BACK TO SCHOOL

As we gear up for another academic year, before anything else, I want to wish the best and all God's blessings to all our Holy Angels Parish students and educators in whatever grammar school, high school, or university you are attending or working. I am praying for all of you that you may have a successful and good school year! I am also praying that it will be less stressful and crazy as last year! As you know, from a Catholic perspective, the goal of education is to enable children to learn and develop - intellectually, physically, emotionally, and most of all spiritually - so that they can reach their full God-given human potential to contribute to the common good of society and to deepen their relationship with the Lord, leading to eternal salvation.


I was in Catholic education as a high school teacher at Paul VI High School for six years and I have learned that education plays a critical role in the development of young people. I urge parents to show constant vigilance upon what is going on at the school(s) where their children are present, whether a Catholic school or not. Please talk to your children every day and find out what their teachers are saying in class. Be prepared to offer a response to them when you find that they are "learning" things that go against our faith, as well as affirming the good and true things that they are taught. This is especially important in our current cultural environment where there are many things in the state mandated curriculum for public schools that are contrary to the Gospel and harmful to our children.

Being intimately involved in the education of your children is not just the duty of parents, but also a great opportunity to bring the light of Christ and his love to them. Don't forget - the earlier the involvement starts and more constant it is, the less likely that it will seem intrusive to the children. Also don't forget to attend every possible event in which your children participate. They may not mention it, but you can be sure that your presence means very much to them.

Now, to you wonderful students. You may not know this, but to be honest, I never liked school very much. I was so looking forward to the end of college, thinking that I would never have to go to school again. Well, then I went into the seminary. So, after six years of seminary and two of further studies (that's eight years of school after college!), I didn't seem to get my wish. But along the way, I did learn a lot. One thing I learned along the way that as much as I disliked doing homework and studying, it's really important. I know now, from my own experience and from working with high school students, it's actually much easier to work a little bit all the time and not get behind, than to let things go and then have periods of crazy activity just to throw a bunch of stuff together just to get something in on time. You end up with better grades with less stress. It's a tough lesson to learn but it works. Try it. Have a great year!







Since April, five months ago, parishioners have continued to provide on average 359 sandwiches a month to the overnight residents of Joseph House in Camden.



SEPTEMBER 5 — TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Reading I: Isaiah 35: 4-7a

Thus says the LORD: Say to those whose hearts are frightened: Be strong, fear not! Here is your God, he comes with vindiction; with divine recompense he comes to save you. Then will the eyes of the blind be opened, the ears of the deaf be cleared; then will the lame leap like a stag, then the tongue of the mute will sing. Streams will burst forth in the desert, and rivers in the steppe. The burning sands will become pools, and the thirsty ground, springs of water.

Reading II: James 2: 1-5

My brothers and sisters, show no partiality as you adhere to the faith in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ. For if a man with gold rings and fine clothes comes into your assembly, and a poor person in shabby clothes also comes in, and you pay attention to the one wearing the fine clothes and say, "Sit here, please," while you say to the poor one, "Stand there," or "Sit at my feet," have you not made distinctions among yourselves and become judges with evil designs? Listen, my beloved brothers and sisters. Did not God choose those who are poor in the world to be rich in faith and heirs of the kingdom that he promised to those who love him?

Gospel: Mark 7: 31-37

Again Jesus left the district of Tyre and went by way of Sidon to the Sea of Galilee, into the district of the Decapolis. And people brought to him a deaf man who had a speech impediment and begged him to lay his hand on him. He took him off by himself away from the crowd. He put his finger into the man's ears and, spitting, touched his tongue; then he looked up to heaven and groaned, and said to him, "Ephphatha!"— that is, "Be opened!" — And immediately the man's ears were opened, his speech impediment was removed, and he spoke plainly. He ordered them not to tell anyone. But the more he ordered them not to, the more they proclaimed it. They were exceedingly astonished and they said, "He has done all things well. He makes the deaf hear and the mute speak."

READINGS FOR THE WEEK

Reading I: Isaiah 35: 4-7a

The prophet announces that the age of salvation has arrived. The Southern desert will flower, and physical healing will abound.

Reading II: James 2: 1-5

God's glory should cancel out all taint of partiality in our relationships, such as a person's status or worldly rank. In God's kingdom, both rich and poor are invited to feast heartily.

The Gospel: Mark 7: 31-37

After the miraculous healing, Jesus commands the crowd to be silent about it. He wants them to know that He is more than a healer. The crowd's opinion of Jesus echoes words found in the First Reading today from Isaiah, wherein Christ's activity makes the Kingdom of God present.
