

Freedom, Truth, and Culture

As we have just celebrated our country's independence, and remain grateful for the tremendous blessings we have in the United States, let's remember what the real foundation of our country is. Below is an enlightening quote from President John Adams that resonates as much today, as it did when he wrote it towards the beginning of our nation.

"We have no government armed with power capable of contending with human passions unbridled by morality and religion. Avarice, ambition, revenge or gallantry would break the strongest cords of our Constitution as a whale goes through a net. Our Constitution is designed only for a moral and religious people. It is wholly inadequate for any other."

- - John Adams (1735-1826), Second President of the United States

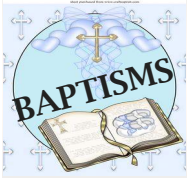
I think this quote to be very powerful. John Adams makes the same point in a secular way that Pope Saint John Paul II made many times in his theological writings. The point is this: the freedom that democracy brings is not unlimited and will unravel into decadence unless it is bound by truth and morality. Pope John Saint Paul II in his first encyclical *Redemptor Hominis* (1979) quoted the words of Christ, "You will know the truth, and the truth will make you free." He then stated: "These words contain both a fundamental requirement and a warning: the requirement of an honest relationship with regard to truth as a condition for authentic freedom, and the warning to avoid every kind of illusory freedom, every superficial unilateral freedom, every freedom that fails to enter into the whole truth about man and the world." Lord Acton (1834–1902) a member of the British House of Commons, who was denied entrance to Cambridge University because he was Catholic, stated it this way, "[freedom] is not the power of doing what we like, but the right of being able to do what we ought."

This concept also includes the how laws are instituted. In the encyclical letter *Veritatis Splendor* (1993) Pope Saint John Paul II wrote, "Law must therefore be considered an expression of divine wisdom: by submitting to the law, freedom submits to the truth of creation. Consequently one must acknowledge in the freedom of the human person the image and the nearness of God, who is present in all (cf. Eph 4:6). But one must likewise acknowledge the majesty of the God of the universe and revere the holiness of the law of God, who is infinitely transcendent."

Later, while explicitly commending democracy for the freedom that it brings, Pope Saint John Paul II also expressed concern about the danger that is posed by unbridled democracy. In his encyclical, *Centesimus Annus* (1991) he states, "Nowadays there is a tendency to claim that agnosticism and skeptical relativism are the philosophy and the basic attitude which correspond to democratic forms of political life. Those who are convinced that they know the truth and firmly adhere to it are considered unreliable from a democratic point of view, since they do not accept that truth is determined by the majority or that it is subject to variation according to different political trends." Once again, the Holy Father expresses the necessary connection between freedom and truth. It is important for all of us who are members of this great democratic country to understand the value and power of culture as the driving force behind the success and failure of a society. A culture that is free yet bound to truth of God can drive market forces, legislation, politics, international relations, and all other societal actions in a way that offers the greatest benefit to all. On the other hand, a culture that is not bound to truth will be in a constant state of contention as rival factions seek to win power over each other, ultimately resulting in a society that is weak and unjust; one that cannot last.

Our role in promoting the well being of our society is, while avoiding the concept of a theocracy, to seek leaders who embrace and uphold the truth that comes from God, while we as citizens must be the moral and religious people about which President Adams spoke. In this way we ensure a strong future for our country and become a true world leader, not in power of arms or in power of economy, but in the power of truth and the power of the love of God.

HOW MANY PEANUT BUTTER AND JELLY SANDWICHES DO YOU THINK HOLY ANGELS MADE FOR JOSEPH'S HOUSE OF CAMDEN IN 2023?

The answer is 6,487. (2020=4,691 2021=4,383 2022=6,251)

This total was produced by approximately 6 families and the youth group who prepare sandwiches on a regular basis as part of the Life and Justice Ministry of the parish.

Frequently asked questions about the Peanut Butter and Jelly Club at Holy Angels:

1. When do you take the sandwiches to Joseph's house?
Whenever they are made.
2. How often do the families make the sandwiches?
That is decided by the members of the family groups. Some do weekly, some monthly, bi-monthly....whatever works for the group.
3. How many sandwiches should a family make?
That is decided by each family group; it varies from one or two loaves of bread (appr. 11-22 sandwiches) to 65 – 88 sandwiches. Youth Group usually contributes 100 sandwiches.
4. What kind of jelly do you use?
Most use grape but some have been creative with other varieties
5. What is the process?
 - a. Buy your bread, jelly and sandwich bags—find your best prices
 - b. Whether you are doing this alone or with family and friends, set your date for gathering. Begin with a private or communal prayer as to what you are doing, “feeding the hungry as instructed by Jesus”
 - c. Place the bagged sandwiches back in the bread sleeve from whence the bread came.
 - d. Can we freeze the sandwiches?
Yes, if you have freezer space and need to freeze them, that is acceptable.
 - e. Call me on my cell: 856-304-0381 and arrange a delivery. I have picked sandwiches up at homes, at the Church and some deliver them to my home.
 - f. Is there a particular day you make a run to Joseph House?
NO! I run as I get sandwiches.

If you want to see the kind of work that is done with a simple Peanut Butter Jelly sandwich, just go to **Joseph's HOUSE** website at www.jhoc.org. See the pictures. Oftentimes in the newsletter they tell the story of how one of their guests received mental health or housing and became stable again.

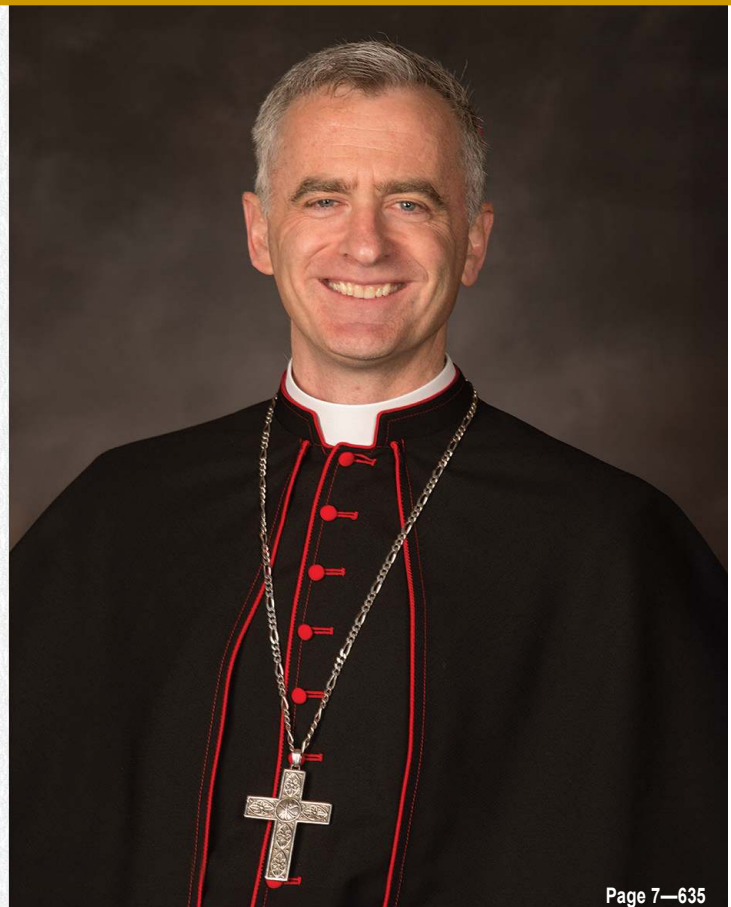

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults is a sacramental process that prepares adults to be received into the Catholic Church. Persons who complete the process receive the sacraments of Baptism (if not yet baptized), First Eucharist, and Confirmation.

OCIA begins after each Easter season with a rolling open enrollment and continues to the following Easter season. The process is also available for Catholics who have never received the sacraments of First Eucharist and/or Confirmation.

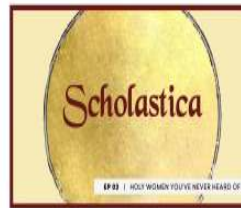
