

The Virtue of Fortitude

The next Cardinal Virtue on the list is Fortitude. But before we get to it, I noticed that when I gave the introduction to virtue a few weeks back, I had neglected to offer an ancient and helpful rule of thumb regarding the measurement of virtue. Along with describing virtue as the habitual disposition to will and to do the good, virtue can also be described perhaps in a more familiar way as the mean between the two extremes of excess and deficit. For instance, the virtue of patience is the mean between the deficit (absence) of patience, called impatience, and the excess of patience, which could be called apathy or complacency.


OK, now onto fortitude. The Catechism teaches that, “Fortitude is the moral virtue that ensures firmness in difficulties and constancy in the pursuit of the good. It strengthens the resolve to resist temptations and to overcome obstacles in the moral life. The virtue of fortitude enables one to conquer fear, even fear of death, and to face trials and persecutions. It disposes one even to renounce and sacrifice his life in defense of a just cause.” (CCC 1808)

Returning to the idea that a virtue is the mean between two extremes, it may be illuminative to look at the extreme excess and defect of fortitude. Can you guess them? The excess of fortitude would be foolhardiness where one would take unnecessarily dangerous risks for an unimportant cause. The defect of (or lack of) fortitude would be cowardice. If virtue is the mean between two extremes, then for the virtue of fortitude, we should avoid its excess by being willing to suffer for its own sake (i.e., without sufficient reason), and we should also avoid the deficit of fortitude that occurs when we run from suffering merely because it is unpleasant. In the end, fortitude is the virtue that enables us to be strong in the face of opposition, including being willing to suffer for a just cause.

The virtue of fortitude, although a human virtue, can assist us in coming closer to the Lord by courageously doing what is good even in difficult circumstances. It reminds me of the Lord’s parable of the Sower and the Seed. The seed (i.e. the Word of God) that fell on rocky soil was initially received with enthusiasm and began to grow, but when trial and persecution came along, it quickly withered. There was no fortitude there. A more contemporary illustration of true fortitude was related in a speech by Admiral James Stockdale. Admiral Stockdale won the Congressional Medal of Honor for his leadership as a prisoner of war in the infamous and brutal Hoa Lo prison camp, known as the “Hanoi Hilton” in Vietnam. In a speech he gave to the Midshipmen at the U.S. Naval Academy he spoke about character and stated, “The test of character is not ‘hanging in there’ when you expect a light at the end of the tunnel, but performance of duty and persistence of example when you know no light is coming. Believe me, I’ve been there.” That is a very poignant example of what true fortitude really is.

Again, with all human virtues, we acquire and develop them through their practice. While it may not be possible to overcome all of our fear of suffering for a just cause right away, we can certainly get there by starting out small. Maybe the next time someone at work or a friend mocks our Christian Faith or advocates some kind of immorality perhaps you could gently yet firmly defend the truth accepting whatever “razzing” you might endure because of it. That would be a great way of developing the great and very important virtue of fortitude.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT on October 1, 2020, The Diocese of Camden, New Jersey, (the “Diocese”) filed for protection under Chapter 11 of Title 11 of the United States Code.

The Bankruptcy Court has established June 30, 2021 at 11:59 p.m. (prevailing Eastern time) as the deadline to file proofs of claim against the Diocese (the “Bar Date”).

If you have a claim against the Diocese including, without limitation, a claim related to sexual abuse committed by any person connected with the Diocese, you must file a claim on or before the Bar Date with Prime Clerk, the appointed Claims Agent.

IF YOU DO NOT TIMELY FILE A PROOF OF CLAIM, YOU MAY FORFEIT YOUR RIGHT TO VOTE ON ANY PLAN OF REORGANIZATION AND TO SHARE IN ANY DISTRIBUTIONS TO CREDITORS IN CONNECTION WITH THE DIOCESE’S CHAPTER 11 CASE.





MAY 23 — PENTECOST SUNDAY

Reading I: Acts of the Apostles 2: 1-11

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim. Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven staying in Jerusalem. At this sound, they gathered in a large crowd, but they were confused because each one heard them speaking in his own language. They were astounded, and in amazement they asked, "Are not all these people who are speaking Galileans? Then how does each of us hear them in his native language? We are Parthians, Medes, and Elamites, inhabitants of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the districts of Libya near Cyrene, as well as travelers from Rome, both Jews and converts to Judaism, Cretans and Arabs, yet we hear them speaking in our own tongues of the mighty acts of God."

Reading II: I Corinthians 12: 3b-7, 12-13

Brothers and sisters: No one can say, "Jesus is Lord," except by the Holy Spirit. There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit. As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit.

OR: Galatians 5:16-25

Brothers and sisters, live by the Spirit and you will certainly not gratify the desire of the flesh. For the flesh has desires against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh; these are opposed to each other, so that you may not do what you want. But if you are guided by the Spirit, you are not under the law. Now the works of the flesh are obvious: immorality, impurity, lust, idolatry, sorcery, hatreds, rivalry, jealousy, outbursts of fury, acts of selfishness, dissensions, factions, occasions of envy, drinking bouts, orgies, and the like. I warn you, as I warned you before, that those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God. In contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control. Against such there is no law. Now those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified their flesh with its passions and desires. If we live in the Spirit, let us also follow the Spirit.

Gospel: John 20: 19-23

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

OR: John: 15:26-27; 16:12-15

Jesus said to his disciples: "When the Advocate comes whom I will send you from the Father, the Spirit of truth that proceeds from the Father, he will testify to me. And you also testify, because you have been with me from the beginning. "I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now. But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth. He will not speak on his own, but he will speak what he hears, and will declare to you the things that are coming. He will glorify me, because he will take from what is mine and declare it to you. Everything that the Father has is mine; for this reason I told you that he will take from what is mine and declare it to you."

READINGS FOR THE WEEK

Reading I: Acts 2: 1-11

The bestowal of the Holy Spirit upon the first community of the nascent Church is recounted with great drama and memorable details, not the least of which is the language miracle.

Reading II: I Corinthians 12: 3b-7, 12-13

Sensing some dissension in the community, Paul knows that such can threaten unity among the members. He reminds them that it is one and the same Spirit who confers all gifts, service and workings. These diverse parts form one body.

The Gospel: John 20: 19-23

After showing His wounds to the gathered disciples, the Risen Lord offers them His peace. He gives the group, including the Twelve, the power to bestow the Spirit on those who believe and also to forgive their sins.
