


STEWARDSHIP OPPORTUNITY

APRIL 18 — THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

Reading I: Acts of the Apostles 3:13-15, 17-19

Peter said to the people: "The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, the God of our fathers, has glorified his servant Jesus, whom you handed over and denied in Pilate's presence when he had decided to release him. You denied the Holy and Righteous One and asked that a murderer be released to you. The author of life you put to death, but God raised him from the dead; of this we are witnesses. Now I know, brothers, that you acted out of ignorance, just as your leaders did; but God has thus brought to fulfillment what he had announced beforehand through the mouth of all the prophets, that his Christ would suffer. Repent, therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be wiped away."

Reading II: 1 John 2:1-5a

My children, I am writing this to you so that you may not commit sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous one. He is expiation for our sins, and not for our sins only but for those of the whole world. The way we may be sure that we know him is to keep his commandments. Those who say, "I know him," but do not keep his commandments are liars, and the truth is not in them. But whoever keeps his word, the love of God is truly perfected in him.

Gospel: Luke 24:35-48

The two disciples recounted what had taken place on the way, and how Jesus was made known to them in the breaking of bread. While they were still speaking about this, he stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." But they were startled and terrified and thought that they were seeing a host. Then he said to them, "Why are you troubled? And why do questions arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet, that it is I myself. Touch me and see, because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have." And as he said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. While they were still incredulous for joy and were amazed, he asked them, "Have you anything here to eat?" They gave him a piece of baked fish; he took it and ate it in front of them. He said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the law of Moses and in the prophets and psalms must be fulfilled." Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures. And he said to them, "Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things."

READINGS FOR THE WEEK

Reading I: Acts of the Apostles 3: 13-15, 17-19

Peter's use of several honored titles of God in the Old Testament shows that he is a true Israelite speaking to his own in this sermon, and he urges them to repent and be converted to Christ.

Reading II: 1 John 2: 1-5a

Jesus is our true Advocate should we fall into sin. Paul tells us that "to know God" means keeping His commandments.

The Gospel: Luke 24: 35-48

Several themes of Luke's gospel come together in this last section. Such are table fellowship, God's promises fulfilled in Jesus; forgiveness of sins; witnessing; the Holy Spirit; Jesus' journey to the Father is complete.

Easter Time

As we continue to celebrate this joyous time of the Resurrection, the victory of Christ over sin and death, it is so important to remember that the salvation offered to us in the Lord's victory, while freely offered to us, is neither automatic nor necessary. If we want to be saved by Jesus, we must say yes to the Lord, not just by our words but also by our thoughts and actions. No one earns salvation or deserves it. What we deserve is hell due to our sins. But taking pity on us, in his infinite mercy, God took on humanity in Jesus Christ and suffered and died to pay the debt of our sins. And by His rising from the dead, God showed that his love is more powerful than sin and death. For this we need to both rejoice and be grateful every day.

But we must not cheapen the love and mercy of God by taking it for granted. Too often we are encouraged, sadly even sometimes within the Church, that heaven is attainable without commitment and without obedience to God's commands. It is simply not true that God's infinite mercy somehow cancels out His infinite justice. In the end, we will face one or the other. The only way to access the free, undeserved and infinite mercy of God is to acknowledge his sovereignty over us in everything, including morality. Then we can come humbly to him and implore his mercy when we fail in our weakness to be faithful to His commands.

On the other hand, continuing the original sin of Adam and Eve and desiring to be the author of right and wrong, is the path to judgment not to mercy. Trying to rationalize or emotionalize and justify evil by trying to call it "good" makes the devil very happy. All too often in our current society, we are called not just to tolerate, but to praise behavior that is contrary to God's law. And anyone who speaks up in defense of God's word as revealed to us in Sacred Scripture, are the ones thought of as evil and then risk the dreaded "cancel."

While this doesn't seem like the most joyous Easter time message, in essence it is. Because it is the truth of God that sets us free and for this we should rejoice. Jesus died and rose so that we might have life. And for all who accept Christ, and what he teaches, are offered eternal life with Him. That is something we should be happy about and joyful about. Something so happy and joyful that we should be proclaiming, rather than hiding.

I think about these next weeks leading up to Pentecost. How afraid the Apostles were even though they encountered the risen Lord multiple times. And then how they were empowered by the Holy Spirit to speak boldly and lovingly the truth of Christ. For it is an act of love to offer the truth to someone, rather than to enable them to remain in error and sin. While we can't (and shouldn't) make someone follow God, at least we can point out the way to them. May the Holy Spirit come in a new and powerful way into the hearts of believers and enable us to speak the truth fearlessly and lovingly, despite whatever pushback, so that the mercy of God may be made more and more available to the world today.
