

Freedom, Truth, and Culture

"We have no government armed with power capable of contending with human passions unbridled by morality and religion. Avarice, ambition, revenge or gallantry would break the strongest cords of our Constitution as a whale goes through a net. Our Constitution is designed only for a moral and religious people. It is wholly inadequate for any other."

John Adams (1735-1826), Second President of the United States

I came across this quote and I thought it to be very powerful. John Adams makes the same point in a secular way that Saint John Paul II made many times in his theological writings. Essentially the point is this: the freedom that democracy brings is not unlimited and will unravel into decadence unless freedom is bound to truth and morality. Saint John Paul II, in his first encyclical *Redemptor Hominis* (1979) quoted the words of Christ, "You will know the truth, and the truth will make you free." He then stated: "These words contain both a fundamental requirement and a warning: the requirement of an honest relationship with regard to truth as a condition for authentic freedom, and the warning to avoid every kind of illusory freedom, every superficial unilateral freedom, every freedom that fails to enter into the whole truth about man and the world." Lord Acton (1834–1902), (a Catholic member of the House of Commons who was denied entrance to Cambridge University because he was Catholic) stated it this way, "[freedom] is not the power of doing what we like, but the right of being able to do what we ought."

This concept also includes the promulgation of law. In the encyclical letter *Vertatis Splentor* (1993) Saint John Paul II wrote, "Law must therefore be considered an expression of divine wisdom: by submitting to the law, freedom submits to the truth of creation. Consequently one must acknowledge in the freedom of the human person the image and the nearness of God, who is present in all (cf. Eph 4:6). But one must likewise acknowledge the majesty of the God of the universe and revere the holiness of the law of God, who is infinitely transcendent."

Later, while commending democracy for the freedom that it brings, Saint John Paul II also expressed concern about the danger posed by unbridled democracy, "Nowadays there is a tendency to claim that agnosticism and skeptical relativism are the philosophy and the basic attitude which correspond to democratic forms of political life. Those who are convinced that they know the truth and firmly adhere to it are considered unreliable from a democratic point of view, since they do not accept that truth is determined by the majority or that it is subject to variation according to different political trends." Centesimus Annus (1991) Once again the Holy Father makes the connection between freedom and truth. It is important for all of us who are members of this great democratic country to understand the value and power of culture as the driving force behind the success or failure of a society. Truth does come from God and it is universal and objective and given to us for our own good; it is not subject to our whims or desires. A culture that is free yet bound to the truth that comes from God can drive market forces, legislation, politics, international relations, and all other societal actions in a way that offers the greatest benefit to all. On the other hand, a culture that is not bound to truth will be in a constant state of contention as rival factions seek to win power over each other, ultimately resulting in a society that is weak morally and socially and politically; a society that cannot last. Sadly, I think we can see the beginning of this right now.

Our role in promoting the well being of our society is both to seek and promote leaders who embrace and uphold the truth that comes from God, and as citizens we must be the moral and religious people about whom President Adams spoke. In this way we ensure a strong future for our country and can become the true world leader, not in power of arms or in power of economy, but in the power of truth and the power of the love of God. Let's start before it's too late.

JULY 18 — SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Reading I: Jeremiah 23: 1-6

Woe to the shepherds who mislead and scatter the flock of my pasture, says the LORD. Therefore, thus says the LORD, the God of Israel, against the shepherds who shepherd my people: You have scattered my sheep and driven them away. You have not cared for them, but I will take care to punish your evil deeds. I myself will gather the remnant of my flock from all the lands to which I have driven them and bring them back to their meadow; there they shall increase and multiply. I will appoint shepherds for them who will shepherd them so that they need no longer fear and tremble; and none shall be missing, says the LORD.

Behold, the days are coming, says the LORD, when I will raise up a righteous shoot to David; as king he shall reign and govern wisely, he shall do what is just and right in the land.

In his days Judah shall be saved,
Israel shall dwell in security.

This is the name they give him: "The LORD our justice."

Reading II: Ephesians 2: 13-18

Brothers and sisters: In Christ Jesus you who once were far off have become near by the blood of Christ. For he is our peace, he who made both one and broke down the dividing wall of enmity, through his flesh, abolishing the law with its commandments and legal claims, that he might create in himself one new person in place of the two, thus establishing peace, and might reconcile both with God, in one body, through the cross, putting that enmity to death by it. He came and preached peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near, for through him we both have access in one Spirit to the Father.

Gospel: Mark 6: 30-34

The apostles gathered together with Jesus and reported all they had done and taught. He said to them, "Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while." People were coming and going in great numbers, and they had no opportunity even to eat. So they went off in the boat by themselves to a deserted place. People saw them leaving and many came to know about it. They hastened there on foot from all the towns and arrived at the place before them. When he disembarked and saw the vast crowd, his heart was moved with pity for them, for they were like sheep without a shepherd; and he began to teach them many things.

READINGS FOR THE WEEK

The passage tells readers about the future king of Israel and Judah, who will be a "righteous shoot of David." The former kings were bad actors, and misleading shepherds of the people.

Reading II: Ephesians 2: 13-18

Jesus' blood has made Him the agent of peace between both Jews and Gentiles and the same between God and humanity. He has created one new person out of the two.

The Gospel: Mark 6: 30-34

This scene comes right before the feeding of the 5,000. The disciples participate in Christ's work; then we learn His followers are in "great numbers;" and finally of His compassion for the needy crowd.
