"Euthanasia" vs. "Youth in Asia"

I may have mentioned this before, but when I was ordained, my first assignment after completing the seminary was at St. Patrick's. At that time, St. Patrick's did not have printed intercessions for daily Mass, so I would normally make them up "off the cuff". One of my normal petitions went something like this, "For an end to abortion, euthanasia, and all other attacks against innocent human life." I made that petition at every daily Mass. Well, it must have been about two years into my time at the parish when one of the regular daily Mass attendees approached me and asked why I was praying for an end to all of the "Youth in Asia". I was quite taken aback. This person was unfamiliar with the term euthanasia (more than twenty-five years ago it wasn't as common), although she was familiar with the term "mercy killing". When I explained that the terms had the same meaning, the misunderstanding was over.

Time and time again I forget that every so often there is a discrepancy between what I think I say in a homily (or at any time for that matter) and what is understood that I said. We priests might like to think that we are perfectly clear, that we say what we mean and everyone hears and comprehends it just like we intend. But like everyone else, we priests still find ourselves misunderstood and needing to explain what we have said (such as why I seemed to have been praying for the demise of all of the young people of a whole continent!). On one level it is somewhat funny how different people can hear different things, but when it comes to aspects of our faith, or even our mutual understanding, it's not such a good thing. None of us can expect to be perfectly clear at all times to everyone in everything we say. Therefore, we must be ready to offer needed clarification without taking it as a personal attack against us when someone challenges what they think they have heard us say. And at the same time, we should seek to get clarification when we think we hear something that seems strange or objectionable.

I still find it remarkable that a parishioner waited nearly two years to ask me why I was praying for the deaths of all the young people in the continent of Asia, but it happened. But I know that I, too, sometimes don't seek clarification when I think I hear something unexpected or unclear. And the problem with this is, when we act on a misunderstanding, things can go dramatically wrong very quickly. Far better for all of us if we would go directly to the person who made the statement and find out exactly what he or she said and or meant. Doing this in person and with an open mind and heart is also essential. Also, all too often, we can increase misunderstanding when we try to resolve issues through texts and emails, since they do not allow clarification or nuance, so important in true communication. As difficult as it might be, it is better to talk to the person face to face. If we would take the time to lovingly clarify something we have heard that disturbs us, it would prevent a tremendous amount of misunderstanding and its often painful consequences, and would vastly improve our communication and unity.

I hope this made sense...if not please let me know.

JANUARY 31 — FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Reading I: Deuteronomy 18: 15-20

Moses spoke to all the people, saying: "A prophet like me will the LORD, your God, raise up for you from among your own kin; to him you shall listen. This is exactly what you requested of the LORD, your God, at Horeb on the day of the assembly, when you said, 'Let us not again hear the voice of the LORD, our God, nor see this great fire any more, lest we die.' And the LORD said to me, 'This was well said. I will raise up for them a prophet like you from among their kin, and will put my words into his mouth; he shall tell them all that I command him. Whoever will not listen to my words which he speaks in my name, I myself will make him answer for it. But if a prophet presumes to speak in my name an oracle that I have not commanded him to speak, or speaks in the name of other gods, he shall die."".

Reading II: 1 Corinthians 7: 32-35

Paul is addressing newly married couples. We note his view of the equality of men and women. He advises couples but does not impose any solutions.

The Gospel: Mark 1: 21-28

Capernaum is the setting for this last section of Chapter One. Jesus' "amazing" teaching did not rely on appeals to Scripture or other teachers for verification. The healing He works presages the end of the power of demons.

THE HOLY SEE ISSUES MODIFIED METHOD OF DISTRIBUTION OF ASHES



In order to be as safe as possible, the Committee of Divine Worship has issued the following protocol for the distribution ashes on Ash Wednesday.

"The Priest says the prayer for the blessing of ashes. He sprinkles the ashes with holy water without saying anything. Then he addresses all those present and only **once** says the formula as it appears in the Roman Missal, applying it to all in general: "Repent, and believe in the Gospel", or

"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

The Priest then cleanses his hands, puts on a face mask and distributes the ashes to those who come to him or, if appropriate, he goes to those who are standing in their places. The Priest takes the ashes and sprinkles them on the head of each one without saying anything.

CASSEROLES

Joseph's HOUSE is a homeless shelter for men and women located in the city of Camden. This mission was established in 2012 by the late Msgr. Robert McDermott, the former pastor of St. Joseph's Pro Cathedral in East Camden.
