He who does not gather with me scatters

In a passage from the Gospel of Luke that was heard at daily Mass recently, Jesus was driving out demons and was accused of driving them out by the power of the devil. He effectively silenced his detractors by pointing out that a kingdom divided by itself cannot stand....and if Satan is divided against himself how will his kingdom stand? But at the end of this passage he offers a very powerful statement, one that is probably quite familiar to us. "Whoever is not with me is against me." Most of us know that one. But what is interesting to me is that this is only half of the sentence that he speaks. The second half of the sentence is, "and he who does not gather with me scatters".

In both of these statements there is no middle ground, no fence to sit on, we are either on one side or the other. We are either with the Lord or we are not. But what I find interesting is how often the second part is left off. Whether it is intentional or subconscious, I don't know, but I do know that the whole sentence of Jesus is immensely more than just the half we are so familiar with.

After all, how many of us, even those who are lukewarm, are going to explicitly say they are against Jesus. "No, we are with you all the way, Lord!" Sure, we can observe from someone's behavior, perhaps, if they really mean it that they are with the Lord, but that decision is up to God anyway. But what about the second part? Clearly the Lord is not just looking for a cheering section or for his followers to be intellectually on his side, Jesus is looking for doers. If we are truly to be "with" the Lord, it is not passive, far from it. We are to be gathering with the Lord. We are to be actively trying to bring others to the Lord. This is the only way we can truly be "with" him.

Aside from the necessary and obvious need to give a good example to others, when is the last time you invited someone to Mass, or to pray with you? When's the last time you tried to get a fallen away Catholic friend or relative back to Church? When is the last time you clarified the teaching of our Faith when someone was confused or in error about it? That's gathering. Not doing those things, according to Jesus, is scattering. Something I don't think we want to be found guilty of, because if we are scattering, then we are clearly not "with" the Lord either.

In such a disturbing time we live, we all need Jesus even more. We should be asking the Holy Spirit to give us the strength and courage to reach out to others. We don't need to be experts in theology, we just need to love and to care and to reach out since we are not doing it on our own, but with the Lord. He expects us not to just have our own relationship with him, but to bring others to his love and mercy and salvation. Gathering is a requirement for the follower of Christ. And I don't think he will accept from us, "but Lord I forgot about the second part."

So let us gather together with Him!

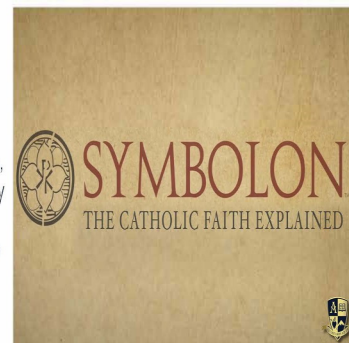

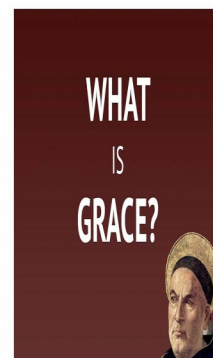

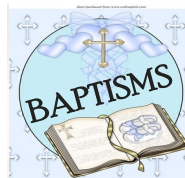
RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS
