## The estimated 2023 global revenue of what industry was an estimated \$100 billion (bigger than the NFL, NBA and MLB combined)?

Worldwide sales in this industry for 2023 are reported to be \$100 billion. To put this in perspective, Tesla reported a revenue of \$96.77 billion in 2023. This industry generated 11.5 billion visits in 2023 compared to Netflix which generated 1.6 billion visits. What is this industry? Unfortunately, it is the pornography industry. Digging its roots in every form of media available pornography has become so common and so easily accessible that the U.S. Department of Justice has stated, *“Never before in the history of telecommunications media in the United States has so much indecent (and obscene) material been so easily accessible by so many minors in so many American homes with so few restrictions.”*

Addiction to pornography and sex is becoming more and more widespread, leaving in its wake tremendous suffering and many broken relationships and families. The viewing of objectified and dehumanized women and men in pornography has been demonstrated time and time again to have disastrous effects on interpersonal relationships. Nor is it just innumerable individual relationships that have been damaged, our very culture has been greatly affected as well. We have become such an overly sexualized culture that the most seemingly excessive and depraved behaviors are now considered normal. Married men and women (and children) spending hours in “adult” chat rooms, and viewing hours of pornography for their next fix. It seems hardly believable that very young girls wearing incredibly revealing and or suggestive clothing are often called “cute” by their very own mothers and grandmothers. Or, children, “sexting” each other by sending naked and or pornographic photos of themselves over their cell phone. How can it be good for young girls or young boys to grow up being looked upon as objects or being trained to look upon others as objects? How can they develop a healthy sense of maturity and personal wholeness when they are led to believe that sensuality equals beauty or that using another person for our pleasure is something good?

Pornography has taught everyone and especially young people others exist for their own sexual pleasure. And it also teaches that in order to get and “keep” someone, they have to be both sexually provocative and sexually active. None of this is healthy, and certainly not in accord with the loving, beautiful, and profound intent of the gift of sexuality that God has given us....to confirm and strengthen the exclusive marital bond of husband and wife and to grace that bond with offspring to love and nurture.

Beauty is not sex, nor are people objects for our entertainment. True beauty reflects the goodness and perfection and image of God. People are individual subjects that are to be treated as sacred persons to whom we relate, rather than use. Pornography rails against this. The substitution of pornographic fantasy in which one gets what he or she wants instead of a mature relationship which requires a genuine give and take, can make it extremely hard to have a healthy marriage or other relationship. Pornography develops within its user an aggressive selfishness that affects all interpersonal relationships.

One doesn't have to look very far to see the devastating effects of pornography and addiction to pornography. But with any threat to the dignity of the human person, there is always a solution, there is help. To begin with, we must honestly acknowledge the danger of pornography and any assess attachment we have to it. Then we need to seek whatever help we need, often this is a problem we cannot get out of on our own.

Above all, as a first resort - not a last resort, is to bring to bear our all-powerful Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. He came to earth to liberate us from slavery to sin. Jesus wants nothing more than for us to be free and able to love him and others in a healthy and fulfilling way. Devout prayer, worthy reception of the Sacraments, spending time before the Blessed Sacrament, will help us make and be successful in the difficult climb to eliminate pornography in our lives and get us back on the way to freedom and authentic love.

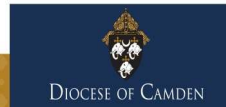

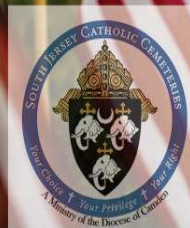

## ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults is a sacramental process that prepares adults to be received into the Catholic Church. Persons who complete the process receive the sacraments of Baptism (if not yet baptized), First Eucharist, and Confirmation.

OCIA begins after each Easter season with a rolling open enrollment and continues to the following Easter season. The process is also available for Catholics who have never received the sacraments of First Eucharist and/or Confirmation.

**MAY IS MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS MONTH**

What is mental health? Mental health refers to our overall well-being and affects how a person feels, thinks or behaves. It can change as we age and go through life stages. Our mental health can impact our physical health, ability to navigate stress and our interactions with others.

Some signs to be aware for mental health include:

- ◆ Changes in mood – this can be affected by weather, people, activities or other circumstances.
- ◆ Changes in sleep patterns - sleeping too much, not getting enough sleep or waking frequently from sleep can affect mental health.
- ◆ Changes in eating patterns - eating more or less than usual or choosing foods higher in salt, sugar and carbohydrate content with little or no nutrients can have an impact.
- ◆ Unusual difficulty concentrating - having to think hard to recall things such as dates, names and what you were doing that is not normal for you.
- ◆ Being fearful and constantly worrying about health, finances or other aspects of life.
- ◆ Decline in chronic health or mental health issues can be due to stress.

Tips to Support Mental Health:

- ◆ Be mindful - Mindfulness of your thoughts, words and behavior is a good indicator of your mental health.
- ◆ Track your mood – Make notes on how you feel and when you feel them to help identify patterns of negative emotions and feelings.
- ◆ Identify coping strategies – We all cope with emotions differently. Do you stress-eat, smoke, or drink alcohol when you're upset? Do you call a friend, pray or go for a walk when you feel down? Think about how your coping strategies work for you.
- ◆ Maintain regular exercise, eat healthy, balanced meals and get adequate sleep.
- ◆ Make one small change at a time – taking on too much can be overwhelming.
