

Lent 2022

This coming Wednesday is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the holy season of Lent. It is a great opportunity for us to deepen our relationship with the Lord; it is a time for spiritual renewal. The Church's Lenten practices are not merely forty days of "doing without some stuff" they are designed to help us focus anew on Christ our Savior. The ashes we receive on Ash Wednesday remind us of our mortality. They remind us that it is sin which causes death. At the beginning of Lent we acknowledge our sinfulness and in doing so we open ourselves up to the power of Christ's passion, death and resurrection. Throughout the penitential days of Lent, we look with hope to Christ who has conquered sin and death by his own death and resurrection. Therefore when we reflect on our own sinfulness we do so not in a despairing way, but with the hope of overcoming our sinfulness through the power of Christ. Lent is a time we humbly and honestly recognize that we need to be saved....and it is only in Christ - by his passion, death, and resurrection - that we are saved.

It is within this framework that we carry out our Lenten fast. All of our Lenten penance, self-denial, fasting, almsgiving, and prayer should be seen as the means by which we turn away from sin and back towards the Lord. When we strip away from ourselves all those surplus things that surround us, especially sin, we can more easily see that it is the Lord and the Lord alone who brings us completion and happiness.

St. John Chrysostom taught that the "value of fasting consists not so much in abstinence from food but rather in withdrawal from sinful practices." And St. Basil the Great explains: "Turning away from all wickedness means keeping our tongue in check, restraining our anger, suppressing evil desires, and avoiding all gossip, lying and swearing. To abstain from these things—herein lies the true value of fast!" Lent isn't just about giving up deserts or whatever. It is about true repentance. If our Lenten penance is not helping us to come closer to the Lord then we are doing something wrong. As St. John Chrysostom said, "it is folly to abstain all day long from food but fail to abstain from sin."

When we choose not to have that piece of chocolate cake or bag of Doritos, or when we abstain from meat on Fridays, or when we make the effort to pray more, come to Mass during the week or to come to Adoration or Stations of the Cross, or be more generous to the poor and needy, do it with a prayer. Say to the Lord, "I make this offering to you Lord, in love, to enable me to open my heart to the vast power of your love, transform me into your likeness; help me to see that union with you is my goal and it is you alone who can help me reach it."

I urge you, my friends, to take every opportunity this Lent to come closer to our loving God. Don't forget the value of receiving the Lord's forgiveness in Confession as an integral part of your Lent. I look forward to making this wonderful spiritual pilgrimage with you as we prepare for the celebration of Christ's glorious resurrection at Easter.






