The Value of Human Life

This year, Respect Life Sunday will be on October 3rd. During the month of October and especially on Respect Life Sunday we focus, as we do every year, on the value of human life. But given not just the recent number of horrific mass shootings, but at the same time the sad, multiple daily murders in our cities and communities, it's hard not to observe how little value is placed on human life nowadays and why even in April we should want to talk about the respect for human life. In 2019, the US Dept of Justice estimated the number of murders in the nation was 16,425. It's a number that boggles the imagination.

With these grim statistics and the fresh memories of the latest tragedies, it is totally reasonable intellectually and emotionally to look for a response. People will call for less guns, more guns, no guns, expanded background checks, national concealed carry laws, red flag laws, mental health exclusions, any variety of approaches. And as usual, whatever side one is on, one will embrace that side's position.

In the past twenty-two years since the mass shooting at Columbine High school on April 20, 1999, there has been an increase in mass shootings. One wonders if even more laws of either further restricting access to firearms or making them more readily available is going to solve the problem we have. And while there are many things we can and should do in society to try to help the disaffected people who carry out this kind of bloodshed, what we have is not a problem of laws but a problem of faith.

Murder of another human is nearly as old as humanity. But remember, Cain killed his brother Abel only after sin entered the world. Only after humanity rejected God's sovereignty and his love and protection, did humanity go down the path to murder. One might think that as humanity "develops" and becomes more "civilized" murder would disappear. But it hasn't. And the reason is the same reason we find in Cain's murder of his brother Abel; sin and the rejection of God and his plan for us. As many times as I have said this, I will say it again and will never tire of saying it. The more we as a society reject God and the laws that he gave us for our good, the more we will suffer. The past three or so decades of societal moral deterioration has placed us in a more vulnerable position and we are experiencing the effects of it. While mass murders obviously catch the most headlines, do we see the destructiveness of our alienation from God also in the increased numbers of suicides, drug overdoses, severe depression, substance abuse, violent behavior, and society seeming to be in a constantly aggressive posture against itself? Because that's part of it as well.

While the opposing political spectrums can and will argue about how to respond to mass shootings, I can tell you I know the solution. So do you. We as a society need to come back to God and his commandments. That means our civil laws need to respect and support the Natural Law that God has imprinted in the world. But most importantly, each and every single one of us as well needs to be more faithful to God and his commandments. The individuals who commit mass murder do not drop out of the sky. They are from families and communities. The more we turn away from the Lord and his ways in our families and communities, the more we set up the societal conditions for further tragedies. Satan must be laughing himself silly seeing us destroy our souls and destroy each other. Especially when the answer and solution is right before our eyes - our Savior Jesus Christ, who died on the cross and rose from the dead to set us free from all this. So let us all consciously decide right now to return to the Lord and his ways, individually and in our families, so that by his grace and power he may give us the healing and strength we need and want in our world.

My dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

The fourth Sunday of Easter, April 25th, is “Good Shepherd Sunday” and is designated World Day of Prayer for Vocations. The Gospel today calls Jesus the Good Shepherd. As I write, our diocese has two men preparing for ordination to the priesthood May 22nd and four men preparing for ordination to the transitional diaconate on May 15th. We have eight men in formation which gives us hope for the immediate future.

However, looking past both this year and next, we will not have ordinations for a few years. Our diocese will go two years without an ordination to the transitional diaconate. This means no ordinations to the priesthood for the years 2023 and 2024. The next priesthood ordination would be in 2025, God-willing.

Three years is a long time to go without a priesthood ordination. We need to consider the future needs of our diocese. Will there be enough priests to work and minister in the diocese? Who will follow our dedicated priests who today shepherd the flock?

Now is the time for each of us to encourage those men we think would be good priests to consider God’s call to the priesthood. “Good Shepherd Sunday” is an opportune time for priests and people to shepherd vocations to the priesthood.


The priests of the diocese have an important role to foster vocations to the priesthood. They do so by faithfully fulfilling their ministerial duties: attentiveness to prayer, the liturgy, homily preparation, serving the people to whom they are assigned and knowing the smell of the sheep, as Pope Francis teaches. I encourage the priests of our diocese to share their particular vocation story. Such stories can inspire others to follow the call of God by embracing a vocation to the priesthood.

Fostering vocations to the priesthood is not the responsibility of our priests alone. I encourage all the faithful, you my sisters and brothers in the pews and those joining us on live stream, to promote vocations. I ask that you do two things. One, recall the teaching of Jesus: “ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest.” Pray for vocations to the diocesan priesthood. Second, encourage young men in your parish, including your sons and grandsons, those you think would be a good priest. Ask him to pray about. Give his name to your pastor who will follow up with that young man.

If you are a young man and someone has mentioned to you, “I think you’d be a good priest,” do not panic; do not be embarrassed. Take such a comment as a complement. It is a noble thing to be considered worthy to act in the place of Jesus, the Good Shepherd.

Please, know of my prayers for each of you and my concern for the future of our church in the diocese of Camden. With your prayerful support and encouragement of young men, that future can flourish. However, in all honesty, I am concerned for our church and for the good Catholic people of South Jersey if we do nothing about this crisis.

Reading I: Acts of the Apostles 4:8-12

Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said:

“Leaders of the people and elders: If we are being examined today about a good deed done to a cripple, namely, by what means he was saved, then all of you and all the people of Israel should know that it was in the name of Jesus Christ the Nazorean whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead; in his name this man stands before you healed.

He is the stone rejected by you, the builders, which has become the cornerstone.

There is no salvation through anyone else, nor is there any other name under heaven given to the human race by which we are to be saved.”

Reading II: 1 John 3:1-2

Beloved:

See what love the Father has bestowed on us that we may be called the children of God. Yet so we are. The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. Beloved, we are God’s children now; what we shall be has not yet been revealed. We do know that when it is revealed we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is.

Gospel: John 10:11-18

Jesus said:

“I am the good shepherd. A good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. A hired man, who is not a shepherd and whose sheep are not his own, sees a wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away, and the wolf catches and scatters them. This is because he works for pay and has no concern for the sheep. I am the good shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I will lay down my life for the sheep. I have power to lay it down, and power to take it up again. This command I have received from my Father.”
