More on Purgatory . . .


We continue the month November, the month of the Holy Souls during which we pray on behalf of the dead. Upon reflection, it has struck me that while the existence of Purgatory is considered to be a divinely revealed truth, there are quite a few people who think that it doesn't exist or if it does, there aren't many people in it. If one would listen to what is often heard at most funerals, one might get the impression that every deceased person is already in heaven.

I know it seems like the consoling thing for the family to hear, that there loved one is in heaven, but I wonder if it is the best thing. For instance, the guidelines from the Order of Funerals state the following about a funeral homily, "*Attentive to the grief of those present, the homilist should dwell on God's compassionate love and on the paschal mystery of the Lord, as proclaimed in the scripture readings. The homilist should also help the members of the assembly to understand the mystery of God's love and the mystery of Jesus' victorious death and resurrection were present in the life and death of the deceased and that these mysteries are active in their own lives as well. Through the homily, members of the family and the community should receive consolation and strength to face the death of one of their members with a hope nourished by the saving word of God.*" The Order of Funerals also states the following about the nature of funerals, "*The Church through its funeral rites commends the dead to God's merciful love and pleads for the forgiveness of their sins.*" The Church, then, throughout its instructions and prayers during the funeral rites, clearly shows the notion of commanding the deceased to God, rather than presuming they are in heaven. For example, in the Opening Prayer for a Funeral Mass we pray, "*Almighty God and Father, it is our certain faith that your Son, who died on the cross, was raised from the dead, the first fruits of all who have fallen asleep. Grant that through this mystery your servant, N., who has gone to his/her rest in Christ, may share in the joy of his resurrection.*" We pray that the deceased may get to heaven not that they are already there.

While it is our hope that our beloved deceased are in heaven, and as we always trust in the ever present and infinite mercy of the Lord, we still need to remember it is God alone who judges them and determines if and when they are prepared to be united with him in heaven. Therefore, it is not only our duty, but an expression of our love for, and our ongoing bond with the deceased, that we pray for them and make intercession on their behalf.

Only those who are perfectly holy are admitted directly to heaven upon death. The rest who die in the state of grace spend time in purgatory being perfected in love. We must not think that Purgatory is a punishment from God. Rather, it is a sign of his mercy. For it gives the non-perfect among us the ability to get to heaven. If only those who are perfectly holy, go to heaven I think a lot of us would be in trouble. As it is, God's love and mercy gives the less than perfect (most of us) an avenue to him. Not only that, but it provides the living a way of maintaining their bond of love with the deceased. I would think that our beloved dead would be more appreciative of our prayers on their behalf than in our assumption that they don't want or need them.







CYBER SAYS...
The Need for a Multi-layered Proactive Defense

To defend against an increased rate and range of attacks, businesses need to take a multi-layered defensive approach that overlaps safeguards limited access points and user training and perimeter defenses. Essentially, modern companies need to become digital fortresses with multiple layers of proactive protection that serve to monitor, detect alert and prevent the onslaught of cyber attacks.
