The Year of Saint Joseph

On the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, December 8, 2020. Pope Francis proclaimed a special “Year of Saint Joseph,” beginning on December 8, 2020 and extending to the same feast in 2021. This is to celebrate the 150th anniversary of Blessed Pope Pius IX’s declaration of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. Still in the midst of the COVID pandemic, this celebration seems to have fallen a bit under the radar. But we can and should celebrate Saint Joseph and honor him for his role in Salvation History and for the powerful intercession he makes on our behalf.

Here at Holy Angels, we are going to join in a Novena to Saint Joseph which we will pray together after all of the Masses beginning Wednesday, March 10th and continuing to Thursday, March 18th. I hope that you will be able to also get to the Mass on the Solemnity of Saint Joseph, March 19th to make the most of the novena. Please see page 7 in today’s bulletin for the novena prayer sheet and bring it with you to all Masses through March 18th. If you don’t get to Mass each day during the novena, make sure you pray the novena prayers each day! Saint Joseph is a very powerful intercessor for us!

In addition, Bishop Sullivan has designated the Church of Saint Joseph, located at 1010 Liberty Street, Camden, as the diocesan pilgrimage site. In the decree of Bishop Sullivan, he says, “in virtue of the ordinary power granted to me by law and in virtue of canon 1233, I do hereby grant a partial indulgence from temporal punishment to any member of the Christian faithful who visits the Church of Saint Joseph between the 11th of March 2021 and the 8th of December 2021 who, during the visit, recites a prayer to Saint Joseph, with all other conditions being fulfilled.” This designation as a pilgrimage site will begin Thursday, the 11th day of March 2021 and said designation will end Wednesday the 8th day of December 2021.

MARCH 7 — SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

Reading I: Exodus 20: 1-17, or 20: 1-3, 7-8, 12-17

In those days, God delivered all these commandments: "I, the LORD, am your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, that place of slavery. You shall not have other gods besides me. You shall not carve idols for yourselves in the shape of anything in the sky above or on the earth below or in the waters beneath the earth; you shall not bow down before them or worship them. For I, the LORD, your God, am a jealous God, inflicting punishment for their fathers' wickedness on the children of those who hate me, down to the third and fourth generation; but bestowing mercy down to the thousandth generation on the children of those who love me and keep my commandments. "You shall not take the name of the LORD, your God, in vain. For the LORD will not leave unpunished the one who takes his name in vain. "Remember to keep holy the sabbath day. Six days you may labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is the sabbath of the LORD, your God. No work may be done then either by you, or your son or daughter, or your male or female slave, or your beast, or by the alien who lives with you. In six days the LORD made the heavens and the earth the sea and all that is in them; but on the seventh day he rested. That is why the LORD has blessed the sabbath day and made it holy. "Honor your father and your mother, that you may have a long life in the land which the LORD, your God, is giving you.

You shall not kill. You shall not commit adultery. You shall not steal.

You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. You shall not covet your neighbor's house.

You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, nor his male or female slave, nor his ox or ass, nor anything else that belongs to him."

Reading II: I Corinthians 1: 22-25

Brothers and sisters: Jews demand signs and Greeks look for wisdom, but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but to those who are called, Jews and Greeks alike, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For the foolishness of God is wiser than human wisdom, and the weakness of God is stronger than human strength.

The Gospel: John 2:13-25

Since the Passover of the Jews was near, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. He found in the temple area those who sold oxen, sheep, and doves, as well as the money changers seated there. He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and oxen, and spilled the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables, and to those who sold doves he said, "Take these out of here, and stop making my Father's house a marketplace." His disciples recalled the words of Scripture, *Zeal for your house will consume me*. At this the Jews answered and said to him, "What sign can you show us for doing this?" Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." The Jews said, "This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and you will raise it up in three days?" But he was speaking about the temple of his body. Therefore, when he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they came to believe the Scripture and the word Jesus had spoken. While he was in Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, many began to believe in his name when they saw the signs he was doing. But Jesus would not trust himself to them because he knew them all, and did not need anyone to testify about human nature. He himself understood it well.

READINGS FOR THE WEEK

Reading I: Exodus 20: 1-17, or 20: 1-3, 7-8, 12-17

Yahweh delivers the Ten Commandments by which the Covenant was to be observed and maintained. Unique to Israel is the sanctity of the sabbath.

Reading II: I Corinthians 1: 22-25

The "foolishness" of God is a crucified Christ, whom the Jews rejected because of their mistaken idea of a messiah. The Greeks rejected Him because of their rationalism.

The Gospel: John 2: 13-25

John places this powerful scene of the Temple cleansing by Jesus at the start of His ministry rather than at the end as the other three gospels do. John sees it as related to Jesus' resurrection.

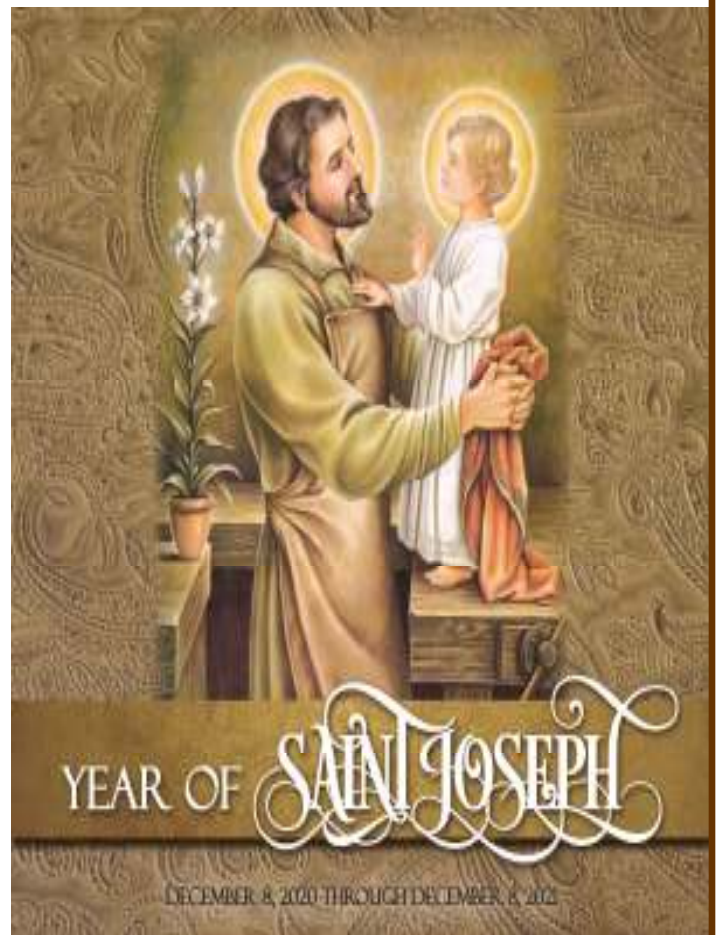

LENTEN REGULATIONS



Abstinence

All persons age 14 and older, are bound to abstain from eating meat on **Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday.**

Fasting

All persons age 18 and older, up to and including their 59th birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on **Ash Wednesday and Good Friday**, while the other two meals are to be light.

How do we fast?

When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

Am I excused from fasting and abstinence?

Those who are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the **physically or mentally ill** including individuals suffering from **chronic illnesses** such as **diabetes**. Also excluded are **pregnant or nursing women**.
