All Saints and All Souls



The beginning of the month of November has two very important feast days of the Church. The first one is Wednesday, November 1st, All Saints Day. This day we honor all the saints, known and unknown, who have, by the way they have responded to God's grace and lived their lives, now enjoy the joy of heaven. It is fitting we honor them; they have reached the goal for which we on earth still long. We look to their example of holiness and hope to be inspired by it. We also ask their intercession on our behalf, so that we too will someday be with them and with the Lord.

The very next day, November 2nd, is All Souls Day. During this feast day we remember all those who have died in the state of grace but who have not yet entered into heavenly joy. The traditional name for this state is Purgatory. The existence of Purgatory is considered to be a truth revealed by God. Here is what the Catechism says about Purgatory, *"All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven. As for certain lesser faults, we must believe that, before the Final Judgment, there is a purifying fire. He who is truth says that whoever utters blasphemy against the Holy Spirit will be pardoned neither in this age nor in the age to come. From this sentence we understand that certain offenses can be forgiven in this age, but certain others in the age to come. This teaching is also based on the practice of prayer for the dead, already mentioned in Sacred Scripture: "Therefore [Judas Maccabeus] made atonement for the dead, that they might be delivered from their sin." (2 Macc 12:46). From the beginning the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God. The Church also commends almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance undertaken on behalf of the dead."* (CCC 1030-1032, excerpted). Our late Holy Father, Pope Saint John Paul II expressed this idea quite beautifully in an All Souls Day homily on November 2, 1998, *"During the Eucharist... the assembled community presents to the Father of all mercies those who have died, so that through the trial of purgatory they will be purified, if necessary, and attain eternal joy. In entrusting them to the Lord, we recognize our solidarity with them and share in their salvation in this wondrous mystery of the communion of saints. The Church believes that the souls detained in purgatory "are helped by the prayers of the faithful and most of all by the acceptable sacrifice of the altar", as well as by "alms and other works of piety". "In fact, that same holiness, which is derived simply from their participation in the Church's holiness, represents their first and fundamental contribution to the holiness of the Church , which is the 'communion of saints'"*.

As a reminder, November 1st, All Saints Day is a Holy Day of Obligation this year. It carries the same obligation as Sunday Mass and missing it, like a Sunday Mass, without a grave reason is a serious sin. One that needs to be confessed before returning to receiving the Holy Eucharist. Masses for All Saints Day are: 7:00PM Vigil Mass on October 31st and 6:45AM, 9:00AM and 7:00PM on November 1st. Also, on November 2nd in addition to the regular daily Masses as 6:45AM and 9:00AM, there will be a special evening Mass at 7:00PM at St. Patrick's. There is an announcement about this in today's bulletin. Don't forget that all of November is dedicated to the Holy Souls. So if you can't make it to Mass on November 2nd, try to make it sometime during November. Also, remember to pray for your loved ones who have died. As we can help them now by our prayers, they will certainly help us with theirs when they reach heaven.





RADICAL SOLIDARITY

2023 Respect Life Reflection

In the Gospel of John, shortly before he is to suffer his Passion, Jesus proclaims to his disciples: “*I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another*” (Jn 13:34). And it is love for one another that Jesus says will be the identifying characteristic of his disciples.

The Church’s entire social doctrine is guided by the fundamental principle that every human life has innate dignity and incomparable value: “Every human being is the object of God’s infinite tenderness, and he himself is present in their lives.” As disciples of Christ, we are called to make a sacrificial gift of ourselves for the sake of our neighbor, for “to love someone is to desire that person’s good and to take effective steps to secure it.”

Fulfilling Christ’s command to love one another takes shape in our practice of solidarity. Solidarity is the means by which we put our love for others into action, making the good of others our own. Solidarity “is not a feeling of vague compassion or shallow distress at the misfortunes of so many people... On the contrary, it is a firm and persevering determination to commit oneself to the common good...to the good of all and of each individual, because we are all really responsible for all.”

In reaction to the overturning of *Roe v. Wade*, some areas of the country now protect the child in the womb, while others are doing all they can to increase access to abortion. At this critical moment, we have been entrusted with new *opportunities* and new *responsibilities* to build a civilization of authentic love. Our culture claims to offer women so-called “choice,” but ultimately abandons mothers to make tragic and painful decisions alone. We must lead the way in showing the alternative: “*In firmly rejecting ‘pro-choice’ it is necessary to become courageously ‘pro woman,’ promoting a choice that is truly in favor of women. ... The only honest stance, in these cases, is that of radical solidarity with the woman.* It is not right to leave her alone.”

Experience shows that when a mother is supported, “she is even capable of heroism.” Radical solidarity compels us to come alongside vulnerable mothers in profound friendship, compassion, and support for both them and their preborn children. It requires us to address the fundamental challenges that lead an expectant mother to believe she is unable to welcome the child God has entrusted to her. We must do all we can to provide mothers, children, and families with the support they need to flourish. This cannot be accomplished by laws or policy alone, but requires the continual transformation of our own hearts, recognizing in every person the face of Christ, and placing their needs before our own.

Radical solidarity “refers to something more than a few sporadic acts of generosity. It presumes the creation of a *new mindset*.” A culture of radical solidarity “gets involved by word and deed in people’s daily lives... and it embraces human life, touching the suffering flesh of Christ in others.” We each have our particular gifts, role, and obligation within the Body of Christ to help build a culture of life. We must honestly ask ourselves, “What radical, out-of-the-ordinary, actions have I taken to help a pregnant or parenting mother in need, or to proactively contribute to a culture of life in some other way?” Inspired by Christ’s own example of love, may we “enter fully into the fabric of society, sharing the lives of all, listening to their concerns, helping them materially and spiritually in their needs, rejoicing with those who rejoice, weeping with those who weep.” May we work together to bring about a culture of life through radical, sacrificial, Christ-like love.




