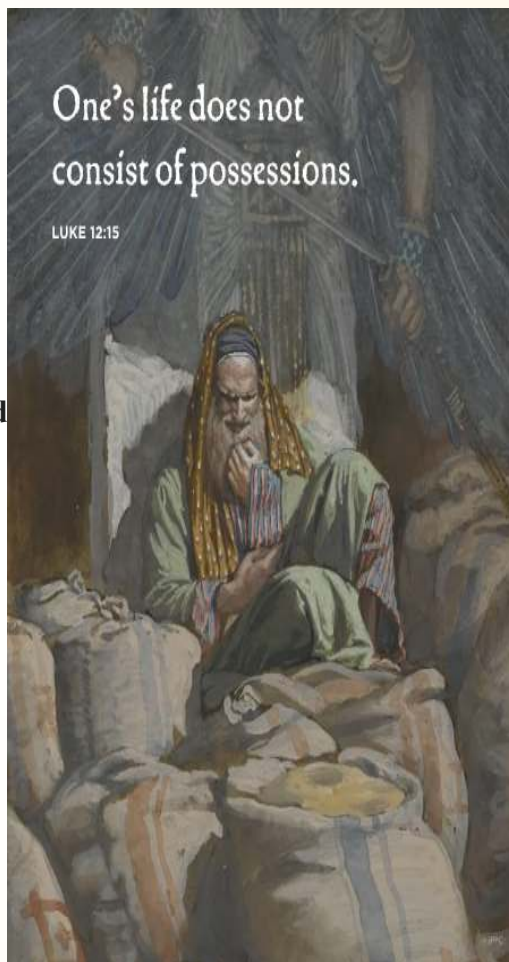

Common Good - Common Ground

Alexis de Tocqueville, the political scientist, historian, and politician famous for writing the four-volume series *Democracy in America* from 1835–40, gave a perceptive analysis of the political and social system of the United States. But he also gave great insights about its future. He wrote, *"I sought for the greatness and genius of America in her commodious harbors and her ample rivers – and it was not there . . . in her fertile fields and boundless forests and it was not there . . . in her rich mines and her vast world commerce – and it was not there . . . in her democratic Congress and her matchless Constitution – and it was not there. Not until I went into the churches of America and heard her pulpits aflame with righteousness did I understand the secret of her genius and power. America is great because she is good, and if America ever ceases to be good, she will cease to be great."*

"If America ever ceases to be good, she will cease to be great." De Tocqueville clearly understood that the strength of America was that its laws and societal structure were based on the goodness that comes from belief in and submission to the Eternal Law of God, from which all just law derives. He wrote further, *"As I see it, only God can be all-powerful without danger, because his wisdom and justice are always equal to his power. Thus there is no authority on earth so inherently worthy of respect, or invested with a right so sacred, that I would want to let it act without oversight or rule without impediment."* Separate our laws and our society from the law of God and we will cease to be great. And after ceasing to be great, we become depraved, at each other's throats at the merest provocation. Willing to escalate to violence and personal attacks on others without regard to either our common citizenship or more importantly without regard to the equal God-given human dignity that we all share as His children.

It seems that this is where we are right now. If someone disagrees with "our" side, or our opinion whatever it is, he or she is the enemy, is evil and can and should be treated with contempt. What a far cry from seeing each other as our brothers and sisters, no matter what differences we may have. We can talk about the common ground of citizenship as what should unite us, but it's really the moral order that comes from God that truly binds us. Ignore that and we will become unglued. Racial strife, riots, violence, incendiary rhetoric, the hate and hateful behavior that seems to be sadly the "new normal" is not just because of politics, it is because we, as a country, have lost our soul, lost our common acceptance of the universal moral authority of God. When we enshrine in the laws of our society behaviors that are contrary to God's law and fail to promote the common good, we become like a ship without a rudder, at the mercy of the wind and the current, those things precisely the rudder is designed to steer us through. Likewise, without the rudder of God's universal moral law, we are at the mercy of wind and the current of evil that seeks to smash us against the rocks of chaos, to shipwreck us, and to cause a hell on earth. A hell on earth that leads to an eternal hell.

The solution, or course, it to regain our common soul, the true common ground that will enable is to steer us through the forces that fight against our good. Jesus seeks to unite us; the devils seeks to divide us. Our first priority in our response is to restore the moral order in our individual lives, then in our families, then in or local communities, then in our nation. We do this first through confronting the evil and sinfulness in our own personal lives by conforming them to the Gospel aided by the grace of God. Then we can confront the evil outside of us, not by force or violence, but conquering it by love, by patience, by mercy, and by the truth that comes from God.

We all should commit right now firstly to open our hearts to the mercy and grace of God And secondly to see others with whom we disagree as our brothers and sisters, not as our enemies. While we may disagree and disagree even passionately, we need to treat others with the dignity and respect they deserve. Otherwise we fall right into the plan of the devil who wishes to cause us chaos and suffering, now and in the life to come. Jesus conquered Satan by his death and resurrection, so cling to him and the way he taught us; and through him we and our society can be transformed and enjoy the peace and security we for which we are created. But it all first begins with our submission to the universal moral law that God has given to us, both personally and in society. Infidelity to God is misery and chaos, fidelity to God is peace. That is why, in addition to reforming our own individual soul by submitting to the revealed moral truth of God, it is imperative also to promote God's truth in society without fear. All too often the evil one seeks to silence us with fear and the threat of being singled out. But that is a lie. Our Lord Jesus told us that the truth will set us free, not enslave us. There is right and wrong in the moral law God has given us. We are to live it in our own lives and proclaim it to others. If we want our society to be as good as it can be, then let us be gentle but ardent in courageously promoting the truth of God and his moral law, despite the challenges.

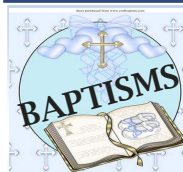

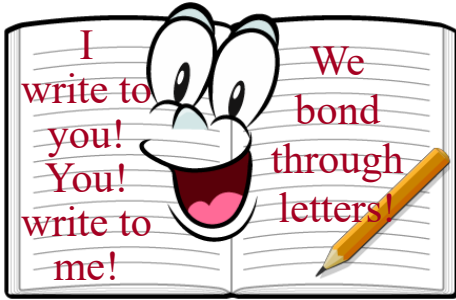

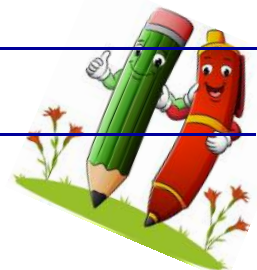

ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults is a sacramental process that prepares adults to be received into the Catholic Church. Persons who complete the process receive the sacraments of Baptism (if not yet baptized), First Eucharist, and Confirmation.

OCIA begins after each Easter season with a rolling open enrollment and continues to the following Easter season. The process is also available for Catholics who have never received the sacraments of First Eucharist and/or Confirmation.
