

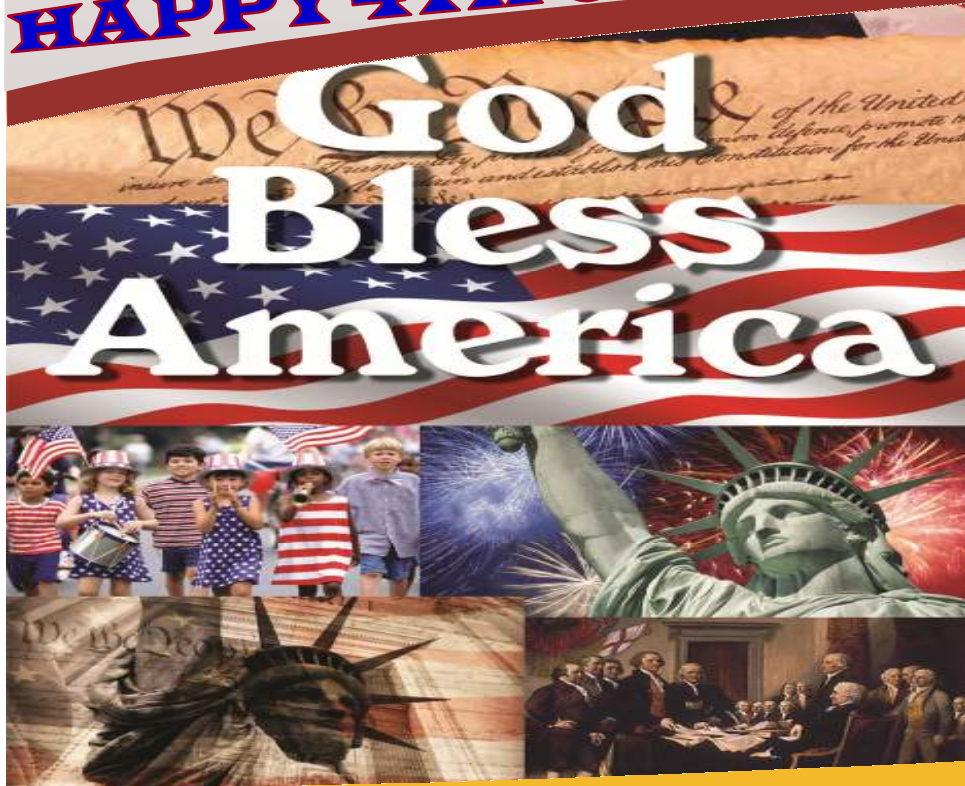

Eucharistic Coherence

There has been a lot of talk and friction recently in both Catholic and secular circles about the proposed US Bishop's document on Eucharistic Coherence. Much of it coming from two areas. One between a group of pro-abortion Democrats and the US bishops, the former writing a three-page letter called a "statement of principles" directed to the bishops after they voted to begin the process of crafting a document related to communion and public life. The letter stated among other things, "The Sacrament of Holy Communion is central to the life of practicing Catholics, and the weaponization of the Eucharist to Democratic lawmakers for their support of abortion is contradictory." Some of the members also took to social media with pro-abortion Congressman Ted Lieu stating on Twitter, "Next time I go to Church, I dare you to deny me Communion." And another Congressman suggested the church should lose its tax-exempt status.

The other area of friction is between the US bishops themselves. Some wanting a more, dare I say, coherent presentation of the Holy Eucharist, and some who think such a document isn't necessary, especially if there are provisions in it that might seem to restrict public figures from receiving the Holy Eucharist.

Before we look at either of those, let's look at the proposed outline of the document. The working draft by the conference's doctrinal committee includes three sections: The first part would treat the nature of the Eucharist as the Real Presence of Jesus Christ, and a sacrament of sacrifice and healing. (Recall that in a recent Pew Research poll on 43% of Catholics believe that the Holy Eucharist, as is taught by Divine Revelation and the church, is truly the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Christ). The second section would focus on the celebration of the Eucharistic Sacrifice — The Mass — under the subheadings of "unity, beauty, and identity." The third part of the proposed document would discuss the Eucharist as "a mystery to be lived," under the headings of "moral transformation," "Eucharistic consistency," and "missionary discipleship."

As you can see, the vast majority of the proposed document is designed to help Catholics understand and appreciate the greatest gift ever, Jesus Christ in the Most Holy Eucharist. I don't have any insight as to what the "Eucharistic consistency" part will entail, but I am pretty sure it will clearly repeat the understanding first outlined by Saint Paul that one may only approach the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist worthily. This isn't something new, of course, that Catholics who are not in the state of grace due to mortal sin, or those who publicly deny the faith, or who publicly promote and/or advocate a moral evil should not present themselves for Holy Communion. And if they do so unworthily, as Saint Paul states in the First Letter to the Corinthians, "Therefore whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily will have to answer for the body and blood of the Lord. A person should examine himself, and so eat the bread and drink the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body, eats and drinks judgment on himself."

