PREACH THE GOSPEL ALWAYS: AND USE YOUR WORDS!

Here is a great article about our need to give witness to Christ by both our actions and our deeds. God bless you, Father Joseph Byerley

(from Catholic online) - Legend has it that St. Francis of Assisi once said, "Preach the Gospel always, and when necessary, use words." I have heard this phrase often repeated by lay Catholics and Priests alike, with the honorable purpose of exhorting the faithful to live lives that embody the Gospel message as an example to the non-Catholic world.

The assumption is that by radically living the Gospel message, the secular and pagan world will see that we Catholics are different, that we live by a higher standard of self-denial and selfless love and service to others. We don't even need to say anything, or even, dare I say, preach the Word with our mouths. People will see the Gospel of Christ in the way we live, and thus they will be evangelized by our example.

It is a wonderful sentiment, but how many of us, honestly, live our lives so differently than our neighbors that we preach the Gospel merely by our actions? Most of us go to work, live in a dwelling like everyone else, take care of our families, smile and wave at our neighbors, and go on with our private lives.

The point isn't that we all need to give up our homes, don hair shirts and go around as mendicant preachers. The point, however, is that too many of us nod with easy satisfaction when on Sunday the priest repeats the words of St. Francis. Yes, we can meet our Catholic obligation to preach the Gospel simply by living our lives! No need to talk about our Catholic faith with non-Catholics. No need to explain or defend our doctrines. No need to actually try and . . . dare I say, convert our non-Catholic friends by using our speech.

I wasn't Catholic growing up, but I was surrounded by Catholic friends and neighbors, and it didn't make any difference in my life. These friendly, nice Catholics never talked to me about their faith. The only Christians who ever tried to convert me were non-denominational evangelical Christians. In fact, in my entire life, not one Catholic ever overtly (that I can remember) talked to me about their faith with the intention of trying to bring me on over to their side. Never. Isn't that strange?

Are we, therefore, living as true Catholics if we fail to preach the Gospel to non-Catholics? Are we, perhaps, using the words of St. Francis as a cop-out, so we don't have to talk about our faith?

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "It is from God's love for all men that the Church in every age receives both the obligation and the vigor of her missionary dynamism. . God wills the salvation of everyone through the knowledge of the truth. Salvation is found in truth. . .But the Church, to whom this truth is entrusted, must go out to meet their desire, so as to bring them the truth. Because she believes in God's universal plan of salvation, the Church must be missionary." (See CCC para. 851)

This means more than volunteering at your local soup kitchen, and it means more than raising your family in the faith. It means actively engaging the non-Catholic world with evangelical intent. How many times in the last six months have you tried to evangelize anyone? How many times have you talked about how awesome it is to be Catholic?

How many times have you discussed the beautiful doctrines of the Church and why they make so much more sense than our materialistic, sex-drenched pagan culture? How many times have you defended the faith against specious and stereotypical accusations? How many times have your preached the Gospel, with your mouth?

But here's the thing: preaching the Gospel is risky. It opens us up to criticism. We might lose friends. People might think we're religious fanatics. We probably won't win any popularity contests. We can't, however, be afraid. The worst thing we can do is NOT preach the Gospel because we're worried what other people will think about us.

How many Christian martyrs, including nearly all of the original apostles and the early Popes, were killed for preaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ? What witness do we give to their sacrifice by being afraid that our neighbor might not wave to us anymore if we are seen trying to evangelize? We are not living our Catholic faith if we fail to evangelize out of timidity and cowardice.

I love the sentiment behind St. Francis' words. If only we all could live the Gospel so radically that others only had to look at us to see that we were Catholic, and that it was an admirable and beautiful way to live. Until that happens, however, it would be a better thing if we all practiced a little preaching, with our voice.

Being Catholic requires us all to be evangelical. There is no such thing as a private Catholic. Christ wasn't private. He didn't ask us to preach the Gospel, if we felt like it, or if we were comfortable talking to strangers. He told us, commanded us, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations." It wasn't a request. So let's do what St. Francis said. Let's preach the Gospel always, and let's use our words.





CREMATION AND PROPER HANDLING OF CREMATED REMAIN

While you may have chosen to be cremated, remember to choose your final resting place. Although the Church earnestly recommends the pious custom of burying the bodies of the dead be observed, it does not however, forbid cremation unless it has been chosen for reasons which are contrary to Christian teaching.

Cremated remains are the body of the deceased in a changed form. We should honor them as we honor the body. They must be reverently buried or entombed in a place reserved for the burial of the dead. When choosing cremation, there are many choices available including:

AUGUST 1 — EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Reading I: Exodus 16: 2-4, 12-15

The whole Israelite community grumbled against Moses and Aaron. The Israelites said to them, "Would that we had died at the LORD's hand in the land of Egypt, as we sat by our fleshpots and ate our fill of bread! But you had to lead us into this desert to make the whole community die of famine!" Then the LORD said to Moses, "I will now rain down bread from heaven for you. Each day the people are to go out and gather their daily portion; thus will I test them, to see whether they follow my instructions or not. "I have heard the grumbling of the Israelites. Tell them: In the evening twilight you shall eat flesh, and in the morning you shall have your fill of bread, so that you may know that I, the LORD, am your God." In the evening quail came up and covered the camp. In the morning a dew lay all about the camp, and when the dew evaporated, there on the surface of the desert were fine flakes like hoarfrost on the ground. On seeing it, the Israelites asked one another, "What is this?" for they did not know what it was. But Moses told them, "This is the bread that the LORD has given you to eat."

Reading II: Ephesians 4: 17, 20-24

Brothers and sisters: I declare and testify in the Lord that you must no longer live as the Gentiles do, in the futility of their minds; that is not how you learned Christ, assuming that you have heard of him and were taught in him, as truth is in Jesus, that you should put away the old self of your former way of life, corrupted through deceitful desires, and be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and put on the new self, created in God's way in righteousness and holiness of truth.

Gospel: John 6: 24-35

When the crowd saw that neither Jesus nor his disciples were there, they themselves got into boats and came to Capernaum looking for Jesus. And when they found him across the sea they said to him. "Rabbi, when did you get here?" Jesus answered them and said, "Amen, amen, I say to you, you are looking for me not because you saw signs but because you ate the loaves and were filled. Do not work for food that perishes but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For on him the Father, God, has set his seal." So they said to him, "What can we do to accomplish the works of God?" Jesus answered and said to them, "This is the work of God, that you believe in the one he sent." So they said to him, "What sign can you do, that we may see and believe in you? What can you do? Our ancestors ate manna in the desert, as it is written: He gave them bread from heaven to eat." So Jesus said to them, "Amen, amen, I say to you, it was not Moses who gave the bread from heaven; my Father gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world." So they said to him, "Sir, give us this bread always." Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst."

READINGS FOR THE WEEK

Reading I: Exodus 16: 2-4, 12-15

Reacting to the people's complaint, Yahweh provides prompt relief by sending the manna and the quail. The manna, for St. John, is a "type" of the Holy Eucharist.

Reading II: Ephesians 4: 17, 20-24

The "old man" for Paul represents the convert's life led only with mere human resources to go by leading to weakness and sin. The new life, "put on" at Baptism is an actual incorporation into Christ.

The Gospel: John 6: 24-35

Jesus instructs the crowd that has followed Him on the nature of the true bread from heaven, which is Christ Himself. This Bread alone gives a person true life.
