50-50

Did you know that in the last seven presidential elections over the past twenty-four years the percentage difference in the popular vote averages 3.3 percent? So, for the last twenty-four years, a little over fifty percent of the people voted for one candidate and a little under fifty percent voted for the other. Of course, where those people voted mattered for the electoral college and the ultimate victor in the election, but in raw numbers its been about 50-50 for the last generation or so.

We can debate about the minutiae of exit poll data and the explanations of why a candidate won or lost according to the pundits and talking heads of both sides of the aisle, but it's still the case that it's about 50-50 in the voting. Think about it. 50-50. No matter who you voted for or why you voted for that person, there was just about another who voted for the other candidate for his or her own reasons.

Certainly there are a percentage of often loud extremists on both sides, (and frankly, if you think one "side" has a monopoly on extremism, with respect, you are delusional). And when we take the extremes out of it, guess what? There remains the huge chunk of non-extreme (normal) people who voted like you did and a huge chunk of non-extreme (normal) people who voted differently than you. Normal people. Like you. So, first and foremost, let's remember something very, very important, they are not your enemies. Get that straight. Reasonable people disagree, unreasonable people attack and vilify the other. You might passionately disagree with their positions (as they disagree with yours, as passionately as you) but that does not make them evil or bad. They are people created in the image and likeness of God, just like you, and possess the same human dignity and value that you do. Jesus Christ died on the Cross and rose from the dead for everyone, not just those on your side of the political fence.

If we have made it far enough in our souls to not demonize everyone who voted differently than you, what now? Well, I think the Lord would want us to understand that we have a responsibility to treat people with love and fairness and graciousness that they deserve, just like we would, and should, expect from someone who disagrees with us.

Our goal should be the common good of all, not our own personal good at the expense of others. Because the common good provides the greatest good for everyone. It's hard and it's tedious, and it's a lot of work. But it's worth it. Working toward and achieving the common good begins with recognizing our common ground. I think we can start with accepting that most people are decent and want a happy life. We might not agree on how that looks, but it is what just about everyone wants. Let's start there. Instead of thinking that people we disagree with are just evil and trying to destroy us, let's begin with the perspective that just about everyone wants deep down to be happy. It might just be enough to get the ball rolling in the right direction.

Working towards the common good promotes working together for a common goal, which promotes unity and decreases hostility. Who do you think wants us to think the "other" 50% are all evil and should be hated and result in never ending conflict and hostility? God? Certainly not. It is Satan who thrives on disharmony and anger. Let's not allow ourselves to be deceived. Let's acknowledge the dignity and value of others, including those with whom we disagree. We need to strive to work together for the good of all. And in doing so, we will find that it's better, brings about the peace that everyone wants, and is a lot nicer than the burden of hating each other.

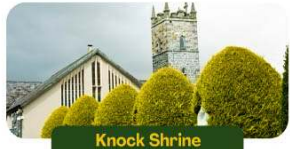

Sunday, May 11th - Depart Philadelphia to Dublin, Ireland.

Monday, May 12th - Arrive in Dublin and travel by coach to Galway. Lunch at the Johnstown Estate and Mass with the group. Dinner and overnight at the Salt Hill Hotel.

Tuesday, May 13th - Journey to the village of Knock. Celebrate Mass where the 1879 apparition of Our Lady, St. Joseph, St. John and the Lamb appear on the gable wall of the parish church. Then return to Galway for a relaxing cruise onboard the Corrib Princess on Lough Corrib. Dinner back at the Salt Hill hotel.

Wednesday, May 14th - Begin the day with Mass at Galway Cathedral then onto Caherconnell Fort & Sheepdog trials. Enjoy the great skills of the shepherds as they work the collies in a demonstration. After a stop at the quaint village of Adare, we arrive in Killarney for a 2-night stay and dinner at the Great Southern Hotel.

Thursday, May 15th - Enjoy a horse-drawn jaunting car ride through Killarney National Park to Ross Castle. Then onto the Gap of Dunloe for some shopping at Moriarty's Gift Store. Dinner at the Great Southern Hotel.

Friday, May 16th - After Mass we visit Blarney Castle to kiss the Blarney Stone and shopping at the Blarney Woolen Mills. From there we travel to the Cobb Heritage Center, the last port of call to board the RMS Titanic. Dinner and overnight in Cork at the River Lee Hotel.

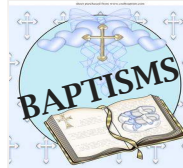

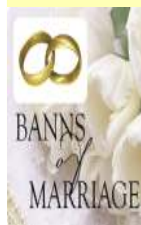

RETIREMENT FUND FOR RELIGIOUS—DEC. 7



WHY WE ASK

- ◆ In 1988, Catholic bishops of the United States launched the Retirement Fund for Religious to address the significant lack of retirement funding for Catholic sisters, brothers, and religious order priests.
- ◆ For most of their lives, elder religious worked for little to no pay. There were no 401(k) plans or pensions.
- ◆ Religious communities are financially responsible for the support and care of all members. Income, earnings, and expenses are managed separately from the parish and diocesan structures of the Catholic Church.
- ◆ Only 6 percent of the religious communities providing data to the National Religious Retirement Office are adequately funded for retirement; 46 percent have 25 or fewer members. Many small communities struggle to care for elder members due to a lack of financial resources and personnel.
- ◆ Today, religious past age 70 outnumber religious younger than age 70 by nearly three to one.
- ◆ There are 20,571 religious past age 70 living in the United States. In 2023, the average annual cost for their care was roughly \$59,700 per person; skilled nursing care averaged \$90,700 per person.
- ◆ Since 2009, the annual cost to support senior women and men religious has exceeded \$1 billion.
- ◆ In 2024, 71 percent of the religious communities providing data to the National Religious Retirement Office had a median age of 70 or higher.
- ◆ The average annual Social Security benefit for a religious is \$8,551, whereas the average lay US beneficiary receives \$22,864.

HOW DONATIONS HELP

- ◆ Each year, hundreds of US religious communities receive financial assistance made possible by the Retirement Fund for Religious. Communities can use this funding for immediate retirement expenses or invest it for future needs. Since the first collection, US Catholics have donated more than \$1 billion.
- ◆ Since the collection began, almost \$870 million has been distributed to support the day-to-day care of elderly sisters, brothers, and religious order priests. An additional \$103.5 million has been allocated toward self-help projects initiated by religious communities, including collaborative health-care facilities.
- ◆ In addition to direct financial assistance, proceeds from the annual collection underwrite educational programming, services, and resources that enable religious communities to evaluate and prepare for long-term retirement needs.
- ◆ Support from the Retirement Fund for Religious helps religious communities care for senior members while allowing them to continue important ministries to the People of God.

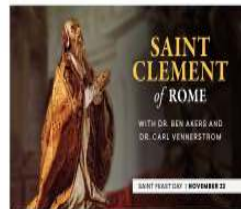