Maybe the foggy of Church teaching over the past few generations that has led to such a lack of faith and understanding in the Holy Eucharist has also advanced the notion that everyone should receive it no matter what. And maybe the thought of having to confront and finally acknowledge the true and actual contradiction that "Catholic" pro-abortion politicians face by advocating such an evil as abortion is making them uneasy, as it should.

So maybe a little Eucharistic Coherence isn't such a bad thing at all!

To apply, you must call FEMA, there is no online application. The person applying must be the individual who incurred the funeral expense for the deceased. Please understand that FEMA will NOT speak to any businesses like funeral homes or cemeteries.

NO ONLINE APPLICATIONS ACCEPTED

FEMA asks that you have all documentation in hand before calling. This will speed up the process.

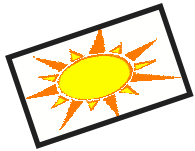

Joseph's HOUSE is a homeless shelter for men and women located in the city of Camden.

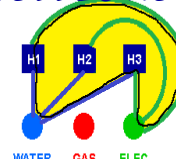
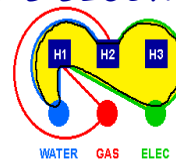

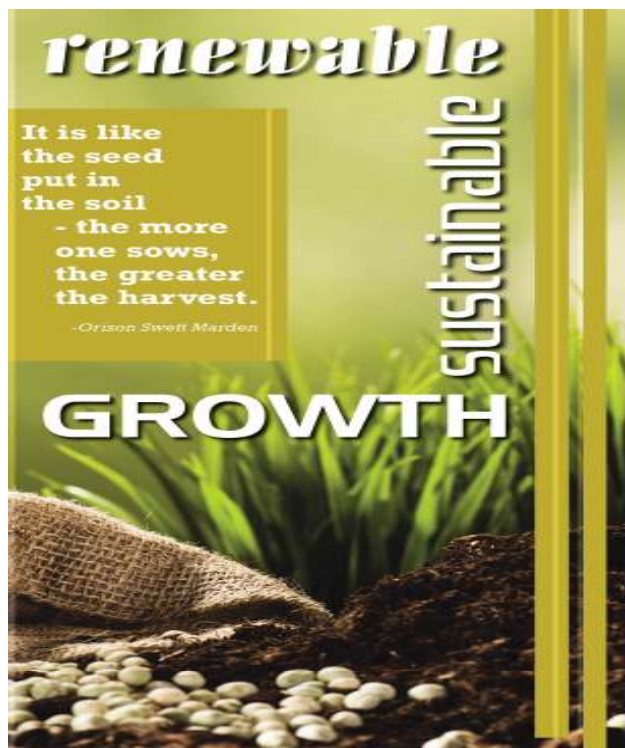

JULY 4 — FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Reading I: Ezekiel 2: 2-5

As the LORD spoke to me, the spirit entered into me and set me on my feet, and I heard the one who was speaking say to me: Son of man, I am sending you to the Israelites, rebels who have rebelled against me; they and their ancestors have revolted against me to this very day. Hard of face and obstinate of heart are they to whom I am sending you. But you shall say to them: Thus says the LORD GOD! And whether they heed or resist—for they are a rebellious house—they shall know that a prophet has been among them.

Reading II: 2 Corinthians 12: 7-10

Brothers and sisters: That I, Paul, might not become too elated, because of the abundance of the revelations, a thorn in the flesh was given to me, an angel of Satan, to beat me, to keep me from being too elated. Three times I begged the Lord about this, that it might leave me, but he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." I will rather boast most gladly of my weaknesses, in order that the power of Christ may dwell with me. Therefore, I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and constraints, for the sake of Christ; for when I am weak, then I am strong.

Gospel: Mark 6: 1-6a

Jesus departed from there and came to his native place, accompanied by his disciples. When the sabbath came he began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard him were astonished. They said, "Where did this man get all this? What kind of wisdom has been given him? What mighty deeds are wrought by his hands! Is he not the carpenter, the son of Mary, and the brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon? And are not his sisters here with us?" And they took offense at him. Jesus said to them, "A prophet is not without honor except in his native place and among his own kin and in his own house." So he was not able to perform any mighty deed there, apart from curing a few sick people by laying his hands on them. He was amazed at their lack of faith.

READINGS FOR THE WEEK

Reading I: Ezekiel 2: 2-5

God charges Ezekiel with a mission to speak the Word to a people so hardened in disobedience that they will not listen. Worse, they will oppose him. Still Ezekiel must proclaim the sacred Word.

Reading II: 2 Corinthians 12: 7-10

St. Paul speaks of a "thorn" in his flesh, given him to keep him grounded despite the many revelations given him. He humbly boasts of his weaknesses because they show Christ's power at work in him.

The Gospel: Mark 6: 1-6a

Here we have Jesus rejected even by His own people. That had to sting. Scholars tell us that when the people called Him "the Son of Mary" that could have been an insult, because in those days Jews were usually known by their father's name, in "Son of Joseph."
