The Bishop's Mass Schedule Decree

On the next page is a copy of the Bishop's Decree on Mass schedules in the Diocese of Camden. It was written in August 2022 and was published in the Star Herald. The main reason behind the decree for the reduction of Masses is that in the near future we will have even fewer priests and we need to prepare now for the future, rather than react to it when it occurs. The Parish Council and I have been discussing this over the past few months on how to implement the Bishop's decree. Let's be clear, this is not a recommendation, but a decree that must be followed.

Let's look at our Mass attendance. The average Mass attendance at Holy Angels Parish is the following:

4:00PM at St. Patrick's Church	147
5:30PM at St. Matthew's Church	63
7:30AM at St. Patrick's Church	120
8:30AM at St. Matthew's Church	72
10:00AM at St. Patrick's Church	189
11:30AM at St. Patrick's Church	114
6:00PM at St. Patrick's Church	89

Examining the numbers, there are some insights that were drawn by the Parish Council and myself:

- 1. The mandate requires that there be only one Saturday Vigil Mass. Combining the two Saturday Masses averages gives us 210. That amount could not be accommodated by St. Matthew's Church but can be at St. Patrick's.
- 2. At the moment, here at Holy Angels, there are three priests; the pastor plus two others. According to the decree, that allows us to have four Sunday Masses.
- 3. Should we lose a priest, and perhaps more accurately when we lose a priest, it would/will have to go down to three Sunday Masses.
- 4. The combining of any two Sunday morning Masses would give a number that cannot be accommodated at St. Matthew's.
- 5. The 6:00PM Mass will remain at St. Patrick's. We expect this Mass to grow with some of the neighboring parishes cancelling their Sunday evening Masses.

Given these insights and the discussion with the Parish Council, this is what the Parish Council and I have determined:

- 1. The one Saturday Vigil Mass for the Parish will be at St. Patrick's and it will remain for the time being at 4:00PM; the 5:30PM Mass at St. Matthew's will be discontinued
- 2. The 8:30AM Mass at St. Matthew's will be discontinued.
- 3. Funerals and Weddings at St. Matthew's will continue for the present time.
- 4. We will try to utilize St. Matthew's Church for prayer meetings and other ministries.
- 5. The last Sunday Mass will be celebrated at St. Matthew's on May 7, 2023.

I know how difficult and painful this is for those who have a strong connection to St. Matthew's. I know how heartbreaking it is when one can't go to Mass in the church you grew up in or received your sacraments in. I really love celebrating Mass there. It is very sad. Sadder is the reality of the existence of too few priests to be able to staff the churches we currently have. There will be, without a doubt, more cuts in the future.

Despite whatever deep connection and affection for a particular church building, our faith is greater because in the end, our faith is in Christ and his universal Church throughout the world. I wish this decision didn't have to be made, but it is incumbent on us to meet reality as it is and not how we want it to be. Please pray and encourage priestly vocations whenever you can so that someday, we don't have to make changes such as these.

DECREE REGARDING PARISH MASS SCHEDULES IN THE DIOCESE OF CAMDEN

In order to better address the declining number of priests in the presbyterate of the Diocese of Camden, along with the decline in Mass attendance, and having taken counsel with both the Presbyteral Council and the Vicars Forane, in exercising vigilance over the celebration of the sacraments, in accord with canon 392 §2 of the Code of Canon Law, in order that the pastoral effort regarding the celebration of Mass may be more effective for the building up of the ecclesiastical community and so as to not overburden the priests of the diocese, allowing them to more adequately fulfill their ministry (cf. *Eucharisticum mysterium*, 25), I hereby decree the following in regards to Mass schedules in the Diocese of Camden:

- 1. A parish may have one Saturday evening Mass.
- 2. A parish may have two Sunday Masses if there is only one full-time priest assigned to the parish.
- 3. A parish may have one additional Mass on Sunday per full-time or part-time priest assigned to the parish as long as those Masses have an attendance of at least 60% of the capacity of the church building. A change in the Mass schedule will need to be made when staffing changes at the parish.
- 4. Parishes that serve the Latino community should incorporate the Mass celebrated in the Spanish language into the parish Mass schedule in accord with the guidelines above.
- 5. Parishes in the shore region of the diocese will need to plan, on an annual basis, the number of Masses they require and are able to cover. By May 1st of each year, pastors of shore parishes are to file their summer Mass schedule and coverage plan with the Office of the Chancellor.
- 6. In parishes with only one priest; the parish weekday Mass schedules may reflect the pastor's day off by having no Mass scheduled on that day. In addition, when the pastor is on vacation, the weekday Masses may be suspended. Eucharistic services are NOT TO BE CONDUCTED on these occasions; the faithful are to be provided with nearby parish Mass schedules so that they may participate in Mass.

This decree takes effect on July 1, 2023.





RCIA begins after each Easter season with a rolling open enrollment and continues to the following Easter season. The process is also available for Catholics who have never received the sacraments of First Eucharist and/or Confirmation.




