

First Holy Eucharist

Holy Angels Parish warmly rejoices with its children who received the Lord in the Most Holy Eucharist on Saturday, May 1st. It was a joyful and beautiful celebration. Our new First Communicants now have the opportunity to regularly receive their Savior who wishes to share his love and his very life with them as they continue their life's journey. May they and their families always be faithful to Jesus as He is to them. I offer a special note of thanks to all who helped with the day's celebrations; a lot of time and effort went in to make our First Communion as special as it was, especially during these trying times. Thanks to our Director of Religious Education, Irene Clark, and the entire First Communion committee for their hard work; it is clear that you love our children very much.

The Month of Mary

It is a perfect segue to write about devotion to the Blessed Mother following mention of the Holy Eucharist. Christ our Lord would not have been able to give us Himself to us in the Eucharist if our Lady had not given him to us first in his humanity. Mary's role as mother of Jesus in the economy of salvation as laid out in God's plan is indispensable. Not only does Mary, as mother, bring forth the Lord to the world, but also as the perfect disciple she shows us the way to follow him. The month of May has long been dedicated to Mary, to honor her and to ask for her intercession. One of the best methods of doing both is to prayerfully recite the Rosary. Saints, popes, holy people for generations have emphasized the value of the Rosary in bringing one closer to the Lord. At each critical stage of the Lord's life from the annunciation and birth, to the very beginning of Christ's public life initiated at his mother's behest at the wedding at Cana, to the very end of his public life as he is dying on the cross, his mother is present as an abiding presence in his life. Now in heaven she still abides with her son, our Lord, continuing her mission of bring the Lord to the world and leading the world to him. The Rosary helps to commemorate key events in the life of Christ and through our fruitful meditation on these saving events; we can through Mary's intercession, obtain the grace to live the kind of faithful discipleship that she lived. I enthusiastically urge everyone to pray the Rosary often, not just in May. I especially encourage families to pray the rosary together. Although there might be a bit of awkwardness in the beginning, stick with it, for praying together as a family offers such tremendous spiritual benefits it is hard to overestimate.

It is particularly true this May. Pope Francis has asked us all to pray the Rosary every day in May for an end to the coronavirus pandemic. It is to be a prayer marathon with the theme 'Prayer to God went up incessantly from the whole Church.' Don't think this won't have a significant impact. Our Lady has a history in responding with her intercessory ability with her Son. This call from Pope Francis reminds me of a similar one 450 years ago when Europe was on the verge of being overtaken by the invading Turkish Muslims. On October 7, 1571 the Battle of Lepanto, near Greece, took place between the vastly superior Turkish naval forces and the much smaller patchwork Catholic navy made up from a few countries. Pope Pius V, ordered the churches of Rome opened for prayer day and night, encouraging the faithful to petition the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary through the recitation of the Rosary. Despite the odds against the Catholic forces, they prevailed. The battle was a turning point in repelling the Turkish invasions of Europe. To remember the battle and Our Lady's intercession, the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary was established on October 7th by Pope Pius V. Clearly, Jesus responds to his mother's requests. Pray that Rosary!



BAPTISM PREPARATION CLASS



MAY 2—FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Reading I: Acts of the Apostles 9:26-31

When Saul arrived in Jerusalem he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him, not believing that he was a disciple. Then Barnabas took charge of him and brought him to the apostles, and he reported to them how he had seen the Lord, and that he had spoken to him, and how in Damascus he had spoken out boldly in the name of Jesus. He moved about freely with them in Jerusalem, and spoke out boldly in the name of the Lord. He also spoke and debated with the Hellenists, but they tried to kill him. And when the brothers learned of this, they took him down to Caesarea and sent him on his way to Tarsus. The church throughout all Judea, Galilee, and Samaria was at peace. It was being built up and walked in the fear of the Lord, and with the consolation of the Holy Spirit it grew in numbers.

Reading II: 1 John 3:18-24

Children, let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth. Now this is how we shall know that we belong to the truth and reassure our hearts before him in whatever our hearts condemn, for God is greater than our hearts and knows everything. Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have confidence in God and receive from him whatever we ask, because we keep his commandments and do what pleases him. And his commandment is this: we should believe in the name of his Son, Jesus Christ, and love one another just as he commanded us. Those who keep his commandments remain in him, and he in them, and the way we know that he remains in us is from the Spirit he gave us.

Gospel: John 15:1-8

Jesus said to his disciples:

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine grower. He takes away every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and every one that does he prunes so that it bears more fruit. You are already pruned because of the word that I spoke to you. Remain in me, as I remain in you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing. Anyone who does not remain in me will be thrown out like a branch and wither; people will gather them and throw them into a fire and they will be burned. If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask for whatever you want and it will be done for you. By this is my Father glorified, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples."

READINGS FOR THE WEEK

Reading I: Acts 9: 26-31

St. Paul not only witnesses the risen Jesus, but also has become His missionary. At the same time, Paul's conversion evidently brought peace to the Palestinian Church communities.

Reading II: I John 3: 18-24

God, being "greater than our hearts" still inspires confidence even if our consciences condemn us. As a result, we do what pleases Him.

The Gospel: John 15: 1-8

The vine and branch imagery includes an assurance from Jesus that the Word of God has made the disciples safe from pruning. When these disciples "bear fruit" as His emissaries they glorify the Father.
