



Relativism

Perhaps one of the easiest ways to describe relativism is the denial of objective, universal truth. That is, there are no moral rules that apply to all cultures or all people and that no country, institution, (or person) should “impose” their (or his or her or whatever) moral rules on any other culture or person. On the surface this seems like it should make sense, since it seems to be a safeguard against tyranny. However, it is not. Philosophically speaking, the idea of relativism is itself, self-contradictory. For if there are no universal rules, how can a relativist tell me I’m wrong if I think they are? If he tries, the relativist would be committing the same error he is accusing me of...he would be trying to “impose” his universal “truth” on me!

But relativism is more than being a logical fallacy and self contradictory, it is also poses great spiritual risk. A person plagued by relativism can easily justify any behavior, no matter how much it violates God’s law, on the grounds that it was, “the right thing for me to do at the time and under those circumstances.” Just a short time before he was elected, the late Pope Benedict XVI (then Cardinal Ratzinger), reflected on relativism in a homily. He stated that,

“Every day new sects are born and we see realized what St. Paul says on the deception of men, on the cunning that tends to lead into error (cf. Ephesians 4:14). To have a clear faith, according to the creed of the Church, is often labeled as fundamentalism. While relativism, that is, allowing oneself to be carried about with every wind of “doctrine,” seems to be the only attitude that is fashionable. A dictatorship of relativism is being constituted that recognizes nothing as absolute and which only leaves the “I” and its whims as the ultimate measure.” “We have another measure: the Son of God, true man. He is the measure of true humanism. “Adult” is not a faith that follows the waves in fashion and the latest novelty. Adult and mature is a faith profoundly rooted in friendship with Christ. This friendship opens us to all that is good and gives us the measure to discern between what is true and what is false, between deceit and truth.”

There are universal objective norms. They have been written into the world and human nature upon creation by God. Just as there is an order of things in the physical world, so too is there an order in the moral world as well. I don’t know a relativist who would deny the universal existence of the force of gravity when standing on the edge of a cliff, yet at the same time the relativist would most certainly say that there is no universal moral norm against say, marital infidelity or homosexual behavior or abortion or any number of moral violations. But in reality, jumping off the cliff or being unfaithful to one’s spouse or engaging in homosexual activity or participating in abortion all would entail great mortal risk, both physical and spiritual. To deny this is not reasonable.

As you can see from the late Holy Father’s statement, the only sure way out of the mindset of relativism is to continually strive to develop one’s relationship to Christ, who identified himself as “the Way, the Truth, and the Life.” The closer we are to Jesus, the closer we are to Truth. As the heat of summer progresses, don’t forget to stay close to the Lord through daily family prayer, regular attendance at Sunday Mass, and participation in the sacraments of the Church, themselves encounters with Christ.

Also, as a reminder, we have Eucharistic Adoration on Mondays from 7PM-8PM at St. Patrick’s Church and Fridays from 9:30AM-7PM at St. Matthew’s Church. Spending time before the Lord in the blessed Sacrament is another great way to develop our relationship with our Lord.




DIAPER DRIVE FOR LOCAL FAMILIES

For many of these families, this support enabled them to continue sending their children to Catholic school.



RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is a sacramental process that prepares adults to be received into the Catholic Church. Persons who complete the process receive the sacraments of Baptism (if not yet baptized), First Eucharist, and Confirmation.

RCIA begins after each Easter season with a rolling open enrollment and continues to the following Easter season. The process is also available for Catholics who have never received the sacraments of First Eucharist and/or Confirmation.






