's Word, which never goes unfulfilled. The Messiah will be "a light to all nations."

#### Reading II: I John 5: 1-9

This letter of John joins obedience to love. It is incumbent on us to believe that Jesus is the Son of the Father, and that His death for sin brings us eternal life.

#### The Gospel: Mark 1: 7-11

John the Baptist again exhibits his humility before Jesus, as he declares himself unworthy to do what was normally a slave's task: loosening Jesus' sandal straps. "Wind and fire" describe the coming of the kingdom and precede the proclamation of Our Lord's true identity.



#### PB&I CLUB REPORT FOR 2020



Parishioners, both youth and adults, have been making PB&J sandwiches for Joseph's HOUSE in Camden. As you know, Joseph's House offers shelter and services for the homeless. For four years now, we have been working at this ministry, a legacy from Father Bob!

Despite the COVID, we were able to do a marvelous job this year. We had to stop the first Wednesday of the month sandwich gathering due to COVID. But, in replacement we assembled 33 families who contributed on a weekly or monthly basis.

Note the results of the four years:

2017 4374 sandwiches

2018 8240 sandwiches

2019 6728 sandwiches

2020 5701 sandwiches
