Bruce Springsteen meme

Whether you like Bruce Springsteen's music or don't or like his political statements or don't, I hope a recent event can bring some cause for reflection for us in our highly volatile culture. First a little background. About a month ago, during a concert, Springsteen stopped performing and sat down on stage and went on a tirade against President Trump calling him and his administration "corrupt" "incompetent" and "treasonous". President Trump did not take that well, and responded by calling Springsteen "just a pushy, obnoxious jerk" and stated that this "dried out 'prune' of a rocker" should "keep his mouth shut."

Not too long after that on social media there was a meme that stated that Springsteen, because of his verbal attack of the president, was booed off the stage at a concert in Atlanta. The source of the meme was a self-proclaimed satirical Facebook page that states on the page itself, "nothing on this page is real." Nonetheless, the meme was picked up and passed on all around as true for a day or so before the truth was realized. There were tons of people elated that Bruce was booed off the stage and there were tons of people angered that he was booed of the stage. A lot of people got all wound up about it. And it never happened.

When I saw the meme, I thought to myself, like I usually do when this sort of thing shows up, "Is this really true?" A five second Google search showed that it wasn't. How quickly we "like" and "share" things so often without vetting the source. Now a silly feud Springsteen and Trump might not be a big deal. But on a much more important level than unquestioningly liking something on social media, is this question; how easily do we repeat a story we hear about someone? And true or not, how often do we not consider the impact it might have if we pass the story along? The damage that we can do to each other can be great.

The care and concern and love we are obliged to show to our neighbors, as followers of Jesus Christ, necessarily includes what we say about them to others. The Eighth Commandment forbids us from doing injury to our neighbor through our words; it is a sin against justice and love. The two main ways in which we can violate the Eighth commandment are detraction and calumny (or slander). Detraction is the unjust violation of the good reputation of another by revealing something true about him. Slander differs from detraction in that what is said about a person is untrue. Closely connected with detraction and slander is rash judgment, where we adopt an unquestioning belief about another person's bad conduct without adequate grounds. We need to remember that a person's good name is tremendously valuable. We may not do it injury by revealing, without a proportionately grave reason, what we know is true, and especially by telling lies about that person.

It takes self-control and an explicit desire to guard our tongues against gossip, detraction, slander rash judgment, etc. Overcoming the temptation to these is difficult but possible. As with any other vice, the building up of the opposing virtue is the primary step in correcting the fault. We must be first honest and conscious of our tendency to engage in these vices and then just as consciously, seek to give people the benefit of the doubt -- even if such benefit might be doubtful. We cause each other so much pain and grief because of our wagging tongues. People's lives have been and can be destroyed when providing us a just few minutes of banter at the gym, the athletic fields, the store, our social media posts, etc.

So above all, we need to keep our mouths shut and our fingers off the send button. And trust that God who is the judge of all will ensure that the truth comes out in the end and everyone will be treated as he or she deserves. It is not our job to judge, it is God's. When we take on that role, and engage in detraction, slander, rash judgment or gossip, we not only unfairly harm others, we endanger our souls.

One way of looking at this is to reflect on the virtual impossibility of undoing the damage we cause by our unjust speech. One can't un-pull a trigger, one can't un-ring a bell, and one can't put toothpaste back into the tube once it is squeezed all out. Just so, we can't undo the damage we cause by unjust speech toward our brothers and sisters. God will help us to control our tongues and use them for good rather than for harm, but we first must acknowledge our need to change and strive, aided by God's grace, to use our words for good purposes rather than for harm.
