# Twenty Years After 9/11/01

The wounds of the terrorist attacks on our country are still causing pain and suffering even twenty years later, not just from the loss of life experienced on that day and the subsequent suffering of loved ones but also in the significant cost of life in the continuing efforts that we make as a country to stay safe. The solution to terrorism and indeed to all strife is ultimately the establishment of peace not the eradication of the "bad guys" whoever they may be at any given time. Why? Firstly, there will always be "bad guys" in the world and we will never be able to get rid of them all and secondly, who decides who the 'bad guys" are in the first place? Due to the wounded human nature that all of us share, there will always be strife. So the answer is peace. The Second Vatican council talks about peace in this way:

Peace is not the mere absence of war or the simple maintenance of a balance of power between forces, nor can it be imposed at the dictate of absolute power. It is called, rightly and properly, a work of justice. It is the product of order, the order implanted in human society by its divine founder, to be realized in practice as men hunger and thirst for ever more perfect justice.

The common good of the human race is subject to the eternal law as its primary principle, but its requirements in practice keep changing with the passage of time. The result is that peace is never established finally and forever; the building up of peace has to go on all the time. Again, the human will is weak and wounded by sin; the search for peace therefore demands from each individual constant control of the passions, and from legitimate authority untiring vigilance.

Even this is not enough. Peace here on earth cannot be maintained unless the good of the human person is safeguarded, and men are willing to trust each other and share their riches of spirit and talent. If peace is to be established it is absolutely necessary to have a firm determination to respect other persons and peoples and their dignity, and to be zealous in the practice of brotherhood. Peace is therefore the fruit also of love; love goes beyond what justice can achieve. Peace on earth, born of love for one's neighbor, is the sign and the effect of the peace of Christ that flows from God the Father. In his own person the incarnate Son, the Prince of Peace, reconciled all men to God through his death on the cross. In his human nature he destroyed hatred and restored unity to all mankind in one people and one body. Raised on high by the resurrection, he sent the Spirit of love into the hearts of men.

All Christians are thus urgently summoned to live the truth in love, and to join all true peacemakers in prayer and work for peace. Moved by the same spirit, we cannot but praise those who renounce violence in defense of rights, and have recourse to means of defense otherwise available to the less powerful as well, provided that this can be done without injury to the rights and obligations of others or of the community.

Working for peace is to work towards the just order of society that God has laid out for us, seeking the common good, living according to our human nature, doing good and avoiding evil in our lives. It is easy to speak of peace as if we need to go out into the world and "do something". But peace begins first in our hearts with a right relationship with God and then in our relationships with those around us. If we truly seek peace, we will not only look to strive to end war and conflict and injustice in the world at large, but we will also seek establish peace in our daily lives and within our day to day relationships with those directly around us.

Recently you may have found a pamphlet, like the one to the left, on your windshield after Mass on Sunday. Someone has been to both St. Matthew's and St. Patrick's and has come into the parking lot during Mass, and placed these pamphlets on our windshields.

So, why *is* Mary crying? Because probably she read this pamphlet! Joking aside, this pamphlet is one of a number from the infamous Jack Chick, a rabid Anti-Catholic, who thinks the Catholic Church is from the devil and all Catholics are going to hell unless they repent and leave the Catholic faith.

These pamphlets, often called "Chick Tracts", are easy-to-read, illustrated cartoons that contain an endless amount of conspiracy theories, distortions, erroneous assertions, misuse of and problematic interpretation of Sacred Scripture, and complete fabrications regarding the Catholic faith.

If you look at some of Mr. Chick's claims, you can easily see why you shouldn't give a second thought to nor be bothered by these tracks. For instance, Jack Chick in various tracts of his, states that the Catholic Church started the religion of Jehovah's Witnesses, the KKK, Communism, the mafia, the Mormon religion, and the religion of Islam in order to take over the world. Ironically, most of these organizations are as anti-Catholic as Jack Chick. He further claims that the Pope and the Catholic Church are Satan himself in disguise and Catholic Church keeps "the name of every Protestant church member in the world" in a "big computer" in the Vatican for use in future persecutions.

In Why is Mary Crying?, the one that was put on your car, makes the claim that the Catholic Church came into existence around 300 A.D. This is another example of the outlandish claims in these tracts. History shows that there were almost 30 popes before 300 A.D. How could the Catholic Church have begun then in 300?

And, of course, we Catholics do not worship Mary. We worship and adore only Almighty God – Father, Son and Holy Spirit. But it is totally fitting and good to honor the Mother of Christ our Savior. That is what Catholics do when we have a devotion to Mary.

The goal of these tracts is to steal as many Catholics as possible from the Church. But I would say, if it this were being done with a sincere concern for our souls, one would act with God's love, honesty, and accurately portray Catholic doctrine rather than presenting false assertions. It is one thing to disagree with someone's religion, but it is something else entirely to present countless falsehoods and then proceed to tear apart and condemn what wasn't true in the first place.

I urge you to pray for those who print and distribute these pamphlets that the fullness of Christ's love might be theirs, so that they may personally know the Truth that is our Lord and love him as He is, rather than as they wish him to be.


Thank You to all who continue to provide for the hungry among us. We remember Jesus' words in Matthew, "If you give bread to a hungry person, you give it to me".

#### SEPTEMBER 12 — TWENTY- FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

#### Reading I: Isaiah 50: 4c-9a

The Lord GOD opens my ear that I may hear; and I have not rebelled, have not turned back. I gave my back to those who beat me, my cheeks to those who plucked my beard; my face I did not shield from buffets and spitting. The Lord GOD is my help, therefore I am not disgraced; I have set my face like flint, knowing that I shall not be put to shame. He is near who upholds my right; if anyone wishes to oppose me, let us appear together. Who disputes my right? Let that man confront me. See, the Lord GOD is my help; who will prove me wrong?

#### Reading II: James 2: 14-18

What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can that faith save him? If a brother or sister has nothing to wear and has no food for the day, and one of you says to them, "Go in peace, keep warm, and eat well," but you do not give them the necessities of the body, what good is it? So also faith of itself, if it does not have works, is dead. Indeed someone might say, "You have faith and I have works." Demonstrate your faith to me without works, and I will demonstrate my faith to you from my works.

#### Gospel: Mark 8: 27-35

Jesus and his disciples set out for the villages of Caesarea Philippi. Along the way he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that I am?" They said in reply, "John the Baptist, others Elijah, still others one of the prophets." And he asked them, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter said to him in reply, "You are the Christ." Then he warned them not to tell anyone about him. He began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer greatly and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and rise after three days. He spoke this openly. Then Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. At this he turned around and, looking at his disciples, rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do." He summoned the crowd with his disciples and said to them, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it."

#### **READINGS FOR THE WEEK**

Reading I: Isaiah 50: 4c-9a

Even though he has experienced much suffering, the prophet exudes confidence because God is his help.

Reading II: James 2: 14-18

This famous passage makes an obvious observation. If a person accepts the facts of God's revelation, then a certain way of life, his/ her "works," should reflect that belief, with all its expected consequences.

The Gospel: Mark 8: 27-35
