

On January 22, 1973 the Supreme Court of the United States of America, discovered in what it called the "penumbra" (literally "shadows" in Latin) of the due process clause of the Fifth and Fourteenth Amendments of the Constitution the "right" of abortion. Yes, in their own words, the majority of the Supreme Court Justices found in the actual words but in the "shadows" of the due process clause the right to kill a baby in the womb of its mother. In sad irony, it is the due process clause which explicitly seeks to prohibit federal, state and local governments from depriving persons of life, liberty, or property without certain legal procedures to ensure fairness. Yet in the shadows of this clause somehow there is the right to take the life of an innocent baby in the womb, without of course any due process at all except the "choice" of the mother. In many ways, it is appropriate to discover this tragic "right" in the shadows; for under the most basic inspection in the light of day, one cannot come close to finding a "right" to kill an innocent person anywhere in the Constitution and most certainly not in the due process clause. Nevertheless, nearly fifty years later, we still labor under these shadows. And for these many years, millions and millions of children have been killed in the wombs of their mothers; and millions and millions of mothers and fathers themselves have suffered and continue to suffer in their lives the devastating effects of abortion as well.

Only God really knows the full correlation between the erosion of the value of the dignity of human life in this country due to abortion and the tremendous contempt for life we see in our country today-the lack of respect for the elderly, handicapped and infirmed, the increasingly violent behavior of adolescents and adults, the mass killings that seem to occur ever more frequently, and of course, abortion. What we are seeing is a manifestation of the *dividend of the culture of death* that has been accruing for fifty years inaugurated by Roe vs. Wade. We face this dividend of the culture of death each day and which will continue to be compounded as long as we refuse to acknowledge the social, spiritual, psychological, and physical harm caused by abortion in our country. While some may balk at such a connection between abortion and mass murder, it really doesn't take an expert strategic planner to understand such a connection.

To get from point A to point B requires that we start at point A. If we want to regain a healthy respect for the dignity and value of human life, we need to go back to the primary source of the destruction of innocent human life. Without question that source is abortion. This coming Friday will be the annual March for Life in Washington D.C. Tens of thousands of people will march, witness and pray for life and for our country. All of us also should continue unceasingly to pray and to witness to life. We pray for a true conversion of the heart and soul of our country, because that is what we are fighting for; the soul of our country. We fight for our country that it may regain its true soul, a soul that honors and respects life in all its stages. For with that in place we would then be receiving, rather than the sad dividend of the culture of death, a dividend of life which would benefit us all, not just the children in the wombs of their mothers.

If, as some believe, the Supreme Court will overturn the horrible and unjust Roe vs. Wade decision, we are not finished. All that will do is state that abortion is not a federally protected right and it will revert back to state legislatures to decide how to treat abortion. Anticipating this, as we have seen this past week, the elected officials of NJ have voted on and passed a law that will protect and expand abortion in the state of New Jersey. Abortion will be legal in New Jersey for all nine months of a pregnancy. In the usual twisted irony of people who promote abortion, the new law is stated to guarantee "the fundamental right of reproductive autonomy." As if "reproductive" autonomy can mean killing a child in the womb. Where is the autonomy of that little baby?

So, this means we still have a long way to go in our state and in our country to promote the dignity and value of life, no matter what the courts rule. As always, this begins with prayer to our merciful Lord that he may soften the hard hearts who believe that the killing of an unborn child is any kind of solution to and unwanted or unexpected pregnancy. Then secondly, we must inform ourselves of not just the biological and scientific truth of life but also compelling moral and philosophical pro-life arguments so that, aided by God's grace, we can discuss and change peoples' minds about abortion. Then we must stop electing representatives who promote the killing of the innocent. This sad legacy has fractured society in such a way that it is only repairable by God. Because of this, finally, but not of the least importance, we must seek to become as holy as possible so that we can reflect the light of Christ in the world to overcome the "shadows" that darken it.

The book of names are remembered in our Prayer of the Faithful at all weekday and weekend Masses.




