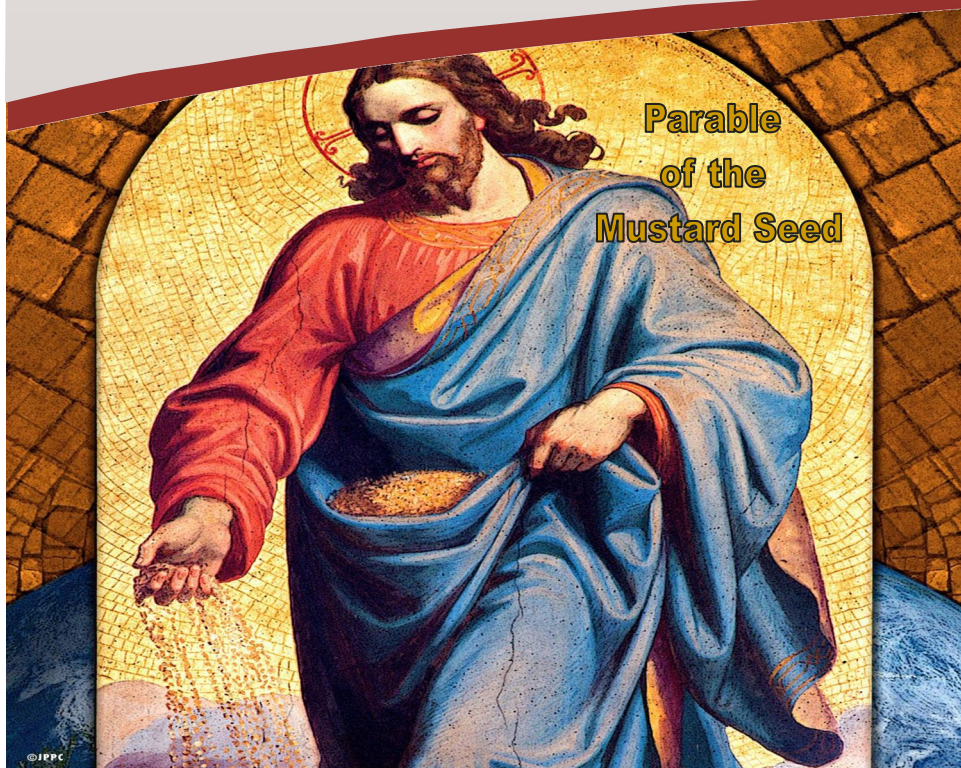

Focus of the Mass

I read a book on the Liturgy awhile back, and in this book the author poses a fundamental question: Is the Liturgy (Mass) primarily adoration of God or is it first and foremost a vehicle for the instruction of the people and the upbuilding of the community? Much of the debate and discussion as well as the tension regarding translations of the bible and the Sacramentary (the book of prayers the priest uses at Mass), liturgical style, church architecture, liturgical roles of the clergy and laity, music composition, and church artwork often hinge on this question. While the question of the precedence of adoration or of the community isn't always explicit, it is still nearly always present implicitly. In posing this question I don't think there should be an attempt to force an "either/or" position where there is a "both/and" situation. Without a doubt both aspects of adoration and community are critically important and there are times within the Mass itself where one of the aspects naturally takes priority, but looking at the Mass as a whole the question still needs to be answered. For upon the answer, rests in my opinion, the whole value of and reason for the Mass.

I strongly believe that the principal focus of the Mass is adoration of God. It is through our adoration of God, through the participation of Jesus' sacrifice, that we become a community. It is our faith in Christ's passion, death, and resurrection that unites us. We are one community, we form one body *in* Jesus not just because of Jesus. Because of this, our worship should be centered on Christ, not on us. While we are the ultimate beneficiaries of worship (for we can't add anything to God's glory), it is only beneficial to us when we properly fix our gaze on God and understand our complete dependence on Him. As soon as, not just our words and gestures, but anything we do at Mass (music, art, church design, etc.) becomes anthropocentric (man-centered) instead of Theocentric (God-centered) we begin to lose our awareness of our dependence on God and risk losing what it means to be Christian in the first place.

I don't mean to sound melodramatic, but I believe this is a real risk in our contemporary culture. We live in a society where the individual is exalted and it tends to idolize, even deify the human person. For the most part, it has always been so in the world. Since the fall of humanity, the influence of Satan presupposes a concerted effort to turn man's gaze from God. But when we walk through the doors of a Church and participate in the saving event of the passion, death, and resurrection of Christ, the event that destroyed Satan's grasp on man, we should get the sense that we are walking into another world. A world set apart, a sacred world, a world as it is meant to be.

