

The Blind Men and an Elephant

There is an ancient fable from India about three blind men encountering an elephant. It has a pretty good moral to the story. There are three blind men who are each touching an elephant in different places. The first blind man touches the elephant's trunk and says, "An elephant is like a snake." The second blind man, while touching the elephant's leg, says, "You're wrong. An elephant is like a great trunk of a tree." The third blind man, touching the side of the massive animal, says, "You both are wrong. An elephant is like a brick wall." Each of the men thinks he is fully right and the others are wrong.

Of course, all three are partially correct, but none are wholly correct. None are fully describing the elephant. Having part of the truth does get us somewhere, but only so far. While God is the only one who is all knowing, that doesn't mean that we should be satisfied with only partial truth and not try to know as much as we can about a situation. For the more we know about a situation, the better—decision we can make. In fact, not knowing or seeing or believing or accepting the fullness of the truth about something will make it difficult, if not impossible, to judge or respond appropriately.


This appears to be taking place on a daily level in our world today. Whether it's in politics, on city streets, in social media, in our families and communities, we seem to get a lot people, including ourselves, who may be partially right about one thing but fight as if they have the whole truth; completely blind to other aspects of the situation that can assist them in having a fuller and more informed perspective. In addition, they will often completely reject any idea that doesn't fully support theirs, and fight with fierce energy and hostility any attempt to bring them to a fuller outlook.

We can't allow that to happen in our lives, we can't let this be us. Pick any topic. It doesn't matter. We certainly have the liberty (and obligation), to use our God-given gift of our intellect and reason to make decisions about things. But at the same time, we have an equal obligation to discover as much as we can about a situation before deciding. We shouldn't decide in favor of something merely because we like it, nor reject something because we don't like it. That is judgment by emotion not by reason.

Jesus says in the gospel that He is "the way the truth and the life." Therefore it is necessary for us, if we are going to be close to Him who is Truth itself, to find as much of the truth of a situation, including even things that we don't like, before making a judgment. Otherwise we are like the blind men, who by holding fast to their limited knowledge and understanding, will only end up fighting over their partial truths, never understanding what an elephant is really like.

But for us the risk is greater, because we are not talking about earthly creatures, we are talking about knowing the Lord and coming close to him. If we are resistant to the full truth of a situation, we are also resistant to Christ who is truth. That is not a good place to be. Openness to the truth does not mean we have to accept everything, but it means we have to listen to various sides of a situation and evaluate them before we make a judgment.







RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS




