Hail and Farewell

By now I'm sure you have heard that Fr. Jose has been named as Administrator of St. Stephen's Parish in Pennsauken and Fr. Hugh has been transferred to the Parish of St. Teresa of Calcutta. I am very sorry to see them go. They have done a lot for Holy Angels during their time here; they will surely be missed. Fr. Jose and Fr Hugh have been very helpful to me during my first year at the parish. I am very grateful for their assistance and priestly support. We will have a farewell gathering for both of them sometime in July and will let everyone know the date.

At the same time, we welcome "officially" Fr. Peter Gallagher as our full time Parochial Vicar. I've known Fr. Gallagher since when he was in the seminary, and I think he is going to do great things here at Holy Angels. We are blessed to have him.

Saint Francis and Hypocrisy

The following is a short but powerful story about an event in the life of Saint Francis of Assisi. In it he demonstrates our need to strive for integrity, or wholeness - to be the same person on the inside as on the outside.

It was winter, and he [St. Francis] was wearing only a single habit [religious tunic] over his holy body, and it was patched all over with coarse pieces of cloth. His guardian, who was also his companion, came by a fox hide and gave it to him, saying, "Father, you're suffering from spleen and stomach pain, so I beg you, for the love of God, to let this hide be sewn on the inside of your habit. Or if that is too much to expect, at least take a small part of the hide to cover your stomach." But Francis answered, "If you want me to wear this fox skin beneath my habit, then let me wear one of equal size on the outside. Sewn there, it will show others that there is another one hidden inside, too."

The lesson of Saint Francis is a good one upon which to reflect. It is very easy to project ourselves as one type of person while being quite different on the inside. It is a great challenge to resist hypocrisy, but it is essential. One of the things the Lord most frequently criticized in Sacred Scripture was hypocrisy, so it is very important that we do what we can to eradicate it from our lives. As always, on our own it would be impossible, but by God's grace we can succeed. First and foremost, as with most things, we need to acknowledge the areas in our life where we give in to hypocrisy and call upon the Lord for his strength. Then cooperating with His grace and our effort we can be like the example give by Saint Francis, and seek to really be people of integrity, the same inside as out.

To apply, you must call FEMA, there is no online application. The person applying must be the individual who incurred the funeral expense for the deceased. Please understand that FEMA will NOT speak to any businesses like funeral homes or cemeteries.

NO ONLINE APPLICATIONS ACCEPTED

FEMA asks that you have all documentation in hand before calling. This will speed up the process.

The Bankruptcy Court has established **June 30, 2021 at 11:59 p.m.** (prevailing Eastern time) as the deadline to file proofs of claim against the Diocese (the “Bar Date”).

If you have a claim against the Diocese including, without limitation, a claim related to sexual abuse committed by any person connected with the Diocese, you must file a claim on or before the Bar Date with Prime Clerk, the appointed Claims Agent.

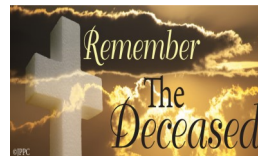

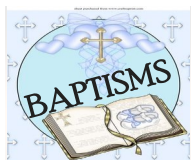

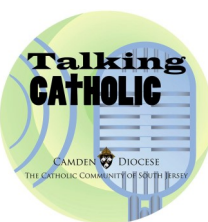

Dear Parents/Guardians:

I hope this letter finds you and your family in good health. As you are aware students will be returning to the classroom in September as well as Family Faith Formation. With that in mind Holy Angels Family Faith Formation will offer two programs:

1. Home Schooling Grades 1-8 (third Sunday of the month)
2. Traditional Sunday morning Grades 1-8-10:30AM

Classes for both programs will be held at Holy Angels Catholic School.

Sacrament Preparation classes will also be held for students preparing for the Sacrament of Reconciliation, First Eucharist and Confirmation. Families are required to complete a sacrament form before classes begin. These classes and scheduled retreats will be held at Holy Angels Catholic School. Information on sacrament preparation class with day and time will be given in September, 2021 before classes start.

Tuition and Sacrament Activity Fee for the 2021-2022 Religious Education School year are as follows:

- 1 child-\$175.00
- 2 children-\$225.00
- 3 or more children \$275.00
- Special Needs Program: Any child who is unable to be mainstreamed into a regular education setting is MOST welcome. We will work out a program that best fits your child.
- Reconciliation/Communion Activity Fee is \$50.00
- Confirmation Activity Fee is \$60.00 (paid in the first year of sacrament preparation)

Holy Angels FFF offers monthly payment plans. If you are experiencing financial difficulty, let us know. DO NOT let this prevent you from re-registering your child for class.

