

Genuflection

In the celebration of Mass we raise our hearts, minds and voices in worship of God. As creatures composed of body and spirit, our prayer is not confined to our minds and hearts, but is expressed by our bodies as well. When our bodies participate in our prayer, we pray with our whole person, as the unity of body and soul God created us to be.

During Mass we assume different postures: standing, kneeling, sitting, and we are also invited to make a variety of gestures. These postures and gestures are not merely ceremonial; they are ways in which we engage our bodies in prayer. Postures and gestures in Mass and prayer have deep meaning and, when done with intent with understanding, they help us to be more focused on our prayer and more receptive to God's grace and love.

Because of this, the profound importance of a simple genuflection can now be appreciated. A genuflection is the action begun from a standing position in which a worshiper drops the right knee briefly to the floor, and then stands upright again. Most people naturally bow their head while performing this action; some make the sign of the cross. Some hold onto a nearby pew for physical support. A genuflection is not merely some ancient ritualistic movement; its purpose is to allow the worshiper to engage his whole person in acknowledging the presence of and to honor Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist.

Here at Holy Angels the tabernacle containing our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament is found in the center at the back part of the sanctuary in both of our churches. We are all asked, required in fact by Church law, to make a genuflection toward the tabernacle before entering and after leaving our seat as a way of affirming and strengthening their faith in the presence of Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. It is also a fitting way to show honor, love, and devotion to our Lord. One should note that according to the Church's liturgical guidelines a bow is only to be used if we are carrying an object. A bow is not a replacement for a genuflection, unless one cannot physically genuflect.

Although genuflection towards the Lord in the tabernacle unfortunately doesn't seem to be stressed or encouraged as much as in the past, it is still the "rule" and explicitly part of who we are as Catholics. And when understood properly, it is also a vital gesture that shows the Lord we believe He is present and gives Him the honor due to Him as our Savior.

As we begin in the Church in the United States a "Eucharistic Revival" in order to combat the loss of faith in the Real Presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist, rediscovering the meaning and value of genuflection might assist us in our own personal revival as well as in the Church. May we take every opportunity to show the Lord we believe in His presence by reverently genuflecting as we enter and leave the Church and whenever we cross in front of the tabernacle. It would certainly be appropriate at the same time, to say a word or two of prayer to the Lord acknowledging our faith in His abiding presence in the Most Holy Eucharist







CREMATION AND PROPER HANDLING OF CREMATED REMAIN




Cremated remains are the body of the deceased in a changed form. We should honor them as we honor the body. They must be reverently buried or entombed in a place reserved for the burial of the dead.


