

Sacrament of Penance Exhorted as, "Indispensable"

Some time ago I had the opportunity to be with some of my high school classmates. As always it was a great time. Having a priest as a classmate (from a Catholic school as well) one can imagine that the topic of religion will inevitably come up. One of the persistent topics that come up is the often strong resistance to the sacrament of Penance (Confession). I try my best in these situations to explain its value and importance. It is not an easy task to change people's minds about this and it is quite a shame. This great sacrament of God's mercy was given to us by the Lord exactly to show us his love for us, how silly for us to think that it isn't useful or necessary for us when we have received it from the hand of God himself? Below is an excerpt from the late Pope Benedict about the Sacrament of Penance.

Benedict XVI called the administration of the sacrament of penance an "indispensable ministry" that aids the faithful along the "demanding road of sanctity." "Every priest," the Pontiff said, "is called to administer divine mercy in the sacrament of penance, through which in the name of Christ he remits sins and helps the penitent to continue along the demanding road of sanctity with a right and informed conscience."

"To be able to accomplish this indispensable ministry, every priest must nourish his own spiritual life and take care to be theologically and pastorally up to date," he added. In our time, Benedict XVI observed, "forming a right conscience among believers ... undoubtedly constitutes a pastoral priority," because, "to the extent that a sense of sin is lost, unfortunately the sense of guilt grows, which people try to eliminate with insufficient palliative remedies."

"[M]any precious spiritual and pastoral instruments -- which must be valued more and more -- contribute to the formation of conscience," the Pope noted. Besides the sacrament of reconciliation, he also pointed to catechesis, preaching, homilies, spiritual direction and the celebration of the Holy Eucharist. Beginning with the first of these elements, the Pontiff emphasized "how all the sacraments, even that of Penance, require a prior catechesis to go more deeply into the sacrament 'per ritus et preces' ['through rites and prayers']."

An adequate catechesis, the Holy Father said, helps us "always better to perceive the sense of sin, which today is fading, or worse, obscured by a way of thinking and living 'as if there were no God'." Together with catechesis, Benedict XVI said there should be a "wise use of preaching," which in the history of the Church "has had varying forms according to the mentality and pastoral needs of the faithful." In regard to homilies, the Pope said that with the reform desired by the Second Vatican Council, "they have reacquired their 'sacramental' role in the single act of worship constituted by the liturgy of the Word and that of the Eucharist." The homily, he added, is "of course the most common way that the conscience of millions of faithful is educated every Sunday."

The celebration of the Eucharist is relevant in the same way: The Holy Father called for "a devout and conscious participation" of the faithful in the Mass and for the priest to remember that in this mystery "the Blood of Christ is poured out for the remission of sins, through which, in the sacramental participation in the sacrifice of the cross, each one of us meets with the Father's mercy."

We are so fortunate here at Holy Angels Parish to have all of our priests here willing to extend God's mercy though the Sacrament of Penance. As a reminder, we have Confessions after the 9:00AM Mass Monday-Friday, Saturdays 3:00-4:15PM in St. Patrick's Church and 4:30-5:15PM at St. Matthew's Church. During Lent we have Confessions on Thursday evening at 7:00PM. If those times aren't convenient, give us a call and we would be happy to see you when you are able. Jesus loves us very much and the forgiveness of our sins in the Sacrament of Penance is one of the greatest signs of that love! As I tell the children when we have them for confessions, "We never have to be afraid of God's love!"

DISPENSATION

The Second Vatican Council has taught that "During Lent, penance should be not only internal and individual but also external and social." (SC, 109) In keeping with this very ancient and spiritually fruitful tradition, the Catechism of the Catholic Church also draws attention to the fifth precept of the Church, to "observe the prescribed days of fasting and abstinence" which among other things, serve to "prepare us for the liturgical feasts" and "help us acquire mastery over our instincts and freedom of heart." (CCC, 2043)

With due regard for this precept of the Church which, in the spirit of this sacred season, binds Catholics who have completed their fourteenth year of age to abstain from eating meat on the Fridays of Lent; (cf. Can. 1252) the Church in her wisdom has also legislated that "A diocesan bishop, whenever he judges that it contributes to their spiritual good, is able to dispense the faithful from universal and particular disciplinary laws issued for his territory or his subjects by the supreme authority of the Church..." (Can. 87, S 1)

Therefore, noting that this year in the Church's calendar, March 17th, the Memorial of Saint Patrick (Saint Patrick's Day) will also coincide with Friday of the Third Week of Lent; and with the understanding that this is a day of many annual celebrations by Catholics within the Diocese of Camden;

I Hereby Dispense Catholics who are within the territory of the Diocese of Camden on Saint Patrick's Day, Friday, March 17, 2023 from the Lenten obligation to abstain from eating meat.

Nevertheless, in order to maintain the solemn spirit of the Holy Season of Lent, I also ask the Catholics within the Diocese of Camden who chose to utilize this dispensation from meat abstinence on the Memorial of Saint Patrick, to instead either make another appropriate sacrifice on the day itself or to abstain from meat on another weekday during the Third Week of Lent.

Given in Camden on the 27th day of February, in the Year of Our-Lord 2023.

FASTING—All persons age 18 and older, up to and including their 59th birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on **Ash Wednesday and Good Friday**, while the other two meals are to be light.

PHISING EXPEDITIONS!

This info may help you when you think you received an email from Fr. Byerley.



A phishing e-mail is a bogus e-mail that is carefully designed to look like a legitimate request (or attached file) from a site you trust in an effort to get you to willingly give up your login information to a particular website or to click and download a virus.

Often these e-mails look 100% legitimate and show up in the form of a PDF (scanned document) or a UPS or FedEx tracking number, bank letter, Facebook alert, bank notification, etc. That's what makes these so dangerous – they LOOK exactly like a legitimate e-mail. So, how can you tell a phishing e-mail from a legitimate one? Here are a few telltale signs...

First, double-check the e-mail. You might discover that the e-mail from the boss is actually from a Gmail account and not the company e-mail.

Second, hover over the URL in the e-mail (but DON'T CLICK!) to see the ACTUAL website you'll be directed to. If there's a mismatched or suspicious URL, delete the e-mail immediately.

If you're unsure, simply go directly to the site (typing it into your browser) rather than clicking on the link. Another telltale sign is poor grammar and spelling errors.



Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is a sacramental process that prepares adults to be received into the Catholic Church. Persons who complete the process receive the sacraments of Baptism (if not yet baptized), First Eucharist, and Confirmation.

RCIA begins after each Easter season with a rolling open enrollment and continues to the following Easter season. The process is also available for Catholics who have never received the sacraments of First Eucharist and/or Confirmation.




