





THIS WEEKEND'S SECOND COLLECTION: FACILITIES IMPROVEMENT



Pope Francis on Confession - "Be courageous, and go to Confession!"

In an audience right before Lent, the Holy Father encouraged the faithful to receive the sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation. Pope Francis states, "Everyone says to himself: 'When was the last time I went to confession?' And if it has been a long time, don't lose another day. Go, the priest will be good. And Jesus, (will be) there, and Jesus is better than the priests. Jesus receives you: He will receive you with so much love. Be courageous, and go to confession," urged the Pope.

Acknowledging a popular objection to the sacrament, Pope Francis noted, "Someone can say, 'I confess my sins only to God.' Yes, you can say to God, 'Forgive me,' and say your sins. But our sins are also against our brothers, against the Church. This is why it is necessary to ask forgiveness of the Church and of our brothers, in the person of the priest. While the celebration of the sacrament is personal, it is rooted in the universality of the Church," which "accompanies us on the path of conversion," he explained.

"Forgiveness is not something we can give ourselves," cautioned the Pope. "One asks forgiveness; one asks it of another person, and in confession, we ask forgiveness from Jesus. Forgiveness is not a result of our efforts, but is a gift. It is a gift of the Holy Spirit, who showers us with mercy and grace that pours forth unceasingly from the open heart of Christ, crucified and risen." The Pope went on to recognize that many people feel ashamed at the idea of confessing their sins and might say, "But Father, I am embarrassed." "Even embarrassment is good. It's healthy to have a bit of shame. ... It does us good, because it makes us more humble."

"Don't be afraid of confession," Pope Francis stressed. "When someone is in line for confession, he feels all these things, even shame; but then, when he finishes confessing, he leaves (feeling) free, great, beautiful, forgiven, clean, happy. The sacrament of reconciliation is a sacrament of healing," he pointed out. "When I go to confession, it's for healing: healing the soul, healing the heart, because of something that I did to make it unwell."

The Pope pointed to the biblical story of Jesus healing a paralyzed man, which expresses the "profound link" between "forgiveness and healing," since "the Lord Jesus is revealed at the same time as the physician of soul and body." He also recounted the Parable of the Prodigal Son, who sought his father's forgiveness and was welcomed home with open arms.

The Holy Father stated, "every time we go to confession, God embraces us."

During Lent all of the parishes of the Diocese will be open on Wednesday evenings at 7:00PM for Confession, including St. Patrick's, as part of the diocesan wide "The Light is ON for you!" campaign.

We also have Confessions Monday to Friday at 9:30AM at St. Patrick's Church, and on Saturdays at 3:00PM at the Worship Center and 4:30PM at St. Matthew's.

Confession is an outstanding preparation for Easter and, more importantly, always brings us back closer to the Lord!

FEBRUARY 21 — FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

Reading I: Genesis 9: 8-15

God said to Noah and to his sons with him: "See, I am now establishing my covenant with you and your descendants after you and with every living creature that was with you: all the birds, and the various tame and wild animals that were with you and came out of the ark. I will establish my covenant with you, that never again shall all bodily creatures be destroyed by the waters of a flood; there shall not be another flood to devastate the earth." God added: "This is the sign that I am giving for all ages to come, of the covenant between me and you and every living creature with you: I set my bow in the clouds to serve as a sign of the covenant between me and the earth. When I bring clouds over the earth, and the bow appears in the clouds, I will recall the covenant I have made between me and you and all living beings, so that the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all mortal beings."

Reading II: I Peter 3: 18-22

Beloved: Christ suffered for sins once, the righteous for the sake of the unrighteous, that he might lead you to God. Put to death in the flesh, he was brought to life in the Spirit. In it he also went to preach to the spirits in prison, who had once been disobedient while God patiently waited in the days of Noah during the building of the ark, in which a few persons, eight in all, were saved through water. This prefigured baptism, which saves you now. It is not a removal of dirt from the body but an appeal to God for a clear conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers subject to him.

The Gospel: Mark 1: 12-15

The Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert, and he remained in the desert for forty days, tempted by Satan. He was among wild beasts, and the angels ministered to him. After John had been arrested, Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God: "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel."

READINGS FOR THE WEEK

Reading I: Genesis 9: 8-15

God's surmounting promise after the devastating flood was never again to bring another one to the earth. The sign of this new covenant was to be "the rainbow in the clouds."

Reading II: I Peter 3: 18-22

The great flood in Genesis "prefigured baptism." These later sacramental waters bring salvation for us through the death of Christ.

The Gospel: Mark 1: 12-15

The testing of Jesus by Satan in the water-less desert and the summary of His teaching lead to Our Lord's power soon to be on display in Galilee.

LENTEN REGULATIONS



Abstinence

All persons age 14 and older, are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday.

Fasting

All persons age 18 and older, up to and including their 59th birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on **Ash Wednesday and Good Friday**, while the other two meals are to be light.

How do we fast?

When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

Am I excused from fasting and abstinence?

Those who are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the **physically** or **mentally ill** including individuals suffering from **chronic illnesses** such as **diabetes**. Also excluded are **pregnant** or **nursing women**.
