

The Fourth of July

Anymore it's hard to talk about our wonderful country without appearing to be pushing some political agenda or another. That is a very, very sad thing. For we do have a wonderful country built on principles that have their very roots in the teachings of our Lord. I don't know exactly how religious our Founding Fathers were, but they did have a pretty well-formed Christian foundation and much of this found its way into our laws and principles upon which our government was founded. While we may not, individually or the country as a whole, always follow these principles, but we are very fortunate to have them and to be protected by them. Our representative democracy, the balance of powers and free-market economic system give us the freedom, opportunity and protection that have been the hallmark of our country from its foundation as well as the envy of many nations. It's true that we have not always exercised our democracy the best. Because of this, we always must be vigilant in maintaining the highest possible ethical and moral behavior. In fact, we should demand it from our elected officials. Our system can only be effective in promoting our welfare if those in authority are moral and just.

Of course, it is easy to point the finger at those in the government but we are the ones who put them there, whether it was by our vote or by our apathy. It is part of our civic responsibility to be informed, active members of the political process. We need to find out what the people running for office really believe, beyond their campaign rhetoric. Look at how they vote. Look at how they act. Do they support our Christian faith and beliefs or do they support positions that are contrary to our faith? I am not calling for a theocracy, but if we believe God has revealed to us a moral code that is designed to promote the wellbeing of all humanity, not just believers, why would we not seek to elect officials who would promote God's vision of humanity?

As citizens of a common state we have a social responsibility to support the common good of all, not just ourselves individually. I feel that a large part of the political hostility that we see nowadays, where one side disagrees with the other no matter what the position, is due principally by an erosion in looking to the common good. Sometimes we are so concerned about ourselves and our narrow interests that we resist attempting to ensure sure everyone benefits. And in the end, when the majority works for the common good, then everyone does benefit - usually more than if each was working for his or her own good alone.

Our country has been and continues to be an example of freedom and opportunity to the rest of the world. We should be very grateful to our Lord that he consented for us to be Americans, despite our imperfections. As we celebrate our Independence Day and the founding of our country, let us do so with great thanks for all of the blessings we receive as citizens of this great country and recommit ourselves to working toward the good of all who live in the land of the free and the home of the brave.

Joseph's HOUSE VOLUNTEERS
You are so very incredible to us here at Joseph's HOUSE! Whether it's heating up casseroles, delivering sandwiches, organizing donations, gardening, spending time with our guests, sharing our stories on social media or even hanging up artwork in our facility, the volunteers at *Joseph's* HOUSE are always ready and willing to dive in and help where necessary. We couldn't possibly do the work we do without your continued commitment to our mission.

Today, I'm messaging you about an urgent need: due to a variety of factors (chief among them inflation, the elusive unicom of "affordable housing" and summer being our slowest donation season of the year), we are beginning to struggle with feeding our guests. Schools that used to provide a steady supply of sandwiches are off for the summer, groups that have been incredibly generous throughout the pandemic have, due to inflation, been forced to cut back on donations, and the cost of basic staples like bread, lunchmeat and peanut butter have continued to rise.

Currently, we feed about 75 guests per day. That's 225 individual meals (breakfast, lunch, and dinner) per day, and 1,500 individual meals over the course of a week. That's to say nothing of those experiencing homelessness not rostered who also come to our door in need.

We are in desperate need of help, especially through these summer months.

If you have any resources which would help us as we try to maintain our cupboards, we would be most appreciative. We have volunteer groups who can make sandwiches if you'd like to provide the ingredients, and we also have room in those groups if you'd like to help us make those sandwiches. We have large freezers to store casseroles if you have the means and ability to prepare them. Several volunteers have offered to pick up casseroles for those who can prepare them but not deliver them.

Therefore, our immediate needs include: Bottled Water, Sandwiches (PB&J or Meat & Cheese) Individual Bags of Chips, Brown Lunch Bags. Casseroles

There are many opportunities for you to join us in our effort to respond to the growing needs in the heart of Camden. Any help you can provide would be most appreciated.

As always, thank you so much for all you do to enable us to serve these forgotten members of our community.




FORMED NOW! CATHOLIC SPIRITUALITY AND BASEBALL

MONTHLY BOOK STUDY: JULIAN OF NORWICH B. 1343

Julian is a fourteenth century mystic known for her positive theology written in her work:

The Revelation of Divine Love. Many might be familiar with

The Revelation of Divine Love. Many might be familiar with the writings of St. Faustina and her Chaplet of Divine Mercy, made popular by Pope St. John Paul II. Julian's work predates St. Faustina by 600 years.

Julian wrote in her Sixth Showing (or mystical vision):

God's love for us is so great that it surpasses the understanding of any living being. Not a creature in all of creation can know how completely and how sweetly and with what infinite tenderness he loves us. Only with his grace and his assistance can we persevere in spiritual contemplation and maintain the awe and wonder that arise in our hearts in response to the soaring, transcendent, immeasurable love that the almighty God, in his goodness, has for us.

Join me in reading the writings of Juliana over the next few months. We will meet once a month to discuss the assigned readings from her work. Her writings may give rise to questions, faith sharing and deeper insight into God's love for us and the beauty of our Christian life.

Remember, Lectio is a spiritual practice of reading a Scripture and slowly extracting from it meaning for my life. Guido II (1114-1193), a Carthusian Monk, wrote of this practice and saw Lectio as a "four step ladder" that takes one to God. He directs us to read a text progressively, four times: First reading: read the text. Second reading: mediate on the text, Third reading: pray on the text, Fourth reading: contemplate the text.
