The Universal Church

I was blessed to guide a trip to Italy with a few families a few years ago. We had planned it for over a year, and finally the time had come. The trip turned out to be a wonderful experience, despite record high temperatures in Rome, daily reaching the 100 degree mark. Everyone had a great time and we saw some pretty amazing things. Of course, that's pretty tough not to do when in Rome. There is one event that I remember in particular and really struck me as a great snapshot of the Church. We arrived in Rome on a Saturday afternoon, and after getting all squared away in our place and had something to eat, it was time to plan our first touring day of Rome.

Of course, the next day being Sunday, we needed to go to Mass as well. One of the places that was part of our itinerary was the major basilica of Saint Mary Major. According to the never wrong Internet, there was an English Mass at 8:00am at that church (something the five teenagers loved to hear...they were hoping for more of a 12 Noon Mass, I think). So all ten of us get rolling early in the morning and make it to this very beautiful church with about 15 minutes to spare. I went into the sacristy to see if I could concelebrate the English Mass only to find out that there was no English Mass at 8:00 am, only Italian. I was welcome to concelebrate that if I liked. There was another priest there, also on a pilgrimage with a group from southern Italy, we chatted a little, mostly about the heat!

The Mass was celebrated by one of the priests of the Basilica in one of the many beautiful chapels and I was really blessed to be there. My group was there, along with the other group from Italy, and a lot of others who were coming to their regular 8:00 am Sunday Mass. I helped distribute the Holy Eucharist and I couldn't help but notice the complete diversity of the people at the Mass. They were from all over the world. People on pilgrimage, tourists, residents of Rome, students, religious sisters, local Romans, you name it. I think every continent was represented except, perhaps, Antarctica. Here we were at the local 8:00 am Mass and literally the whole world was there. It's no wonder that we also call the Holy Eucharist, Holy Communion. Not just because we are united to Christ when we receive Him, and not that we are just united with the people in the church at that particular Mass, but also that we are united with all Catholics throughout the world when we celebrate the Eucharistic Sacrifice. Although we all probably know that intellectually, to experience it right before my eyes was a profound moment.

Realizing how the Holy Eucharist unites us first to Christ, and then, because of being united to the Lord, also being united with everyone in the Mystical Body of Christ (which is the Church) is an important spiritual reality. The recognition of our common unity in Christ should help us to be open and willing to help all our fellow believers; especially those that are suffering. I am thinking of our brothers and sisters right here in our neighborhoods who are hurting, those in parts of the world that are very poor, and particularly those in the Middle East and China who are now suffering tremendous and unprecedented persecution for being followers of Christ. All of these people are our brothers and sisters, not just our friends across the street or who sit next to us at the pool. We are all one family in Christ, united by His Body and Blood. May we always strive to live as the one family that we are.

Remember, Lectio is a spiritual practice of reading a Scripture and slowly extracting from it meaning for my life. Guido II (1114-1193), a Carthusian Monk, wrote of this practice and saw Lectio as a "four step ladder" that takes one to God. He directs us to read a text progressively, four times: **First reading: read the text. Second reading: mediate on the text, Third reading: pray on the text, Fourth reading: contemplate the text.** It is a practice of taking the text ever deeper into our daily lives. Come and learn.
