



The New Jersey Transgender Identity and Sexual Orientation Curriculum Mandate

Governor Murphy signed new legislation on March 1, 2021 that requires New Jersey public schools to integrate, from a Catholic perspective, a pretty radical "sex-ed" curriculum beginning even in kindergarten.

It is important to state right from the beginning, we are all to respect and love every person as created in the image and likeness of God. A person's sexual orientation or identification does not change this. Every person, no matter what orientation or identification, deserves to be treated justly, fairly, and with love. This however, also includes the natural right of parents to nurture and form their children morally and spiritually. It is inappropriate and unjust for the State to take away this natural, God given right of parents to form their own children. Sexuality and sexual morality is a private matter and parents have a natural right to decide when and how their children learn about it.

Traditionally, in public schools, sexual relationships and identity were taught in late middle school and high school health class with a parental opt-out, which means parents can excuse their children from these requirements. Not anymore. Now, beginning in kindergarten, throughout all subject areas, a one-sided sexual ideology will be taught using a curriculum mostly designed by a LGBTQ+ activist lobbying group - without allowing the parents the opportunity to opt their children out. The bill was recently amended this year to not just explain but to promote transgender identification. If this curriculum was designed to only develop understanding and tolerance of the differences of others it would not be objectionable.

But the state mandated curriculum is not about tolerance and understanding; it is about advocacy and indoctrination. Children are not taught to be tolerant and understanding. Quite the contrary. Tolerance is the willingness to accept beliefs or practices differing from or conflicting with one's own. You don't have to agree with them and you can think they are wrong but you tolerate them. But this is not what the curriculum is about. Children are taught that they must fully embrace and promote the LGBTQ+ agenda or they are wrong. If you believe that there are two biological genders, or that marriage is between one man and one woman, you are wrong and intolerant and evil. That's not tolerance, but the textbook definition of intolerance. According to state curriculum, it is the pinnacle of intolerance to believe that the meaning and truth of human sexuality is written into the very fabric of creation by God.

It is an absurd irony that a child can learn in biology class that there is no scientific, biological basis for gender. It is one's own feeling and personal choice that determines it. This is not tolerance this is indoctrination. This law is forcing a radical LGBTQ+ sexual ideology contrary to the Gospel of Jesus Christ into the minds and hearts of our children. And again, this is happening without your natural recourse as parents, and probably without you even being aware of it.

I urge parents who have children in any public school to fully investigate what is going on and what your child(ren) is(are) "learning." Ask questions. And demand that you, as parents, be the ones who teach your children about sexuality and sexual morality and not leave them at the mercy of a mandated curriculum that is contrary to our God given human nature.

# MARCH 14 — FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

### Reading I: 2 Chronicles 36: 14-16, 19-23

In those days, all the princes of Judah, the priests, and the people added infidelity to infidelity, practicing all the abominations of the nations and polluting the LORD's temple which he had consecrated in Jerusalem. Early and often did the LORD, the God of their fathers, send his messengers to them, for he had compassion on his people and his dwelling place. But they mocked the messengers of God, despised his warnings, and scoffed at his prophets, until the anger of the LORD against his people was so inflamed that there was no remedy. Their enemies burnt the house of God, tore down the walls of Jerusalem, set all its palaces afire, and destroyed all its precious objects. Those who escaped the sword were carried captive to Babylon, where they became servants of the king of the Chaldeans and his sons until the kingdom of the Persians came to power. All this was to fulfill the word of the LORD spoken by Jeremiah: "Until the land has retrieved its lost sabbaths, during all the time it lies waste it shall have rest while seventy years are fulfilled." In the first year of Cyrus, king of Persia, in order to fulfill the word of the LORD spoken by Jeremiah, the LORD inspired King Cyrus of Persia to issue this proclamation throughout his kingdom, both by word of mouth and in writing: "Thus says Cyrus, king of Persia: All the kingdoms of the earth the LORD, the God of heaven, has given to me, and he has also charged me to build him a house in Jerusalem, which is in Judah. Whoever, therefore, among you belongs to any part of his people, let him go up, and may his God be with him!"

### Reading II: Ephesians 2: 4-10

Brothers and sisters: God, who is rich in mercy, because of the great love he had for us, even When we were dead in our transgressions, brought us to life with Christ — by grace you have been saved —, raised us up with him, and seated us with him in the heavens in Christ Jesus, that in the ages to come He might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in his kindness to us in Christ Jesus. For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not from you; it is the gift of God; it is not from works, so no one may boast. For we are his handiwork, created in Christ Jesus for the good works that God has prepared in advance, that we should live in them.

### The Gospel: John 3: 14-21

Jesus said to Nicodemus: "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life." For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him. Whoever believes in him will not be condemned, but whoever does not believe has already been condemned, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God. And this is the verdict, that the light came into the world, but people preferred darkness to light, because their works were evil. For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not come toward the light, so that his works might not be exposed. But whoever lives the truth comes to the light, so that his works may be clearly seen as done in God.

# **READINGS FOR THE WEEK**

The story of a collapsed Judah follows divine judgment. The chief evil of ignoring the prophets brings about a 70 year long exile of the Israelites in Babylon. The unexpected decree of Cyrus king of Persia brings about a happy outcome.

#### Reading II: Ephesians 2: 4-10

God's great love for the world is most evident when He sends His only Son into the world as His greatest gift.

#### The Gospel: John 3: 14-21

The Father's love for the world is manifest in His Son Jesus. Jesus in turn tells His pupil Nicodemus that when "the Son of Man is lifted up" (on the cross) it will be a similar but much more powerful healing than that of the serpent lifted up in the desert.







### Abstinence

All persons age 14 and older, are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday.

# Fasting

All persons age 18 and older, up to and including their 59<sup>th</sup> birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on **Ash Wednesday and Good Friday**, while the other two meals are to be light.

## How do we fast?

When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

## Am I excused from fasting and abstinence?

Those who are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the **physically** or **mentally ill** including individuals suffering from **chronic illnesses** such as **diabetes**. Also excluded are **pregnant** or **nursing women**.
