

August 15th and other Holy Days

August 15th is the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary. Generally, it is a Holy Day of Obligation. But this year, the feast falls on a Monday and therefore the requirement to attend Mass is lifted. Since this is an important feast day of the Church, and even though not a holy Day of Obligation this year, we will be offering an additional Mass at 7:00pm on Monday, August 15th, to celebrate Our Lady's assumption, body and soul, into heaven. I do hope as many of you as possible will take a bit of extra time out of your busy schedules to honor the blessed Mother and worship her Son as we celebrate this beautiful feast day of our Faith.

This might be a good time to go into a little of the history of Holy Days in general.

From very early on the Church recognized the value of observing certain feast days that commemorate connected to the life of Christ, the Virgin Mary, other saints or important moments in the an event Church. Often, these celebrations were instituted by a local bishop and observed only locally. Over time, some of these, because of their connection to salvation history, became required celebrations throughout the universal Church. The official list is found in the Code of Canon Law (the legal code of the Church) Canon No. 1246. It reads, "§1. Sunday, on which by apostolic tradition the paschal mystery is celebrated, must be observed in the universal Church as the primordial holy day of obligation. The following days must also be observed: the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Epiphany, the Ascension, the Body and Blood of Christ, Holy Mary the Mother of God, her Immaculate Conception, her Assumption, Saint Joseph, Saint Peter and Saint Paul the All Saints. §2. With the prior approval of the Apostolic See, however, the Apostles, and conference of bishops can suppress some of the holy days of obligation or transfer them to a Sunday."

The US Bishops have petitioned the Vatican for permission to revise the Holy Day regulations in the United States from time to time, moving some of the Holy Days to Sunday (Epiphany, the Ascension (just recently in our area), The Body and Blood of Christ). Even though still Solemnities, the feasts of Saint Joseph, Saint Peter and Saint Paul the Apostles are no longer Holy Days of Obligation. Others, if falling on a Monday or Saturday are not Holy Days of Obligations.

The Holy Day regulations for the United States are the following:

In addition to Sunday, the days to be observed as holy days of obligation in the Latin Rite dioceses of the United States of America, in conformity with Canon 1246, are as follows:

January 1, the solemnity of Mary, Mother of God;

August 15, the solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary;

November 1, the solemnity of All Saints:

December 8, the solemnity of the Immaculate Conception;

December 25, the solemnity of the Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

Whenever January 1, the solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, or August 15, the solemnity of the Assumption, or November 1, the solemnity of All Saints, falls on a Saturday or on a Monday, the precept to attend Mass is abrogated (i.e. not required).

I hope this explanation of Holy Days was helpful to you.

He directs us to read a text progressively, four times: First reading: read the text. Second reading: mediate on the text, Third reading: pray on the text, Fourth reading: contemplate the text. Last year, Holy Angels made 4,383 PB&J sandwiches for the homeless at Joseph's House in Camden. These sandwiches represent the work of the youth group, service projects and a faithful group of about six families that regularly contribute sandwiches. Last year our contribution was about 365 sandwiches a month. This year, so far, we are contributing approximately 541 sandwiches per month! *Thank You* for your charity. I do not want to forget all those who contribute the Casseroles used at Joseph's House. Jerry Campbell does a great job in coordinating that project.

Anne Connor continues to work hard on the Pro-Life aspect of social justice and John Carlucci of the Knights of Columbus keeps abreast of legal issues in the State that may contain important matters that pertain to Catholic Social Teachings. The Knights had been collecting diapers to help our young mothers.

Your contributions to our St. Vincent de Paul Society are also very appreciated. Society members work silently but persistently with the heart break issues that engage families and individuals in our community, whether parishioners or not.

Our Food Pantry has been a great blessing all through the Covid experience for many and continues to deliver to those haunted by lack of food. Your weekly contribution of a food item is a great help in feeding those not so fortunate. Remember to bring at least one food item when you come to church. If you check the website (www.gwcm.org) you can see what items, the Pantry might be especially needing.

Faith without action, St. James says, is useless. It is our deeds that put our faith into action, that makes our faith visible and alive.