Everything we do at Mass (and before and after Mass) must be designed to focus our attention, our hearts, our devotion, and our love toward God. And if we want to fully participate in the Mass the manner in which we present ourselves before God says a lot about our interior disposition. Anyone who has a role in and participates in the Mass (which is everyone!) must be always on guard from letting the world encroach on the sacredness and God-centeredness of the Mass. For it is the power of Christ's death and resurrection that is made present at Mass that is intended to transform the world rather than being transformed by the world. When we appreciate and understand this, it is then we become a true Christian community and can be most effective in building up the Kingdom of God. May we all constantly strive to do our best to focus our worship on God and God alone and thereby receive, in abundance, his unifying love and strength in order to make present to the world the saving love of God in and through his community the Church.

FEMA began accepting applications for Funeral Assistance on April 12, 2021 through a dedicated call center. The phone number for the FEMA Funeral Assistance Program is 844-684-6333 | TTY: 800-462-7585. Hours of operation are Monday through Friday 9AM—9PM eastern time.

To apply, you must call FEMA, there is no online application. The person applying must be the individual who incurred the funeral expense for the deceased. Please understand that FEMA will NOT speak to any businesses like funeral homes or cemeteries.

NO ONLINE APPLICATIONS ACCEPTED

FEMA asks that you have all documentation in hand before calling. This will speed up the process.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT on October 1, 2020, The Diocese of Camden, New Jersey, (the “Diocese”) filed for protection under Chapter 11 of Title 11 of the United States Code.

The Bankruptcy Court has established **June 30, 2021 at 11:59 p.m.** (prevailing Eastern time) as the deadline to file proofs of claim against the Diocese (the “**Bar Date**”).

If you have a claim against the Diocese including, without limitation, a claim related to sexual abuse committed by any person connected with the Diocese, you must file a claim on or before the Bar Date with Prime Clerk, the appointed Claims Agent.

REPORT SEXUAL ABUSE

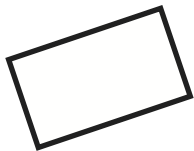

JUNE 13 — ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Reading I: Ezekiel 17: 22-24

Thus says the Lord GOD: I, too, will take from the crest of the cedar, from its topmost branches tear off a tender shoot, and plant it on a high and lofty mountain; on the mountain heights of Israel I will plant it. It shall put forth branches and bear fruit, and become a majestic cedar. Birds of every kind shall dwell beneath it, every winged thing in the shade of its boughs. And all the trees of the field shall know that I, the LORD, bring low the high tree, lift high the lowly tree, wither up the green tree, and make the withered tree bloom. As I, the LORD, have spoken, so will I do.

Reading II: 2 Corinthians 5: 6-10

Brothers and sisters: We are always courageous, although we know that while we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord, for we walk by faith, not by sight. Yet we are courageous, and we would rather leave the body and go home to the Lord. Therefore, we aspire to please him, whether we are at home or away. For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each may receive recompense, according to what he did in the body, whether good or evil.

Gospel: Mark 4: 26-34

Jesus said to the crowds: "This is how it is with the kingdom of God; it is as if a man were to scatter seed on the land and would sleep and rise night and day and through it all the seed would sprout and grow, he knows not how. Of its own accord the land yields fruit, first the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the grain is ripe, he wields the sickle at once, for the harvest has come." He said, "To what shall we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable can we use for it? It is like a mustard seed that, when it is sown in the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on the earth. But once it is sown, it springs up and becomes the largest of plants and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the sky can dwell in its shade." With many such parables he spoke the word to them as they were able to understand it. Without parables he did not speak to them, but to his own disciples he explained everything in private.

READINGS FOR THE WEEK

Reading I: Ezekiel 17: 22-24

The prophet uses imagery of cedar trees to make his point. The "new twig" from the top of the cedar represents a future king from the House of David. The other cedars represent the kings of other nations.

Reading II: 2 Corinthians 5: 6-10

When we walk through life in faith, we are given needed courage, and our lives bear fruit. Thus do we become prepared for a favorable judgment by God.

The Gospel: Mark 4: 26-34

The metaphors in Our Lord's parables allowed Him to speak about God and His kingdom in a way that got His hearers' attention in ways other teaching techniques could not.
