

SAY NO TO TAXPAYER FUNDED ABORTION!

I was going to write today on the beautiful topic of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. But we received some disturbing news about some recent votes in Congress, that, as horrible as they are, need to be addressed. So, I have a question for you. Do you want your money, given to the federal government in the form of your taxes, to be spent to fund the murder of innocent children through elective abortion? This past week, members of the U.S. House of Representatives cast three key votes against the Hyde Amendment and other critical pro-life protections.

On Wednesday, the House voted 217 to 212 to pass H.R. 4373, the State, Foreign Operations, and Related Programs (SFOPs) appropriations bill. H.R. 4373 expands taxpayer funding of abortion by excluding the Helms Amendment, which prohibits federal funding of abortion as part of foreign assistance.

Then on Thursday, the House rejected a "motion to recommit" that would have restored the Hyde Amendment and other longstanding pro-life policies to H.R. 4502, another package of appropriations bills. The motion to restore pro-life protections failed by a vote of 208 – 217.

Also on Thursday, the House voted 219 to 208 to pass H.R. 4502 without the 46-year-old Hyde Amendment and other longstanding, bipartisan provisions like the Weldon Amendment.

Eliminating these provisions would force taxpayers to pay for elective abortions and would have the effect of forcing health care providers and professionals to perform and refer for abortion against their deeply-held beliefs, as well as forcing employers and insurers to cover and pay for abortion.

With the exception of three Democrats who voted against H.R. 4373 for reasons unrelated to the Helms Amendment, all House Democrats present rejected the addition of pro-life protections and voted to advance the appropriations bills without the Hyde Amendment, Helms Amendment, and other pro-life protections included.

These two pieces of legislation now advance to the Senate for further consideration. We expect that the Senate Appropriations Committee will hold markups on several of their own draft appropriations bills before any bills go to the Senate floor.

In light of these developments, I strongly encourage you to:



CREMATION AND PROPER HANDLING OF CREMATED REMAIN

While you may have chosen to be cremated, remember to choose your final resting place. Although the Church earnestly recommends the pious custom of burying the bodies of the dead be observed, it does not however, forbid

cremation unless it has been chosen for reasons which are contrary to Christian teaching.

Cremated remains are the body of the deceased in a changed form. We should honor them as we honor the body. They must be reverently buried or entombed in a place reserved for the burial of the dead. When choosing cremation, there are many choices available including:







AUGUST 15 — FEAST OF THE ASSUMPTION

Reading I: Revelation 11: 19A; 12: 1-6a, 10ab

God's temple in heaven was opened, and the ark of his covenant could be seen in the temple. A great sign appeared in the sky, a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars. She was with child and wailed aloud in pain as she labored to give birth. Then another sign appeared in the sky; it was a huge red dragon, with seven heads and ten horns, and on its heads were seven diadems. Its tail swept away a third of the stars in the sky and hurled them down to the earth. Then the dragon stood before the woman about to give birth, to devour her child when she gave birth. She gave birth to a son, a male child, destined to rule all the nations with an iron rod. Her child was caught up to God and his throne. The woman herself fled into the desert where she had a place prepared by God. Then I heard a loud voice in heaven say: "Now have salvation and power come, and the Kingdom of our God and the authority of his Anointed One."

Reading II: I Corinthians 15: 20-27

Brothers and sisters: Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. For since death came through man, the resurrection of the dead came also through man. For just as in Adam all die, so too in Christ shall all be brought to life, but each one in proper order. Christ the firstfruits; then, at his coming, those who belong to Christ; then comes the end, when he hands over the Kingdom to his God and Father, when he has destroyed every sovereignty and every authority and power. For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. The last enemy to be destroyed is death, for "he subjected everything under his feet."

Gospel: Luke 1: 39-56

Mary set out and traveled to the hill country in haste to a town of Judah, where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the infant leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth, filled with the Holy Spirit, cried out in a loud voice and said, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And how does this happen to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? For at the moment the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the infant in my womb leaped for joy. Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled."

And Mary said:

"My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my Savior for he has looked with favor on his lowly servant. From this day all generations will call me blessed: The Almighty has done great things for me and holy is his Name. He has mercy on those who fear him in every generation. He has shown the strength of his arm, and has scattered the proud in their conceit. He has cast down the mighty from their thrones, and has lifted up the lowly. He has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent away empty. He has come to the help of his servant Israel for he has remembered his promise of mercy, the promise he made to our fathers, to Abraham and his children forever."

Mary remained with her about three months and then returned to her home.

READINGS FOR THE WEEK

Reading I: Revelation 11: 19A; 12: 1-6a, 10ab

The opening of the Temple expresses an extraordinary self-revelation of God. The woman in this vision our Church takes to be the Virgin Mary. She boldly faces the red dragon, the symbol of chaos. Salvation comes through Christ her Son.

Reading II: I Corinthians 15: 20-27

Paul offers a thesis: at the end of time when everyone ever created will rise from the dead, along with "those who belong to Christ." We know and believe that Our Lady belonged to Christ.

The Gospel: Luke 1: 39-56

Elizabeth and Mary pronounce the meaning of Jesus in God's plan of salvation. Mary offers her great prayer of praise, the "Magnificat." Her prayer is an integral part of the Liturgy of the Hours as Evening Prayer.
