

JASON COLLINS

Does anyone remember Jason Collins? In 2013 he was the first active professional athlete from one of the "top four" professional sports (Basketball) who publicly acknowledged that he had same sex attraction. Nearly all of the headlines at the time commended his choice to "come out" and applauded him for his bravery and courage. There was even a headline that read, "Out and Proud: Why the NBA's Jason Collins is a True Role Model for My Kids." I think in a very true way, Mr. Collins did display a good deal of bravery to publicly admit his same sex attraction.

Unfortunately, though, the most courageous voices today about this topic it seems are not those who support or approve of homosexuality, but those who do not. Any voice raised against the acceptance of homosexual behavior or homosexual marriage is immediately attacked and condemned in the strongest of terms, often with great malice, being accused of intolerance, hatefulness, bigotry, etc. No matter how sensitive one tries to be on this very sensitive topic, any objection raised to the acceptance of homosexual behavior is seen as uncivil and hostile.

Beyond the obvious double standard of tolerance where "you have to be tolerant of my view but I don't have to be tolerant of yours," which is both sad and dangerous, is that this type of actual intolerance is driving those who believe in Divine Revelation and God's Law into the proverbial "closet." A couple of quick Google searches will find ample evidence of the abuse and ridicule heaped upon people of faith, in particular Christians, who accept the teaching of Divine Revelation on human intimacy and sexuality. This makes it very hard for people who do believe in what God teaches in Sacred Scripture to say anything for fear of being publicly beaten down and humiliated, punished in some way, even losing one's job.

While it is essential to uphold the **absolute** moral obligation that every single person on the face of the earth should be treated with the dignity and respect they deserve as children of God, no matter what their inclination, *including their opinion of sexual orientation*, it is just as true that we have an obligation to uphold the truth of Divine Revelation regarding human intimacy and sexuality.

In order to clarify what the Church specifically teaches regarding homosexuality, I offer the three paragraphs from the Catechism of the Catholic Church about homosexuality:

2357 Homosexuality refers to relations between men or between women who experience an exclusive or predominant sexual attraction toward persons of the same sex. It has taken a great variety of forms through the centuries and in different cultures. Its psychological genesis remains largely unexplained. Basing itself on Sacred Scripture, which presents homosexual acts as acts of grave depravity, tradition has always declared that "homosexual acts are intrinsically disordered." They are contrary to the natural law. They close the sexual act to the gift of life. They do not proceed from a genuine affective and sexual complementarity. Under no circumstances can they be approved.

2358 The number of men and women who have deep-seated homosexual tendencies is not negligible. This inclination, which is objectively disordered, constitutes for most of them a trial. They must be accepted with respect, compassion, and sensitivity. Every sign of unjust discrimination in their regard should be avoided. These persons are called to fulfill God's will in their lives and, if they are Christians, to unite to the sacrifice of the Lord's Cross the difficulties they may encounter from their condition.

2359 Homosexual persons are called to chastity. By the virtues of self-mastery that teach them inner freedom, at times by the support of disinterested friendship, by prayer and sacramental grace, they can and should gradually and resolutely approach Christian perfection.



JASON COLLINS (CONT'D.)

Today, even with the news and entertainment industries fully embracing and advocating homosexuality as something natural, from my years in pastoral ministry I know how difficult it really is for nearly all who possess same sex attraction as well as for their families. Our hearts and prayers should go out to them as they bear this cross. We should not add to their burden by treating those with a homosexual inclination unfairly or unkindly. At the same time, we should not be silent when radical homosexual advocates seek to redefine and destroy the God given institution of marriage as a union of one man and one woman or decry us for holding onto our faith. It's a tough balance to maintain, and mistakes will be made at times, but the worst possible mistake of all would be to silently cower in fear. If we applaud Jason Collins for his bravery should we not applaud too those who acknowledge their faith in Jesus Christ and what he teaches us?

Homosexuality has become so normalized in our culture since 2013 (just ten years ago) that this column might even seem out-of-date. But God's plan for marriage - a union between one man and one woman - still needs to be defended and be preserved in our society because it is by God's will the building block of a healthy society. Despite the current social focus on the "trans" culture, we need to remind ourselves why we are here. The less we defend the natural law built into the world by God our creator the more it will unravel. How far down the rabbit whole are we willing to go before we stand up and defend the truth of God while at the same time ensuring that we strive to love everyone, no matter what their inclination. For it is not just possible to love someone with whom we disagree, it is the command of the Lord to do so.

At the same time, it is important to understand that disagreement, even passionate disagreement, does not denote hate. For instance, I can love, and certainly should love, my relative who is being unfaithful to his or her spouse. In fact, it is in authentic love, that I would care enough to say something to that relative who is behaving contrary to the law of God. So let us call upon the grace of the Lord that we may be courageous to love all persons and at the same time to defend the truth of God.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS
