

Persons who complete the program receive the sacraments of Baptism (if not yet baptized), First Eucharist, and Confirmation. RCIA begins after each Easter season with a rolling open enrollment and continues to the following Easter season The program is also available for Catholics who have never received the sacraments of First Eucharist and/or Confirmation. HUMAN DIGNITY

At the Masses last weekend, after Communion, I reflected on the terrible riots in the Capital and the other ones in various places over the Summer. I said I believe we have a problem in this country and I still do believe it. I also said that the problem isn't "out there" with "those people" but inside, in our own hearts. And I still believe that too.

All too often it seems the norm anymore is to demonize those with whom we disagree so much so that we can feel justified in saying (or doing) just about anything we want because those people on the "other side" are just so evil and they don't deserve to be treated with respect or dignity. Whether we explicitly or implicitly believe this, it is just flat out wrong.

If we can't accept in our heart and mind the innate human dignity of another person created in the image and likeness of God, no matter how much we disagree with them, the problem isn't the disagreement but the lack of respect for the fundamental human dignity of the other. No matter how much we disagree, and no matter how wrong the other is, or how wrong we think the other is, the person is still created in the image and likeness of God and must be treated so.

We have allowed social media and the news media (of which there really isn't much difference anymore) to stir us up so much that we have become blinded to the dignity of the other. And you know why this is done? Not for good, but for profit. Every click, every view they get makes them more money, so the only real incentive for them is not to present things in a calm and balanced way, but in the most inflammatory way possible. This happens on both sides of the "fence" causing people to identify with one side or the other, with no or very little common ground with which to create some unity. Nearly every person in the news and social media who tries to understand both sides and present a nuanced and balanced observation has been sidelined to make room for the inflammatory rhetoric that gets the most clicks and views, and hence the most money.

But the full blame isn't on social media and the news media because we have bought into it. We eat it up and drink it in like a feast. Except that it is poison, we feast on poison. Poison that corrupts our ability to respect the dignity of others, to tolerate differences of opinion, or even to accept that those who differ with us can have any good will at all.

This is not Christlike in the least. Jesus has commanded us to love both our neighbors and our enemies. While we can and should still disagree with people who we think are wrong, we cannot demonize them. If Jesus on the Cross can utter the words, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do," can we not at least do our best to think that those with whom we disagree might be sincere in their perspective and not despicable people who are trying to destroy the world?

It's certainly a challenge to do this, but the Lord will give us the grace we need if we want it and ask for it. So let's do that. Ask for the grace for ourselves and for all of our fellow Americans to begin again to see each other as all worthy of dignity and respect. For it is only from there that we can find common ground and begin to forge a future based on the common good rather than on the narrow good of one faction or the other.

As I said last Sunday, if all we do is rip each other to shreds, then the only thing left will be shreds. I don't think that's what we want. So let us change our own hearts first and see and respect the dignity of the other, so that we regain the heart of our country before it is too late.

JANUARY 24 — THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Reading I: Jonah 3: 1-5, 10

The word of the LORD came to Jonah, saying: "Set out for the great city of Nineveh, and announce to it the message that I will tell you." So Jonah made ready and went to Nineveh, according to the LORD'S bidding.

Now Nineveh was an enormously large city; it took three days to go through it. Jonah began his journey through the city, and had gone but a single day's walk announcing, "Forty days more and Nineveh shall be destroyed, "when the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast and all of them, great and small, put on sackcloth. When God saw by their actions how they turned from their evil way, he repented of the evil that he had threatened to do to them; he did not carry it out.

Reading II: I Corinthians 7: 29-31

I tell you, brothers and sisters, the time is running out. From now on, let those having wives act as not having them, those weeping as not weeping, those rejoicing as not rejoicing, those buying as not owning, those using the world as not using it fully. For the world in its present form is passing away.

The Gospel: Mark 1: 14-20

After John had been arrested, Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God: "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel." As he passed by the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting their nets into the sea; they were fishermen.

Jesus said to them, "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." Then they abandoned their nets and followed him. He walked along a little farther and saw James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John. They too were in a boat mending their nets. Then he called them. So they left their father Zebedee in the boat along with the hired men and followed him.

READINGS FOR THE WEEK

Reading I: Jonah 3: 1-5, 10

The prophet, as God's spokesman, brings about a miraculous turnaround by the people of Nineveh. Prior to that, the city was known only for its sinful cruelty and wickedness.

Reading II: I Corinthians 7: 29-31

St. Paul believed in an imminent end of the world, so he recommends detachment from earthly ways. It would be ridiculous to maintain one's "status quo" in such circumstances.

The Gospel: Mark 1: 14-20

Jesus calls His first disciples. He was so compelling that they were immediate with their responses. Jesus describes their new life's work as their becoming "fishers of men."

Once again, we thank everyone in charge and taking care of our school for making it the great place it is, and we hope we can keep this school going and growing for years and future generations to come!"











NATIONWIDE PRAYER VIGIL FOR LIFE

Catholics across the country are encouraged to observe a nationwide prayer vigil from

THURSDAY, JANUARY 28 TO

FRIDAY, JANUARY 29

This marks the 48th anniversary of the U.S. Supreme Court's 1973 Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton decisions legalizing abortion through nine months of pregnancy. Since those decisions, over 60 million abortions have been performed legally in the United States.

Each January, the National Prayer Vigil for Life is hosted by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) Pro-Life Secretariat, the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, and The Catholic University of America's Office of Campus Ministry to pray for an end to abortion and a greater respect for all human life.

While thousands of pilgrims typically attend the vigil in person each year, the Basilica will not be open to the public for the 2021 vigil due to local attendance restrictions in place because of the Coronavirus pandemic. In response, this year, for the first time ever, in addition to the televised Mass, bishops in dioceses across the country will be taking turns leading live-streamed holy hours every hour on the hour throughout the all-night vigil.
