Labor Day

Pope St. John Paul II on Labor: "Sweat and toil, which work necessarily involves in the present condition of the human race, present the Christian and everyone who is called to follow Christ with the possibility of sharing lovingly in the work that Christ came to do. This work of salvation came about through suffering and death on a cross. By enduring the toil of work in union with Christ crucified for us, man in a way collaborates with the Son of God for the redemption of humanity. He shows himself a true disciple of Christ by carrying the cross in his turn every day in the activity that he is called upon to perform.

The Christian finds in human work a small part of the cross of Christ and accepts it in the same spirit of redemption in which Christ accepted his cross for us. In work, thanks to the light that penetrates us from the resurrection of Christ, we always find a glimmer of new life, of the new good, as if it were an announcement of "the new heavens and the new earth" in which man and the world participate precisely through the toil that goes with work. Through toil--and never without it. On the one hand this confirms the indispensability of the cross in the spirituality of human work; on the other hand the cross which this toil constitutes reveals a new good springing from work itself, from work understood in depth and in all its aspects and never apart from work.

Is this new good--the fruit of human work--already a small part of that "new earth" where justice dwells? If it is true that the many forms of toil that go with man's work are a small part of the cross of Christ, what is the relationship of this new good to the resurrection of Christ? The council seeks to reply to this question also, drawing light from the very sources of the revealed word: "Therefore, while we are warned that it profits a man nothing if he gains the whole world and loses himself (cf. Lk. 9:25), the expectation of a new earth must not weaken but rather stimulate our concern for cultivating this one. For here grows the body of a new human family, a body which even now is able to give some kind of foreshadowing of the new age. Earthly progress must be carefully distinguished from the growth of Christ's kingdom. Nevertheless, to the extent that the former can contribute to the better ordering of human society, it is of vital concern to the kingdom of God."



Back to School - Part 2

I remember the days when I was St. Rose Grammar School I used to look forward to the week before school started. My mom would take me out and I would get a new book bag. Book bags were the precursor to today's school backpacks (which are much cooler than book bags, I will easily admit). I would get some new pencils and pens and copybooks, and maybe a new pair of shoes. Wearing a uniform made it pretty easy for my mother in those days. It was exciting to go back to school. To be honest however, after the second week or so, I was ready for summer again. Nonetheless, education is very important and I look back with gratitude to God that I had the benefit of an excellent Catholic education. It is in this spirit that I commend all of our returning students to our Lord. Even when school seems like a pain and not too much fun, work as hard as possible for you will never get these days back. Even though I went to school for more years than I like to remember (24 years total of formal education...ugh!), I never liked school very much. But along the way, I did learn a lot. One important thing I learned along the way that as much as I disliked doing homework and studying, it's really important. I know now, from my own experience and from working with students, it's actually much easier to work a little bit all the time and not get behind, than to let things go and then have periods of crazy activity just to throw a bunch of stuff together just to get something in on time. You end up with better grades with less stress. It's a tough lesson to learn, but it works. Try it. Have a great year! Make the most of your education; you will be happy you did later on. God bless and protect all of our students, young and old. And may God bless our teachers as well; may they remain enthusiastic and effective in their very important role in society.


WOMEN NEEDED FOR THE SEVEN SISTERS APOSTOLATE!

FALL SCRIPTURE SESSION

The Scripture study this Fall will be **The Book of Genesis**. It will be a five sessions series covering the first half of this Biblical Book. (The Second half will follow.)

A study of the book of Genesis is an invitation not only to contemplate the creation story, but to remember with the Israelites **their ancestors in faith**. Part One of this study covers Genesis 1:1-25:18 (the “pre-history” of Israel including the creation accounts, the stories of the fall and the great flood, as well as the story of Abraham and Sarah). Commentary, study and reflection questions, prayer and access to online lectures are included.

As a believing community it is important to keep alive the cultural dimension of the Christian faith, and decisive value that biblical instruction has for issues of our time. It is not by chance that Sacred Scripture has been studied and commented upon for centuries by the generations that preceded us.

The program will begin, Thursday, September 14 at 7PM in the upstairs classroom of the Parish Center.

For those who can afford, offering is \$20 for the text. If there are difficulties with the fee, see me. We will be using as in the past the program from Little Rock Arkansas Scripture Study published through the Liturgical Press.