Volunteers are always welcomed and needed as catechists (training and guidance provided), substitutes, office assistants, and classroom aides. If you can volunteer your time it would be appreciated and a rewarding experience.

Complete all forms enclosed that were enclosed in your packet. Make sure all pre-printed information is correct and designate the session your student will be attending. Then return to the Office of Family Faith Formation as soon as possible.

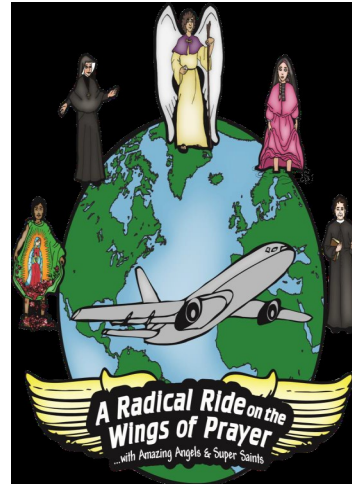

JUNE 27 — THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Reading I: Wisdom 1: 13-15; 2: 23-24

God did not make death, nor does he rejoice in the destruction of the living. For he fashioned all things that they might have being; and the creatures of the world are wholesome, and there is not a destructive drug among them nor any domain of the netherworld on earth, for justice is undying. For God formed man to be imperishable; the image of his own nature he made him. But by the envy of the devil, death entered the world, and they who belong to his company experience it.

Reading II: 2 Corinthians 8: 7, 9, 13-15

Brothers and sisters: As you excel in every respect, in faith, discourse, knowledge, all earnestness, and in the love we have for you, may you excel in this gracious act also. For you know the gracious act of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, for your sake he became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich. Not that others should have relief while you are burdened, but that as a matter of equality your abundance at the present time should supply their needs, so that their abundance may also supply your needs, that there may be equality. As it is written: *Whoever had much did not have more, and whoever had little did not have less.*

Gospel: Mark 4: 35-41

When Jesus had crossed again in the boat to the other side, a large crowd gathered around him, and he stayed close to the sea. One of the synagogue officials, named Jairus, came forward. Seeing him he fell at his feet and pleaded earnestly with him, saying, "My daughter is at the point of death. Please, come lay your hands on her that she may get well and live." He went off with him, and a large crowd followed him and pressed upon him. There was a woman afflicted with hemorrhages for twelve years. She had suffered greatly at the hands of many doctors and had spent all that she had. Yet she was not helped but only grew worse. She had heard about Jesus and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his cloak. She said, "If I but touch his clothes, I shall be cured." Immediately her flow of blood dried up. She felt in her body that she was healed of her affliction. Jesus, aware at once that power had gone out from him, turned around in the crowd and asked, "Who has touched my clothes?" But his disciples said to Jesus, "You see how the crowd is pressing upon you, and yet you ask, 'Who touched me?'" And he looked around to see who had done it. The woman, realizing what had happened to her, approached in fear and trembling. She fell down before Jesus and told him the whole truth. He said to her, "Daughter, your faith has saved you. Go in peace and be cured of your affliction." While he was still speaking, people from the synagogue official's house arrived and said, "Your daughter has died; why trouble the teacher any longer?" Disregarding the message that was reported, Jesus said to the synagogue official, "Do not be afraid; just have faith." He did not allow anyone to accompany him inside except Peter, James, and John, the brother of James. When they arrived at the house of the synagogue official, he caught sight of a commotion, people weeping and wailing loudly. So he went in and said to them, "Why this commotion and weeping? The child is not dead but asleep." And they ridiculed him. Then he put them all out. He took along the child's father and mother and those who were with him and entered the room where the child was. He took the child by the hand and said to her, "*Talitha koum*," which means, "Little girl, I say to you, arise!" The girl, a child of twelve, arose immediately and walked around. At that they were utterly astounded. He gave strict orders that no one should know this and said that she should be given something to eat.

Reading II: 2 Corinthians 8: 7, 9, 13-15

You are not expected to become beggars, but you are asked to share your surplus wealth, however little that might be. Jerusalem needs your material help.

The Gospel: Mark 5: 21-43, or 5: 21-24, 35b-43
