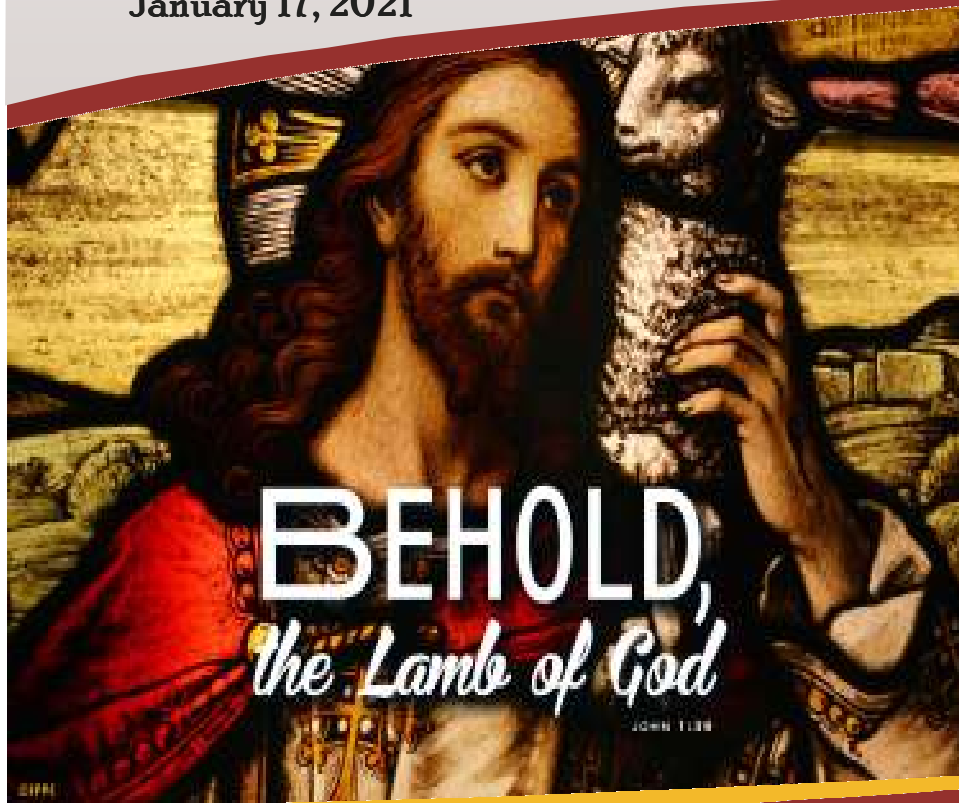

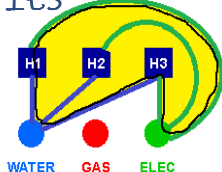
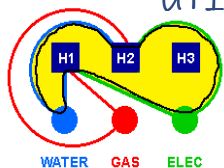

“Ordinary Time”

This Sunday the priests are back to wearing green vestments at Mass. Actually, we started wearing green this past Monday. We have once again entered what is called “Ordinary Time” in English. But it comes from the Latin *Tempus Per Annum* which literally means “time throughout the year”. Ordinary Time occurs outside of other liturgical time periods, periods in which specific aspects of the mystery of Christ are celebrated. According to *The General Norms for the Liturgical Year and the Calendar*, which is the handbook of liturgical laws that we follow during the church year, the days of Ordinary Time, especially the Sundays, “are devoted to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects.”

Ordinary Time encompasses that part of the Christian year that does not fall within the seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, or Easter. The Catholic Church celebrates two periods of the year as Ordinary Time. The first period begins after the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. This first period of Ordinary Time begins on the Monday after the Baptism of the Lord. That’s why today is the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, without there being a first Sunday in Ordinary Time (as I mentioned above, Ordinary Time started last Monday). This first period of Ordinary Time runs until the Tuesday evening before Ash Wednesday. The Second period of Ordinary Time runs from the Monday after Pentecost until Evening Prayer is said the night before Advent begins. This includes Christ the King Sunday, the final Sunday of Ordinary Time.

Ordinary Time of course does not mean “ordinary,” in the sense of being boring or regular and is not somehow a “break” from the Liturgical Year. The opposite is actually true: Ordinary Time celebrates, as previously mentioned, “the mystery of Christ in all its aspects.” Many important liturgical celebrations fall during Ordinary Time, including, Trinity, Corpus Christi, All Saints, the Assumption of Mary, and Christ the King. In addition, the Church continues to celebrate Saints days and other events. The major feasts, when occurring on a Sunday, trump the regular Ordinary Time Sunday lessons and liturgy.

