

Summer Musings


There is a story of a saintly priest from long ago who had a problem with one of his devout parishioners who attended daily Mass but left immediately after Communion. He solved the problem by ordering two altar boys with lighted candles to walk on either side of the man as soon as he started to leave the church and accompany him all the way to his carriage (pre automobile days). When, after three days repeating this action, the somewhat flustered and embarrassed gentleman asked the priest for an explanation, he was told that since Christ was still present in him as he left the church, his presence had to be honored by lighted candles. Needless to say, the man didn't leave Mass early again.

I wonder sometime if we, including us priests, remain sufficiently aware of this truth as Mass comes to conclusion. I really don't know what to say to those who regularly come to Mass late or leave Mass early. Just the same as that I don't know what to say to those who come to worship God at Mass in shorts and tee shirts and flip flops. To a certain extent, it's one of those things you either "get" or you don't. There is very little a priest can say to people who leave Mass early, come late, or dress inappropriately. Saying anything, no matter how well thought out, or kind, or gentle, or anything usually comes off very badly. At the same time, I feel I do have a responsibility before God, to encourage and instruct the people entrusted to me by Him. One look at the letters of Saint Paul to his people, his parishioners if you like, and anything I would say or have said would seem pretty tame. After all, he used to call his people "foolish", "backsliders", "ignorant", etc. I wouldn't dare say that to you. Good thing, of course, since I am not Saint Paul!

However, it is quite distressing to observe the near disrespect we can sometimes have for the Lord at Mass. While it is generally unintended and unconscious, it is often the case that we dress for the beach or the gym when we come to worship Almighty God. And before and after Mass in Church we can often talk about everything but the Lord, as if the Church were some kind of community center. We can also regularly arrive late or leave early, never giving ourselves time to either spiritually prepare for Mass nor to thank the Lord for coming into our hearts. Of course, on any given day, because of some unusual circumstance, we might not be the best dressed, be a bit late or need to leave a bit early. I'm sure the Lord understands these moments. But if it is the norm, then we really need to think about why it is, and challenge ourselves to do better.

The Mass is the one of the greatest things in which we can participate. For at Mass, we enter into the one saving sacrifice of Jesus Christ to the Father on our behalf. It is the celebration of our salvation. We are inserted into this eternal event and are united with Christ. There is nothing on earth that is more profound or important than the Mass. I know we all believe this and I hope we always do everything we can to keep conscious of that each time we come to Mass and show our consciousness externally by our dress, our behavior during and after, and how and when we arrive and depart. For all of these things together will have a great impact on both our subjective experience of Mass as well as the objective spiritual benefit we receive. In the end, if we believe worship of God at Mass is important and act as if it is important to us then very likely, it will become as important to us as it really is.



CREMATION AND PROPER HANDLING OF CREMATED REMAIN

While you may have chosen to be cremated, remember to choose your final resting place. Although the Church earnestly recommends the pious custom of burying the bodies of the dead be observed, it does not however, forbid

cremation unless it has been chosen for reasons which are contrary to Christian teaching.

Cremated remains are the body of the deceased in a changed form. We should honor them as we honor the body. They must be reverently buried or entombed in a place reserved for the burial of the dead. When choosing cremation, there are many choices available including:

Ground Burial † Granite or Glass Niches † Crypts † Addition to Family Lot or Crypt





AUGUST 22 — TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Reading I: Joshua 24: 1-2a, 15-17, 18b

Joshua gathered together all the tribes of Israel at Shechem, summoning their elders, their leaders, their judges, and their officers. When they stood in ranks before God, Joshua addressed all the people: "If it does not please you to serve the LORD, decide today whom you will serve, the gods your fathers served beyond the River or the gods of the Amorites in whose country you are now dwelling. As for me and my household, we will serve the LORD." But the people answered, "Far be it from us to forsake the LORD for the service of other gods. For it was the LORD, our God, who brought us and our fathers up out of the land of Egypt, out of a state of slavery. He performed those great miracles before our very eyes and protected us along our entire journey and among the peoples through whom we passed. Therefore we also will serve the LORD, for he is our God."

Reading II: Ephesians 5: 21-32a, or 5:2a, 25-32

Brothers and sisters: Be subordinate to one another out of reverence for Christ. Wives should be subordinate to their husbands as to the Lord. For the husband is head of his wife just as Christ is head of the church, he himself the savior of the body. As the church is subordinate to Christ, so wives should be subordinate to their husbands in everything. Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ loved the church and handed himself over for her to sanctify her, cleansing her by the bath of water with the word, that he might present to himself the church in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish. So also husbands should love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. For no one hates his own flesh but rather nourishes and cherishes it, even as Christ does the church, because we are members of his body.

For this reason a man shall leave his father and his mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh.

This is a great mystery, but I speak in reference to Christ and the church. OR: Ephesians 5:2a, 25-32

Brothers and sisters: Live in love, as Christ loved us. Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ loved the church and handed himself over for her to sanctify her, cleansing her by the bath of water with the word, that he might present to himself the church in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish. So also husbands should love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. For no one hates his own flesh but rather nourishes and cherishes it, even as Christ does the church, because we are members of his body.

For this reason a man shall leave his father and his mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh.

This is a great mystery, but I speak in reference to Christ and the church.

Gospel: John 6: 60-69

Many of Jesus' disciples who were listening said, "This saying is hard; who can accept it?" Since Jesus knew that his disciples were murmuring about this, he said to them, "Does this shock you? What if you were to see the Son of Man ascending to where he was before? It is the spirit that gives life, while the flesh is of no avail. The words I have spoken to you are Spirit and life. But there are some of you who do not believe." Jesus knew from the beginning the ones who would not believe and the one who would betray him. And he said, "For this reason I have told you that no one can come to me unless it is granted him by my Father." As a result of this, many of his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him. Jesus then said to the Twelve, "Do you also want to leave?" Simon Peter answered him, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God."

READINGS FOR THE WEEK

Reading I: Joshua 24: 1-2a, 15-17, 18b

The prophet confronts the 12 tribes with the question: will you keep your covenant with Yahweh or not? They agree to stay united in a bond with Yahweh rather than desert Him.

Reading II: Ephesians 5: 21-32a, or 5:2a, 25-32

Paul first presents a code of conduct for a Christian household that includes a hierarchical order from husband on down. Then he presents the notion of Christ's identity with His Church to which He gave His all.

The Gospel: John 6: 60-69

Following on last week's announcement of the Holy Eucharist, this section gives us the crowd's reaction and that of the Twelve. In the latter, St. Peter gives the classic response.
