

Tolerance

According to Dictionary.com the principal definition for tolerance is: a fair, objective, and permissive attitude toward those whose opinions, practices, race, religion, nationality, etc., differ from one's own; freedom from bigotry. That's not a bad start but it is a somewhat distorted modern spin on the root meaning of the word. The definition of tolerance on the Merriam-Webster site is this: capacity to endure pain or hardship: endurance, fortitude, stamina. This definition is more in keeping with the original meaning which we have received from the Latin word "tolerare" which means "to bear, endure". We "tolerate" something that displeases us. We don't "tolerate" chocolate or pizza or a nice wine (unless we don't like them to begin with). We tolerate Aunt Matilda's horrible fruit cake (at least in front of her), we might tolerate the person in the express line with a full cart of groceries, and we tolerate our nosey neighbor's constant questions. In all these examples, we tolerate, or endure, things that we don't like, things that displease us; we don't tolerate things we like. That's what toleration means.


When it comes to people's views on different issues, the same sense of tolerance should come in to play, we "endure" or "bear" the opinion or view that we don't like or with which we don't agree. But do we? Should we? Yes, we should. But it seems in our culture today that when we are told to "be tolerant" we are not merely being asked to endure something we don't like, what we are really being told to do is to approve and support something with which we disagree. And when someone resists approving or supporting something, the person is called intolerant.

In 1931, Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen (well known for his writing and preaching and especially his work on television and radio) took quite a different track in an essay he wrote entitled: "A Plea for Intolerance". It's interesting to note that what we are experiencing today isn't all that new. Here is a quote from the essay:

America, it is said, is suffering from intolerance—it is not. It is suffering from tolerance. Tolerance of right and wrong, truth and error, virtue and evil, Christ and chaos. Our country is not nearly so overrun with the bigoted as it is overrun with the broadminded. . . . Tolerance is an attitude of reasoned patience toward evil, a forbearance that restrains us from showing anger or inflicting punishment. Tolerance applies only to persons, never to truth. Tolerance applies to the erring, intolerance to the error. . . . Architects are as intolerant about sand as foundations for skyscrapers as doctors are intolerant about germs in the laboratory. Tolerance does not apply to truth or principles. About these things we must be intolerant, and for this kind of intolerance, so much needed to rouse us from sentimental gush, I make a plea. Intolerance of this kind is the foundation of all stability.

It is worthwhile noting the wisdom here. For too long the cultural discussion had been too often led and controlled by those, who in many ways, deny fundamental truths about humanity. All in the name of a warped one-sided view of tolerance that states, "you must tolerate (accept and support) me and my position but I don't have to tolerate you". Perhaps we should take Venerable Fulton J. Sheen's words to heart and start standing up without fear and with ardent passion for the truths in which we believe. Because if we don't, we will likely be beaten down into little dark holes and forced to obey by the so called "tolerant" culture of today.

Joseph's House VolunteersYou are so very incredible to us here at **Joseph's House!** Whether it's heating up casseroles, delivering sandwiches, organizing donations, gardening, spending time with our guests, sharing our stories on social media or even hanging up artwork in our facility, the volunteers at Joseph's HOUSE are always ready and willing to dive in and help where necessary. We couldn't possibly do the work we do without your continued commitment to our mission.

Today, I'm messaging you about an urgent need: due to a variety of factors (chief among them inflation, the elusive unicorn of "affordable housing" and summer being our slowest donation season of the year), we are beginning to struggle with feeding our guests. Schools that used to provide a steady supply of sandwiches are off for the summer, groups that have been incredibly generous throughout the pandemic have, due to inflation, been forced to cut back on donations, and the cost of basic staples like bread, lunchmeat and peanut butter have continued to rise.

Currently, we feed about 75 guests per day. That's 225 individual meals (breakfast, lunch, and dinner) per day, and 1,500 individual meals over the course of a week. That's to say nothing of those experiencing homelessness not rostered who also come to our door in need.

We are in desperate need of help, especially through these summer months.

If you have any resources which would help us as we try to maintain our cupboards, we would be most appreciative. We have volunteer groups who can make sandwiches if you'd like to provide the ingredients, and we also have room in those groups if you'd like to help us make those sandwiches. We have large freezers to store casseroles if you have the means and ability to prepare them. Several volunteers have offered to pick up casseroles for those who can prepare them but not deliver them.

Therefore, our immediate needs include:

Bottled Water Sandwiches (PB&J or Meat & Cheese) Individual Bags of Chips Brown Lunch Bags Casseroles

There are many opportunities for you to join us in our effort to respond to the growing needs in the heart of Camden. Any help you can provide would be most appreciated.

As always, thank you so much for all you do to enable us to serve these forgotten members of our community.





MONTHLY BOOK STUDY: JULIAN OF NORWICH B. 1343

Julian is a fourteenth century mystic known for her

positive theology written in her work: The Revelation of Divine Love. Many might be familiar with the writings of St. Faustina and her Chaplet of Divine Mercy, made popular by Pope St. John Paul II. Julian's work predates St. Faustina by 600 years.

Julian wrote in her Sixth Showing (or mystical vision):

God's love for us is so great that it surpasses the understanding of any living being. Not a creature in all of creation can know how completely and how sweetly and with what infinite tenderness he loves us. Only with his grace and his assistance can we persevere in spiritual contemplation and maintain the awe and wonder that arise in our hearts in response to the soaring, transcendent, immeasurable love that the almighty God, in his goodness, has for us.

Join me in reading the writings of Juliana over the next few months. We will meet once a month to discuss the assigned readings from her work. Her writings may give rise to questions, faith sharing and deeper insight into God's love for us and the beauty of our Christian life.

We will have our first meeting on Thursday, June 30 at 7PM in the Parish Center classroom. We meet once a month.

Remember, Lectio is a spiritual practice of reading a Scripture and slowly extracting from it meaning for my life. Guido II (1114-1193), a Carthusian Monk, wrote of this practice and saw Lectio as a "four step ladder" that takes one to God. He directs us to read a text progressively, four times: First reading: read the text. Second reading: mediate on the text, Third reading: pray on the text, Fourth reading: contemplate the text. 