During Ordinary Time, green vestments are worn. Green is the color of hope and in many ways should be our “ordinary” perspective on life. We are always hopeful because Jesus has saved us from sin and death; so let’s not allow this “time throughout the year” to be ordinary, but may the love and grace of God help our lives at every moment of time to be filled with hope.

JANUARY 17 — SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Reading I: I Samuel 3: 3b-10, 19

Samuel was sleeping in the temple of the LORD where the ark of God was. The LORD called to Samuel, who answered, "Here I am." Samuel ran to Eli and said, "Here I am. You called me." "I did not call you," Eli said. "Go back to sleep." So he went back to sleep. Again the LORD called Samuel, who rose and went to Eli. "Here I am," he said. "You called me." But Eli answered, "I did not call you, my son. Go back to sleep." At that time Samuel was not familiar with the LORD, because the LORD had not revealed anything to him as yet. The LORD called Samuel again, for the third time. Getting up and going to Eli, he said, "Here I am. You called me." Then Eli understood that the LORD was calling the youth. So he said to Samuel, "Go to sleep, and if you are called, reply, Speak, LORD, for your servant is listening." When Samuel went to sleep in his place, the LORD came and revealed his presence, calling out as before, "Samuel, Samuel!" Samuel answered, "Speak, for your servant is listening." Samuel grew up, and the LORD was with him, not permitting any word of his to be without effect..

Reading II: I Corinthians 6: 13c-15a, 17-20

Brothers and sisters: The body is not for immorality, but for the Lord, and the Lord is for the body; God raised the Lord and will also raise us by his power. Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? But whoever is joined to the Lord becomes one Spirit with him. Avoid immorality. Every other sin a person commits is outside the body, but the immoral person sins against his own body. Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God, and that you are not your own? For you have been purchased at a price. Therefore glorify God in your body.

The Gospel: John 1: 35-42

John was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he said, "Behold, the Lamb of God." The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus. Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, "What are you looking for?" They said to him, "Rabbi" — which translated means Teacher —, "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come, and you will see." So they went and saw where Jesus was staying, and they stayed with him that day. It was about four in the afternoon. Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, was one of the two who heard John and followed Jesus. He first found his own brother Simon and told him, "We have found the Messiah" — which is translated Christ —. Then he brought him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, "You are Simon the son of John; you will be called Cephas" — which is translated Peter.

READINGS FOR THE WEEK

Reading I: I Samuel 3: 3b-10, 19

The passage is a story of Samuel's call to be a prophet. His words would be so protected by Yahweh that they would always be effective.

Reading II: I Corinthians 6: 13c-15a, 17-20

If our bodies are to be raised after death, God must attach significance to our actions done in and through the body. Our bodies are also temples of the Holy Spirit.

The Gospel: John 1: 35-42

Andrew brings his brother Simon to Jesus, who gives the man a new name of "Rock," or "Peter." Andrew confers on Jesus the honorific title of "rabbi."

Despite the COVID, we were able to do a marvelous job this year. We had to stop the first Wednesday of the month sandwich gathering due to COVID. But, in replacement we assembled 33 families who contributed on a weekly or monthly basis.

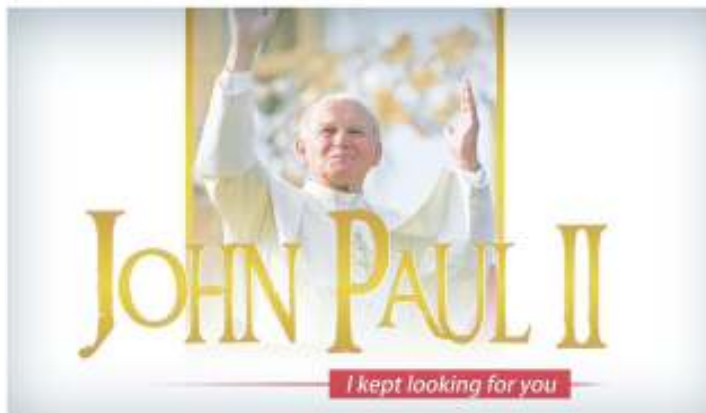

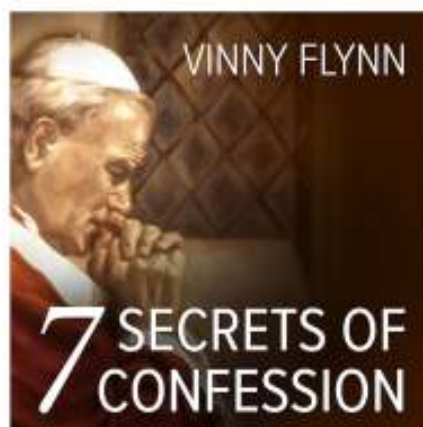
