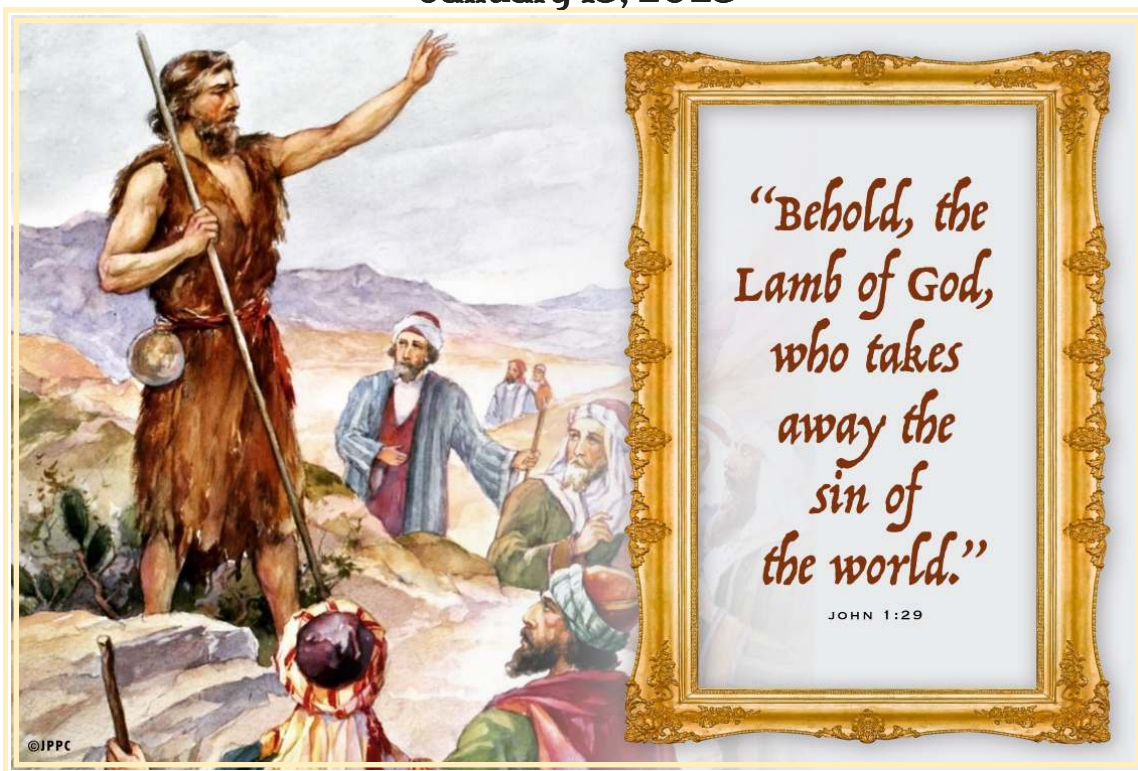

Mortal Sin vs. Venial Sin (Part II)

Remembering from last week the principal and simple distinction between Venial and Mortal Sin is that Mortal Sin kills our relationship with God where Venial Sin wounds it, this week I want to review the conditions that need to be present in order for one to commit a Mortal Sin. Once again I would like recall and emphasize that God alone is our judge, but at the same time we have the ability to use the gifts and Revelation He has given us to both evaluate human behavior, and to understand and accept objective, universal moral norms.

Now, onto the conditions required for Mortal sin. There are three conditions necessary for a sin to be mortal. It must be **serious matter**, one must have **full knowledge** that the action is wrong, and seriously wrong, and finally the person must give **full consent of the will**. If all three of these conditions are present, the sin is a mortal or serious sin. If only one or two of them are present, then it would be a venial sin.

The first requirement of serious matter can seem pretty straightforward. The action must be gravely wrong. Murder and adultery are obvious examples. So is missing Mass on Sundays and Holy Days without a serious reason. Of course, there often can be debate about the degree “wrongness” of a particular act. Is missing Mass on Sunday really a mortal sin? Stealing is wrong, but at what point does stealing become a Mortal Sin, or is it always a Mortal Sin? While we can successfully use our God given intellect to help discern these matters, it is often not enough. That is why we turn to the Church which has been given the responsibility and necessary assistance of the Holy Spirit to authoritatively teach in the area of faith and morals. When there is a clash between the two, believers have an obligation to submit to the authority of the Church. Being a Christian means believing in and following Christ: and he has promised to guide the Church. If we don’t believe that the Church has the guidance of God to teach authoritatively in these matters, then we need to reevaluate our faith. And for the record, the Church does teach that missing Mass on a Sunday or Holy Day without a very grave and serious reason is a Mortal Sin.

Circumstances can also affect the seriousness of the sin. If I steal \$50 from Donald Trump, it would be a sin, but would likely not sever my relationship with God. However, if I steal \$50 from a poor family who desperately needs that money for food, I have inflicted serious harm and that act of stealing \$50 would be a mortal sin.

The second condition needed for a Mortal Sin is, full knowledge. In order for a sin to be a mortal, the person who commits an act which is seriously, or gravely wrong, must also know and understand that the act is both wrong and seriously wrong. If a person, though no fault of his own, is not aware of the seriousness of the act, it cannot be a mortal sin. However this must be balanced with the fact that fundamental right and wrong is discernable to everyone since it is written into our very being. St. Paul acknowledges this in his letter to the Romans, by stating that even the pagans, those without the benefit of Divine Revelation, are still accountable for their actions since God’s truth is also revealed in creation.

Finally, the third condition for moral sin. Full consent of the will. This condition implies a consent that is sufficiently deliberate to be a personal choice. External pressures or pathological disorders can diminish the voluntary and free character of the offence. On the other hand, sin committed through malice, by deliberate choice of evil is the gravest.

One can see that the three conditions for Mortal Sin, while simple, are neither rigid nor simplistic. However this complexity should not give rise to attempts to rationalize our sinfulness by looking for some way to minimize its seriousness. God is ultimately our judge and while we might be able to fool others about what we did, we certainly cannot fool God. Rather let us turn to our loving God, who would in his mercy rather give us his grace to help us turn from sin than in his justice be forced to condemn us.

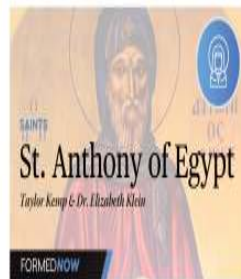

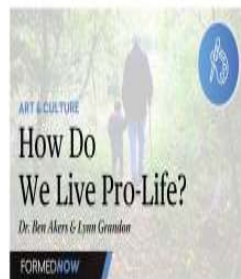
