



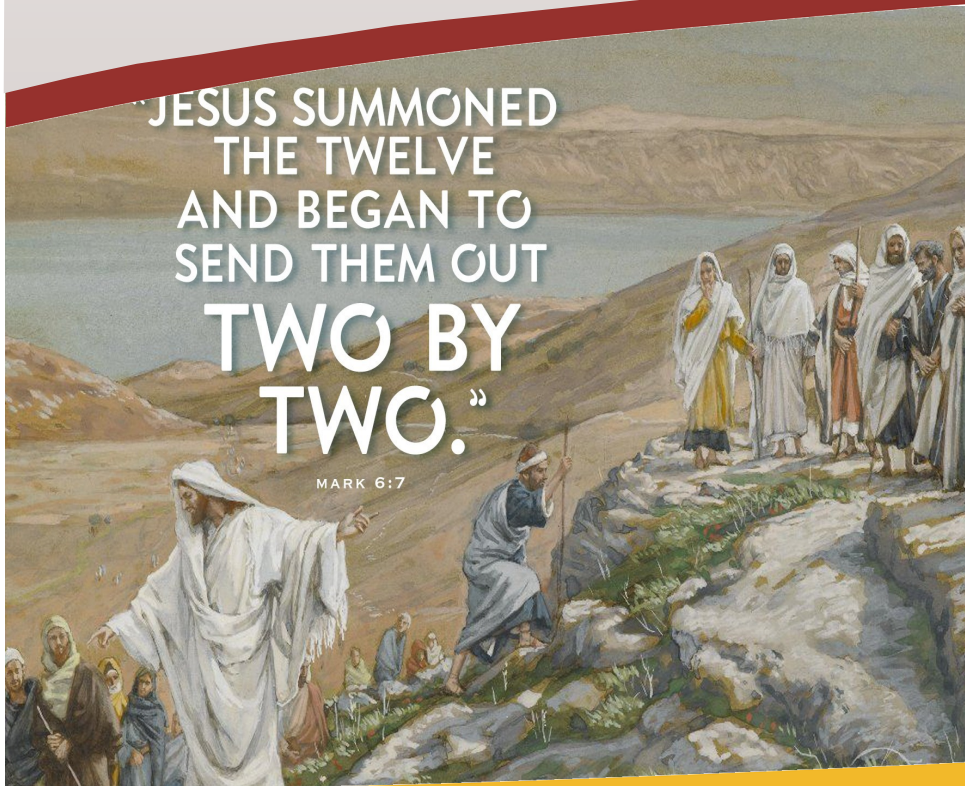

Pope Benedict and Summer Vacation

Below is an article from a few years ago with remarks from Pope Emeritus Benedict on Summer while he was still Pope. While it is not a recent article...it is still a good reminder to us about the opportunity we have to come closer to the Lord during the months of Summer which tend to be a bit less busy. And, of course, it is important to remember that when we go on vacation, we certainly don't or shouldn't go on vacation from Jesus.

(from Zenit.org) Benedict XVI is underlining the importance of using summer vacation and times of rest from work to grow closer to God and reflect on his Word. The Pope stated this in an address before praying the midday Angelus together with those gathered in the courtyard of the papal summer residence in Castel Gandolfo. "We are already in the heart of the summer, at least in the northern hemisphere," he noted. "This is the time in which the schools are closed and in which most vacations are concentrated."

"Even the pastoral activities of the parishes are reduced, and I myself have suspended audiences for a period," the Pontiff said. He continued, "It is therefore a favorable moment to give first place to what is effectively the most important thing in life, that is to say, listening to the Word of God."

The Holy Father spoke about the visit of Jesus to Martha and Mary. He observed that "after Jesus is accommodated, Mary sits at his feet and listens to him, while Martha is completely absorbed with much serving, which is certainly due to the exceptional guest. One sister is very busy and the other is enraptured by the presence of the Master and his words," Benedict XVI added. He noted that Christ reminds Martha of "the one thing that is truly necessary, "that is, "listening to the Word of the Lord." "Everything else will pass and will be taken away from us, but the Word of God is eternal and gives meaning to our daily activity," the Pope affirmed.

He noted that "this Gospel passage is very important at vacation time, because it recalls the fact that the human person must work, must involve himself in domestic and professional concerns, to be sure, but he has need of God before all else, who is the interior light of love and truth." The Pontiff continued: "Without love, even the most important activities lose value and do not bring joy. Without a profound meaning, everything we do is reduced to sterile and disordered activism." The Holy Father concluded, "So let us learn to help each other, to cooperate, but first of all to choose together the better part, which is and will always be our greater good."

To apply, you must call FEMA, there is no online application. The person applying must be the individual who incurred the funeral expense for the deceased. Please understand that FEMA will NOT speak to any businesses like funeral homes or cemeteries.

No ONLINE APPLICATIONS ACCEPTED

FEMA asks that you have all documentation in hand before calling. This will speed up the process.

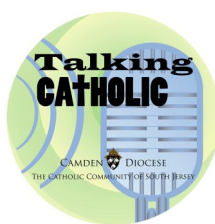
REDISCOVER THE LOVE IN YOUR MARRIAGE

JULY 11 — FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Reading I: Amos 7: 12-15

Amaziah, priest of Bethel, said to Amos, "Off with you, visionary, flee to the land of Judah! There earn your bread by prophesying, but never again prophesy in Bethel; for it is the king's sanctuary and a royal temple." Amos answered Amaziah, "I was no prophet, nor have I belonged to a company of prophets; I was a shepherd and a dresser of sycamores. In all wisdom and insight, he has made known to us the mystery of his will in accord with his favor that he set forth in him as a plan for the fullness of times, to sum up all things in Christ, in heaven and on earth. In him we were also chosen, destined in accord with the purpose of the One who accomplishes all things according to the intention of his will, so that we might exist for the praise of his glory, we who first hoped in Christ. In him you also, who have heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and have believed in him, were sealed with the promised holy Spirit, which is the first installment of our inheritance toward redemption as God's possession, to the praise of his glory.

In all wisdom and insight, he has made known to us the mystery of his will in accord with his favor that he set forth in him as a plan for the fullness of times, to sum up all things in Christ, in heaven and on earth.

Gospel: Mark 6: 7-13

Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two and gave them authority over unclean spirits. He instructed them to take nothing for the journey but a walking stick— no food, no sack, no money in their belts. They were, however, to wear sandals but not a second tunic. He said to them, "Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave. Whatever place does not welcome you or listen to you, leave there and shake the dust off your feet in testimony against them." So they went off and preached repentance. The Twelve drove out many demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.

Reading I: Amos 7: 12-15

READINGS FOR THE WEEK

Amaziah banishes Amos from Israel to Judah, where he is to carry out his unexpected calling. Amos avows that he is not one of the so-called "prophets for hire," but instead has a calling to preach from Yahweh.

Reading II: Ephesians 1: 3-14, or 1: 3-10

St. Paul blesses God the Father for calling upon him with a spirit of adoption as added motivation. Paul asserts that it is by our baptism that we are incorporated to the death and resurrection of Christ and also been redeemed.

The Gospel: Mark 6: 7-13

St. Mark presents Jesus' commissioning of the apostles as a matter of extending His own ministry of teaching and healing. Material comfort is not a component of the work, nor is over confidence. Trust in God is paramount for the great work of their calling. 9:18-26
